

TRINITY SUNDAY

You may have noticed a new piece of artwork has been added to our Worship Area. It is a tapestry depicting the baptism of the Lord by John the Baptist. Appropriately, this piece is hanging over our baptismal font. This tapestry was created by the American artist, John Nava. His most famous work is a striking series of tapestries that line the walls of Our Lady of Angels Cathedral in Los Angeles. The original (much larger) version of our tapestry was created for the baptistry in the Cathedral. I feel the style of this artwork complements the style and architecture of our Worship Area. We thought Trinity Sunday was an appropriate occasion to introduce this piece: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." The cost of the tapestry was underwritten by a generous parishioner. Many thanks.

I am happy once again to be scheduling training for new Altar Servers. Children in fourth grade or above are invited to share in this ministry. Training sessions will take place on Tuesday afternoons beginning in June. It is another piece of "normal life" returning to the parish.

It is meant to be a conversation about what they learned about their faith in preparation for the sacrament. They may be asked questions about a memorable scripture reading or a saint they studied in their classes. Most of the kids walk in as nervous wrecks, but they emerge saying it was a positive experience for them.

This is a holiday weekend. While everyone enjoys a day off, we cannot overlook the reason for the holiday. We are mindful of all those who heroically gave their lives in service to our nation. We thank all those who currently serve or who have served in our military. These days when peace around the world is so fragile, we cannot take for granted the efforts and sacrifices that are made to secure our freedom and safety. May God bless our Nation. And may God's promise of peace come to life in all corners of our world.

LITURGY BYTES

Corpus Christi



Next weekend's feast reminds us of the importance of the Real Presence of Our Lord in the Eucharist. Corpus Christi is Latin for the "Body of Christ." In recent years, this feast is celebrated as a solemnity on the Sunday following Trinity Sunday as per the liturgical reforms of the second Vatican Council. At its core, the solemnity is a celebration of the tradition and belief in the Eucharist as the Real Presence of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Important for us to keep in mind is that every Sunday is a feast of the Eucharist, because by participating in the Mass, and in receiving communion, we are honoring and celebrating the Eucharist. Still, this feast has its own history.

Through the efforts of St. Juliana, her devotion sparked celebrating this feast in a joyful manner. It was because of her great veneration for the Eucharist at an early age and her visions that occurred for over 20 years before she told anyone about them. It was recorded that she shared her visions only with some of the Sisters from her religious community. Years later, she finally revealed the vision to her confessor, who brought it to the local bishop. This priest was instrumental in having Corpus Christi become an annual celebration in their diocese. Eventually, an archdeacon for that diocese of Liege shared her devotion and interest, and this man later became Pope Urban IV and instituted the Solemnity of Corpus Christi as a feast for the entire Latin Rite. Pope Urban also requested St. Thomas Aquinas to write special prayers and hymns for the feast. Perhaps you might be familiar with these hymns: Tantum Ergo, O Salutaris Hostia and Pange Lingua. The first two are usually part of Benediction, and the last one is used on Holy Thursday in some parishes.

Let us treasure the precious gift of the Eucharist not just once a year but every day of our lives and realize the privilege it is to share in the Eucharist.

Emergency Broadband Benefit, Helping Households Connect During the Pandemic

Help Has Arrived: The Emergency Broadband Fund is now available to help eligible American households connect to broadband; the Emergency Connectivity Fund will soon help schools and libraries.

The Emergency Broadband Benefit is an FCC program to help families and households struggling to afford internet service during the COVID-19 pandemic. This new benefit will connect eligible households to jobs, critical healthcare services, virtual classrooms, and so much more.

About the Emergency Broadband Benefit

The Emergency Broadband Benefit will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute more than \$10 and less than \$50 toward the purchase price.

The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.

Who Is Eligible for the Emergency Broadband Benefit Program?

A household is eligible if a member of the household meets one of the criteria below:

- Has an income that is at or below 135% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines or participates in certain assistance programs, such as SNAP, Medicaid, or Lifeline;
- Approved to receive benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program or the school breakfast program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision in the 2019-2020 or 2020-2021 school year;
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year;
- Experienced a substantial loss of income due to job loss or furlough since February 29, 2020 and the household had a total income in 2020 at or below \$99,000 for single filers and \$198,000 for joint filers; or
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income or COVID-19 program.


There are three ways for eligible households to apply:

- Contact your preferred participating broadband provider directly to learn about their application process.
- Go to GetEmergencyBroadband.org to apply online and to find participating providers near you.
- Call 833-511-0311 for a mail-in application, and return it along with copies of documents showing proof of eligibility to:

Emergency Broadband Support Center P.O. Box 7081 London, KY 40742

After receiving an eligibility determination, households can contact their preferred service provider to select an Emergency Broadband Benefit eligible service plan.

BACKGROUND SCREENING UPDATE

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (The Charter) promulgated by the Bishops of the United States in 2002 outlines specific practices and guidelines providing standards of safety in parishes and dioceses throughout the United States. As directed in The Charter, the Diocese of Rockville Centre requires all employees, clergy, and volunteers to complete three requirements within thirty days of employment or volunteering:

- 1. Attend Protecting God's Children Program (Virtus)
- 2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
- 3. Complete a background screen application. The Diocese requires all those who remain in active ministry be rescreened at 5-year intervals. volunteers/employees.

A Word on Background Screening of Volunteers:

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People (OFPCYP) has streamlined the volunteer application process enabling volunteers to complete the three safe environment requirements in one step. Individuals wishing to volunteer in a parish or school:

- 1. Register to attend a Protecting God's Children class and create a Virtus account on the Virtus website: www.Virtus.org
- 2. Electronically acknowledge the Diocesan Code of Conduct provided during the Virtus registration process.
- 3. Follow the instructions to complete the Sterling Volunteers background screening application offered during the Virtus registration process.

Active Volunteers:

If you are active in a parish ministry, have already attended Virtus and have been background screened, you may be at - or beyond - the *5yr. rescreening requirement*. If this is the case, you will receive an email from *Sterling Volunteers* asking you to complete the background screening application on-line. You may access the background screening application by following the prompt in the email or logging into your Virtus account. *Please be aware - this is not a scam nor has your email been hacked.* The OFPCYP has been working with your parish to update the Safe Environment records and noted it is time for you to be rescreened. You may also be prompted to electronically re-sign the Code of Conduct when you log into your Virtus account.

Edit Your Virtus Account:

To access your Virtus account www.Virtus.org you will need your Username and Password. If you need assistance, please contact Virtus: 1-888-847-8870 or helpdesk@virtus.org. Once in your account, review your account information - particularly your email address. If your account requires updating, please hit the TOOLBOX tab at the top of the screen. On the left side of your screen, in the green column, click "Update My Account." You will be able to make the necessary changes. Please remember to hit the SAVE button at the bottom of the screen.

Summer Cash Sizzle

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish. In addition, many parishioners enjoyed participating in it. Unfortunately, it was one of the many parts of parish life that was lost to Covid. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing. And so, we introduce the "Summer Cash Sizzle." This is a similar idea, however it will be offered initially on a quarterly basis.

On the first Sunday of each month, the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is offered after the 9:30 AM Mass. Sunday, June 6th, is the next date the Anointing will be offered.




