Coronavirus Chronicle #5

I'm sure for many people these days of being at home have prompted folks to undertake rainy-day projects that have been on hold for years. In many instances, "spring-cleaning fever" has hit. There is a tendency of not wanting to throw out some of the treasures that have been piled in closets. People want to see their stuff put to good use. Our St. Vincent de Paul bins have been getting a workout. However, we received word this week that they will not be serviced until further notice. In fact, they came and sealed them. So, please do not leave your treasures stacked up in front of them. Also, do not fill our dumpster with items that would have been going into the bins.

One of the struggles that I continually face during these days is very limited knowledge of technology. I'm limping by with my cell phone and my 10-year-old iPad, and I'm sure many time-consuming tasks would be much easier if I actually knew what I was doing. I can sympathize with educators, parents, and so many others who now find themselves dependent on devices, apps and programs they do not fully understand. (Remember the good old days when apps only referred to the first course before dinner was served?)

I hope that Easter was a joyful and peaceful day for you. In spite of the challenges of these days, I hope you were able to encounter the gift of the Lord's hope. I spoke to one woman who "binge-watched" Masses all day from various corners of our nation and beyond. I am aware of at least one family whose Easter egg decorating with the kids was not slowed down because of a mere pandemic. I am also aware of at least one backyard egg hunt that went off without a hitch. I think many families did as I did and had a virtual gathering with family before having a special meal.

I have to say, Mass last week was a bit of a challenge for me. I don't know why; this was not my first live streamed Mass from the Worship Area. I just felt nervous and wanted to make sure I "got it right," whatever that means. I was distracted by a sound system that was cracking. There were occasional people wandering through the courtyard that caught the corner of my eye. I pray none of these things were a distraction for you. I think part of what I was aware of was that there was no "feedback" from the congregation. It's not like people are used to shouting out "Amen" or booing if I say something they disagree with. But, there is a subtle dialog that takes place during the Eucharist. Yes, I have my prayers and you have your responses. But, there is something that takes place beyond that. I have a sense of when folks are with me and when we are truly praying together. I guess that is something that technology cannot provide.

The question has already been posed. Will we continue to live stream Mass after all this is over? I think there is more we can do with technology, and we need to explore that. But, nothing replaces the people of God gathered around the altar in faith. We will see how the Spirit will teach us the lessons we need to know as we work our way through all this. A PERSONAL ENCOUNTER WITH JESUS

One of my favorite post-resurrection passages is of Mary Magdalene and Jesus in the Gospel of John (20:11 - 16). But Mary stayed outside the tomb, weeping. And, as she wept, she bent over into the tomb and saw two angels sitting there, one at the head and one at the feet where the body of Jesus had been. And they said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken my Lord, and I don't know where they laid him."



Early on the first day of the week ... Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. John 20:1

When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus there, but did not know it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" She thought it was the gardener and said to him, "Sir, if you carried him away, tell me where you laid him, and I will take him." Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him, "Rabboni," which means teacher.

Mary was someone especially close to Jesus. Her life was transformed by his love. And she must have held a special place in his heart for him to choose to appear to her on Easter morning. We do not know why she didn't recognize him, but what we do know is this: all he had to do was say her name, and suddenly, all was clear. The one whom she loved was alive. How profoundly joyful that moment must have been for her. Stories such as this offer an invitation to each one of us. How can I have a relationship like that with Jesus? How do I experience his tenderness and love? What would it be like for me to hear Jesus speak my name?

In *The Joy of the Gospel*, Pope Francis encourages all Christians to a "renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ." This invitation is for all of us. Pope Francis explains, "...whenever we take a step towards Jesus, we come to realize that he is already there, waiting for us with open arms." Can we take the risk, and invite Jesus more fully into our lives, trusting that he is already there?

In these especially trying times, our God is the one constant on whom we can rely. The words of Pope Francis truly seem prophetic: "Let us not flee from the resurrection of Jesus, let us never give up, come what will."

Great 50 Days



UNITED WAY FUND FOR COVID-19 ASSISTANCE

United Together - A Response Fund for COVID-19:

We recognize that this time is extremely stressful and difficult for families across Long Island, especially for many of you who are experiencing unprecedented financial hardship. United Way of Long Island's [UNITED TOGETHER: A Response Fund For COVID-19](#) will be used to help Long Island families as the current health and economic crisis progresses. If you are a low-income, wage earner and have had a recent sudden loss of employment or furlough due to the effects of COVID-19, assistance will be available for eligible applicants. Support will be provided until these funds are exhausted.

Who Can Receive Assistance?

Assistance is limited to low-income, wage earners who reside in Nassau or Suffolk County and are recently unemployed or have been furloughed due to the effects of COVID-19. Applicants must meet the [monthly income eligibility guidelines](#).

What Assistance Will I Receive?
