



#### MIDNIGHT MISSIVE



#### Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

The middle of the night can be a mysterious and tumultuous time. I know for many who may have sleepless nights, the nighttime can be a time of wrestling with demons. A person's greatest fears, worries, doubts, temptations, aches and pains can all come to life ferociously in the wee hours of the morning. I have those moments. Maybe I am an odd duck, but there are also times when those hours are when God says to me, "Get up, I have something to discuss with you." Last Sunday was one of those nights.

I could not get away from thinking about last week's gospel. It was the story of Lazarus and the rich man. We hear that there was a great chasm between their two life experiences. That chasm was carried over to the afterlife. For some, their attention focuses on what will happen after this life. That's not where my attention is. Rather, how do we face the complexity of sorting out the great chasms that we face now in this life? The litany of what divides us is long. Some of the issues carry tremendous emotion and passion in the hearts of people. I was talking to a pastor in a multi-cultural parish; it's a battlefield out there. In some ways we are on the sidelines of the immigration issue. God understands the difficulty we face. The answer will never be found in absolutes but rather the on-going dance of dialogue, mutual respect, forgiveness, change, and understanding perspectives other than our own. The true starting point is when we realize we are in the in-between space where awareness of suffering, uncertainty of what to do, and a call to holiness all come together.

I wish I had the "political smarts" to understand some of these issues in a deeper way. Knowledge of our history and the intricacies of issues can be helpful in creating a realistic solution or at least a direction in which to move. While I may not have the ability to sort out the many issues of our time, I am convinced of one thing. This is the holy place where truth can be found. We need to take seriously the message that is offered here. We need to be open to a message that may not be proclaimed anywhere else. Scripture contains great wisdom and truth, but it takes careful discernment. Hand in hand with that is discerning how the living and breathing Holy Spirit is at work in our lives. We have to be people who are open to be transformed by God's grace.

As a priest, I am given a great privilege and responsibility. I am entrusted in bringing to life the stories of sacred Scripture. This is never to be taken lightly. It should never become a soap box for me to vent pet peeves or offer personal opinions. It is a task of trying to unravel the mystery, gift, and challenge of God's Word. I pray I do it well. Thank you for your trust and support even when the message is hard.

I began writing this at 2:30AM. God had something to say, and this is when he chose to speak his message. This started out as an entry in my personal journal, but it morphed into this week's column. I pray that was the working of the Spirit. There is much work to be done. The fact that we show up here in one way or another puts us on the list of those who desire to do what is right and just. May we continue to sort out the challenges that are before us, confident that God gives us the tools we need to allow his Kingdom to be known here in our midst. Be open to hear His voice, even if it comes after normal business hours.

On 6/14/25, doors opened to the dance at 6:15pm. The 162 attendees arrived, looked at 30 raffle baskets and a 65" TV, and purchased raffle tickets and 50/50 tickets. At 7pm the Italian buffet was opened and dinner music played. Throughout the evening wine, beer, water and soda were available. After dinner a youth group collected all the dirty dishes and utensils while another group sang 3 Christian songs. This was followed by 1 1/4 hours of dancing. The evening ended with hot beverages and chocolate and vanilla cake slices at about 10:15. All who attended said they had a wonderful time and look forward to the next event.

Back in June, Blessed Sacrament Council of Holy Cross and Blessed Teresa of Calcutta Council of St. James Church, Setauket, held a Flag Day Veterans Benefit Dinner with music and dancing. At the dance, a total of \$1,162 was raised by the two councils for the Veterans Home in Stony Brook. The two councils wrote individual checks for \$581 written to Donald J. Burns Knights of Columbus Council located in the Veterans Home to help care for veterans. Many of the Burns council members are veterans living in the home. #### Liturgical Minister Training - Fall 2025

The Diocese of Rockville Centre will offer training for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

**Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion:** Part A – This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for all Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training.

A Lector Workshop is available for both new and experienced lectors.

You may not take EMHC Part A and the Lector Workshop on the same day.


