That was a humdinger of a storm we got on Monday. The amount of snow we received exceeded the predictions of forecasters. Mother Nature always has a surprise up her sleeve. If you were home, didn't have anywhere to go, and had a stocked kitchen, it made for a pretty and cozy winter's day. I may lose the memory of the prettiness of the day once we get the bill for clearing the parking lot. I'm sure that will be a humdinger as well. I am grateful to Chris and his crew from CCS Landscaping who worked long and hard to get our property cleaned up.

On Tuesday morning, which was Groundhog Day, we were still coming out of the effects of the storm, and it was anything but sunny. Yet, somehow, both Punxsutawney Phil and Holbrook Hal saw their shadows. Although you think that would be good news because of sunny skies, it actually means six more weeks of winter. But with the way life has been unfolding these days, that seems to be pretty much par for the course.

Lent begins in 10 days. Traditionally, many people embrace some sort of sacrifice or discipline that makes the days of Lent challenging, but also spiritually uplifting. This year may warrant a change in that practice. I'm not suggesting that the season should be ignored. There is great value in somehow making the days of Lent different than the rest of the year. However, the last 11 months have already piled on a truckload of sacrifices and challenging disciplines. Perhaps this Lent there is an invitation to embrace a practice that will be more life-giving and nourishing. Think about what you may want to do as we approach the beginning of this holy season. More to come on Lent next week as we move closer to Ash Wednesday. Have a happy week.

LITURGY BYTES

Forgiving Elements of the Mass (part 2)



Picking up with last week's topic, the forgiving parts of the Mass, we focus on Scripture and prayer. There are moments in the Liturgy of the Word when we hear about the many meal accounts with Jesus. These meals often provided the opportunity for forgiveness and reconciliation. There are a couple familiar ones: Peter's denial of Jesus is forgiven, and his vocation renewed at breakfast on a beach in Galilee in John 21:15-17; and in Luke 7:44-47 the woman who anointed the feet of Jesus was forgiven of her sins because of her great love.

In the Gloria we pray *"Lord, God, Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us."* These words are also repeated in the Lamb of God during the Communion rite. In the very familiar Lord's Prayer (Our Father), we ask that our sins might be forgiven and that we be delivered from evil. Directly before we receive Holy Communion, we say: *"Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed."*

The Catechism of the Catholic Church lists forgiveness of sin as one of the fruits of Holy Communion: the body of Christ we receive in Holy Communion is "given up for us," and the blood we drink "shed for the forgiveness of sins." For this reason, the Eucharist cannot unite us to Christ without at the same time cleansing us from past sins and preserving us from future sins. (CCC#1393)

However, we need to keep in mind that the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Penance/Confession) is the Church's very special Sacrament of pardon and peace. We do need to celebrate that Sacrament to restore our friendship with God who waits to offer His love and mercy. With the penitential season of Lent just a few weeks away, let us think during Mass about what holds us back from giving our lives away. The gesture of God's love and mercy awaits us in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

BACKGROUND SCREENING UPDATE

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People:

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (The Charter) promulgated by the Bishops of the United States in 2002 outlines specific practices and guidelines providing standards of safety in parishes and dioceses throughout the United States. As directed in The Charter, the Diocese of Rockville Centre requires all employees, clergy, and volunteers to complete three requirements within thirty days of employment or volunteering:

1. Attend **Protecting God's Children Program (Virtus)**
2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
3. Complete a background screen application. The Diocese requires all those who remain in active ministry be rescreened at 5-year intervals. volunteers/employees.

A Word on Background Screening of Volunteers:

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People (OFPCYP) has streamlined the volunteer application process enabling volunteers to complete the three safe environment requirements in one step. Individuals wishing to volunteer in a parish or school:

1. Register to attend a Protecting God's Children class and create a Virtus account on the Virtus website: www.Virtus.org
2. Electronically acknowledge the Diocesan Code of Conduct - provided during the Virtus registration process.
3. Follow the instructions to complete the Sterling Volunteers background screening application offered during the Virtus registration process.

Active Volunteers:

If you are active in a parish ministry, have already attended Virtus and have been background screened, you may be at - or beyond - the **5yr. rescreening requirement**. If this is the case, you will receive an email from **Sterling Volunteers** asking you to complete the background screening application on-line. You may access the background screening application by following the prompt in the email or logging into your Virtus account. **Please be aware - this is not a scam nor has your email been hacked.** The OFPCYP has been working with your parish to update the Safe Environment records and noted it is time for you to be rescreened. You may also be prompted to electronically re-sign the Code of Conduct when you log into your Virtus account.

Edit Your Virtus Account:

To access your Virtus account www.Virtus.org you will need your Username and Password. If you need assistance, please contact Virtus: 1-888-847-8870 or helpdesk@virtus.org. Once in your account, review your account information - particularly your email address. If your account requires updating, please hit the TOOLBOX tab at the top of the screen. On the left side of your screen, in the green column, click "Update My Account." You will be able to make the necessary changes. Please remember to hit the SAVE button at the bottom of the screen.
