## **Practice of Charity** *(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2024")*

In the Second Book of Kings, Elisha feeds a hundred people with just twenty barley loaves; in the Gospel, Jesus feeds five thousand with five barley loaves and two fish. Both stories tell us that there are leftovers from the abundance of food. This physical nourishment is paired with need for spiritual nourishment: Elisha's servant and Philip and Andrew all doubt that the Lord will provide and answer all their needs.

*In your prayer today, reflect on when you have doubted how the Lord "[satisfies] the desire of every living thing" (Psalm 145:16). Ask the Lord to help you see how God has provided in abundance.*
