WELCOME 2021!

I think all of us are happy to have 2020 in the rearview mirror of our lives. While the beginning of 2021 will still hold challenges and hard times, there is more hope for the future than there has been in many months. The losses and tolls on people's lives that happened in this past year will not quickly pass. There have been countless people who experienced sacrifice and hardship on very deep levels. The message of our faith and hope in our Lord became a lifeline. Holy Cross became a place of spiritual refuge for many. We continue to trust in our God to lead us through all that is before us. The Spirit will allow us to gain wisdom and a deeper appreciation for life in the days that lie ahead.

What happened on Christmas? Our reservations for Mass "sold out" very quickly. We assumed and prepared for increased crowds at all the Masses on Christmas. But it never materialized. Although we had up to about 50 additional seats for walk-ins at all the Masses, only a handful of them were used. This experience was not unique to Holy Cross. Every priest I have spoken to reported a similar experience in their parishes. I don't regret the effort we put into planning. I am so grateful to the many people who stepped up to help with the many necessary tasks. For a variety of reasons, many people opted not to be here in person. (Between the two Christmas Masses we live streamed, we had almost 2,000 views.) Fewer worshipers created a different experience for Christmas. Like most everything else this year, there was not the "business as usual" experience.

The one change that came about this year that has received overwhelming enthusiasm and support is the placement of the creche in front of the altar. This will now be the place where it will be displayed for future Christmas Masses.

I still have not gotten to see my grandniece who is now 10 months old. A trip to Florida has not been feasible, for obvious reasons. I'm hoping by the spring overall numbers will drop to safe levels for travel and that quarantine and testing requirements will no longer be necessary. There are some phenomenal airfares that are available. I'm currently holding a reservation in March for a Jet Blue flight to Tampa for only \$21! (There's no secret trick in getting this fare, that's what they are selling for.) Unfortunately, the return flight is more costly at \$39. I have never seen rates like this before. I'm not packing yet; we will see what happens over the coming months.

Here's to a better 2021.

LITURGY BYTES

The 3 Kings

This weekend we celebrate the Epiphany, Little Christmas or the feast of the 3 Kings as it is known. The word "epiphany" means manifestation or "showing forth." This feast celebrates God's bringing the Gentiles to meet the newborn Savior. Found not in a palace, but in a simple traveler's lodging, the infant Jesus reveals something of God's nature, humility and a way of behaving.



The visit of the Magi (the 3 Kings) occurs directly before the story of the Holy Family fleeing into Egypt. We know little about the Magi. They come from the East and journey to Bethlehem, following an astrological sign, so we believe them to be astrologers.

Because there are three gifts mentioned, we assume there were three of them. Also, in Matthew's Gospel, the Magi represent the Gentiles' search for a savior. Because the Magi represent the entire world, they also represent our search for Jesus. The gifts that they bring also foreshadow Jesus' role in salvation: the gold represents Jesus' kingship; the frankincense is a symbol of Jesus' divinity because priests burned that substance in the temple; the myrrh was something used to prepare the dead for burial, thus anticipating Jesus' death.

One of the many customs centering around this feast is the blessing of the doorposts in people's homes. Some use chalk to mark the year and the initials of the Kings over their front doors. Others prepare simple signs and hang them over their doors. Here's what it would look like this year:

$$20 + C + M + B + 21$$

The year is marked by the year of blessing—2021. The cross marks the points on the compass; the initials stand for the Kings: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar.

The letters CMB can also stand for "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" which means "May Christ bless this house."

Simple prayer of blessing for you to use for your front door:

Lord, God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill them (us) with the light of Christ, that their (our) concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

BACKGROUND SCREENING UPDATE

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People:

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (The Charter) promulgated by the Bishops of the United States in 2002 outlines specific practices and guidelines providing standards of safety in parishes and dioceses throughout the United States. As directed in The Charter, the Diocese of Rockville Centre requires all employees, clergy, and volunteers to complete three requirements within thirty days of employment or volunteering:

- 1. Attend Protecting God's Children Program (Virtus)
- 2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
- 3. Complete a background screen application. The Diocese requires all those who remain in active ministry be rescreened at 5-year intervals. volunteers/employees.

A Word on Background Screening of Volunteers:

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People (OFPCYP) has streamlined the volunteer application process enabling volunteers to complete the three safe environment requirements in one step. Individuals wishing to volunteer in a parish or school:

- 1. Register to attend a Protecting God's Children class and create a Virtus account on the Virtus website: www.Virtus.org
- 2. Electronically acknowledge the Diocesan Code of Conduct provided during the Virtus registration process.
- 3. Follow the instructions to complete the Sterling Volunteers background screening application offered during the Virtus registration process.

Active Volunteers:

If you are active in a parish ministry, have already attended Virtus and have been background screened, you may be at - or beyond - the *5yr. rescreening requirement*. If this is the case, you will receive an email from *Sterling Volunteers* asking you to complete the background screening application on-line. You may access the background screening application by following the prompt in the email or logging into your Virtus account. *Please be aware - this is not a scam nor has your e-mail been hacked.* The OFPCYP has been working with your parish to update the Safe Environment records and noted it is time for you to be rescreened. You may also be prompted to electronically re-sign the Code of Conduct when you log into your Virtus account.

Edit Your Virtus Account:

To access your Virtus account www.Virtus.org you will need your Username and Password. If you need assistance, please contact Virtus: 1-888-847-8870 or helpdesk@virtus.org. Once in your account, review your account information - particularly your e-mail address. If your account requires updating, please hit the TOOLBOX tab at the top of the screen. On the left side of your screen, in the green column, click "Update My Account." You will be able to make the necessary changes. Please remember to hit the SAVE button at the bottom of the screen.
