One Last Noel

I know that Christmas now feels like a distant memory. For most folks, aside from waiting for the credit card statement to arrive, there is little evidence that Christmas was celebrated in our homes only a few weeks ago. But, for the Church the Christmas season extends through today, which is the Baptism of the Lord. No, our music ministry is not mistaken in still playing Christmas music today, but this is the final yuletide melodies we will hear until next Christmas.

Why is it that putting up Christmas decorations is fun and exciting, but taking them down is a drudgery? It takes about the same amount of time, but somehow when there is no anticipation the task takes on a different flavor.

This week at the 11:30 Mass we invite all our families who have celebrated the Sacrament of Baptism at Holy Cross in the past year to receive a special blessing. It is always a happy moment to see the families who have shared in this blessed moment in their lives. It's funny how statistics work; some numbers are in decline, and others are increasing. This year baptisms were up over last year. There were 110 little ones sharing in this moment of grace with us. The gift of faith continues to be passed along.

Several weeks ago in my homily I used a definition that I learned when I was in the seminary. Several folks have asked me to repeat the definition of love that I memorized for one of my morality courses. Here we go: "Love is effectively willing the true good of the other." I remember when I first heard that definition it struck me as being too simple or incomplete; it didn't sound romantic enough and it somehow lacked feeling. But, when you apply it to different situations, it provides a sound foundational starting point in understanding the very complex notion of love. Some food for thought, I hope it helps.

I continue to hear frustrations expressed by some of our parishioners regarding our handicapped parking. I wish there were a simple way to increase the number of spaces we offer, but there is not. Please be respectful of the few spaces we have, particularly those in the circle, and leave them for folks who need them. I am regularly given reports that cars without handicapped placards are parking there and abled bodied folks are using those spots. I am not calling the police for any kind of enforcement, nor am I assigning someone to check doctors' notes, but please allow those spaces to be used by those for whom they were designed. Thank you.

The Baptism of the Lord

Don't be surprised if you hear Christmas music still being played at Mass this weekend (January 11/12). Traditionally, the Christmas season ends with this feast - the Baptism of the Lord. This weekend's readings tell us that just as God was well pleased with his own beloved Son, Jesus, God is well pleased to welcome all of US into his family.

Even though Baptism is known as a Sacrament of Initiation and belonging, it also is about being "sent forth" to bear God's love to the world. This weekend is a wonderful reminder for us to reflect on how we are doing that. Another enriching symbol used at Baptisms is the oil that helps us to be strong in our faith. Keep in mind when things are difficult for us, we have been anointed by the Holy Spirit both at our Baptisms and at Confirmation.

So, as we renew the promises made at our Baptisms this weekend, be like St. Peter who concluded that "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality," (Acts 10:34) and God is well pleased with all of us who profess faith in Jesus and strive to do his will.

This weekend, in a special way we welcome the parents and young people who received the Sacrament of Baptism here at Holy Cross this past year. Not only today, but each time we enter our worship area we should bless ourselves at the font remembering our own Baptisms! (It's a great practice to do with our children too!) Have a blessed week.
