

Finding New Ways to Vacation

I will be taking a few days off this week. I also plan to take a week off towards the end of August. I know I am feeling an emotional weariness, and I need to recharge my batteries. I am also taking the advice of parishioners, co-workers and friends who keep saying to me that I need to take a little down time.

Normally, vacation time is easy to deal with. For me, that often means traveling somewhere fun. Last summer I went on a cruise with friends. I never need a reason to visit the Southwest; just put me in a National Park and I am in my glory. But as all of us have come to know, very few areas of life are operating normally. This summer it means rediscovering fun, and redefining what will renew our spirit. So it looks like a little list of garden, household, and personal projects will be my source of life for this week.

In August I was supposed to be acting as a tour guide in taking three friends to the Grand Canyon. When the crisis first became out of control in Arizona, we changed plans to head up into Utah instead, where they are faring much better. But, now that a quarantine would be required upon returning home, we had to cancel the entire trip. We may try to do a few days upstate New York or New England. Time will tell. If it is meant to be . . .

I don't want to sound like I am complaining. I feel blessed that I am able to have some quiet days. There are many for whom this is not an option because of how the Covid crisis has touched their lives. Some people are facing economic hardship. Some folks have health limitations or concerns, if not for themselves, then for a loved one. Parents can't take a break from the kids. Welcome to Holy Cross Religious Education

The Religious Education Office is planning ahead to the 2020-2021 Formation Year. We need your help so that we can adequately plan to meet the needs of our parish. If you have a child entering **First Grade in September you need to register.** If you have recently moved to our parish you need to register in the parish. Due to Covid-19, our program will be a mix of online and "home based" learning, depending on CDC guidelines. Please contact our office for more specific information.

- Religious Education classes will begin the week of October 19th, 2020.
- First time registration can be done online at www.pothc.org . Go to forms.
- Registration needs to be completed by August 15, 2020.
- Summer Office Hours: Monday Friday 9:00-12:00 & 1:00-2:30
- If your child was not baptized at Holy Cross you need to send us a copy of your child's Baptism Certificate. Please email it to hcreled@optonline.net.
- For those who are already part of our program, you need to re-register for the upcoming year. Please note that textbooks will not be distributed to your child without a registration form.

A detailed outline of our program is available online or at our office. However, there are a few important details to be noted.


- Children must successfully complete each grade level to proceed to the next.
- The Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist, and Confirmation require a minimum of two years of preparation.

Most importantly, we need to work together. Faithful attendance at classes and parent workshops is essential. As comprehensive and informative as our program is, this is only

one part of your child's faith formation. The greatest thing you can do to nurture your faith and the faith of your child is to regularly be part of our Sunday Eucharist - whether in person or viewing our 11:30 AM live streamed Mass.

The Catechism of the Church states that parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children. We are privileged to work with you in this task. We thank you for your cooperation in allowing us to be part of your lives. We look forward to a fruitful year where everyone, young and old, continues to grow in understanding the gift of our faith.

LITURGY BYTES



Eucharist

To complete the Sacraments of Initiation, this week's reflection will focus on Eucharist. As I mentioned last week, most of us probably received Holy Communion at an early age, maybe second or third grade, definitely before we received the Sacrament of Confirmation. This weekend we witnessed adults at the 5 o'clock Mass and 9:30 Mass receiving Confirmation and Eucharist. These are special moments for these brothers and sisters and even for us as a parish family. We welcome them to our Faith community.

In the early days of the Church, Communion was received around the age of 14 (the age of reason) for young people. In the early 1900s, Pope Pius X changed the age of reason to 7 so children could receive Eucharist at an earlier age. As you know, this practice has continued right through the present day. In fact, the past two Saturdays, we were finally able to celebrate six First Communion Masses with the young people of Level 2 and their families. A longed-for special moment for these children was finally celebrated. We congratulate them and will enjoy seeing them receive at the Lord's table each week.

As we have been unable to receive Our Lord for over three months in recent days, we started to realize the great void in our lives. Knowing we experience Our Lord in other ways seemed not enough. All we have known and learned haunted our souls in different ways. Did this fasting deepen our appreciation for what we know of Vatican II's phrase – "the source and summit of our lives"? Sacrosanctum Concilium (the Constitution on the Liturgy) defined Eucharist in this way: "a sacrament of love, a sign of unity, a bond of charity, a paschal bouquet in which Christ is eaten, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us." (n.47) More common to our understanding is the Eucharist as a sacrifice with Christ's presence in the Eucharist rounding out our understanding. It is our nourishment for the journey as disciples of Christ. Each week at Mass, we hear the words of Our Lord: **DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME** as we gather around the Table of the Lord. These are privileged moments.

through August 31st

HEAP helps income-eligible households pay heat-related energy bills, even beyond the heating season. Whether you own or rent you may qualify for a HEAP grant that you do not have to pay back.
