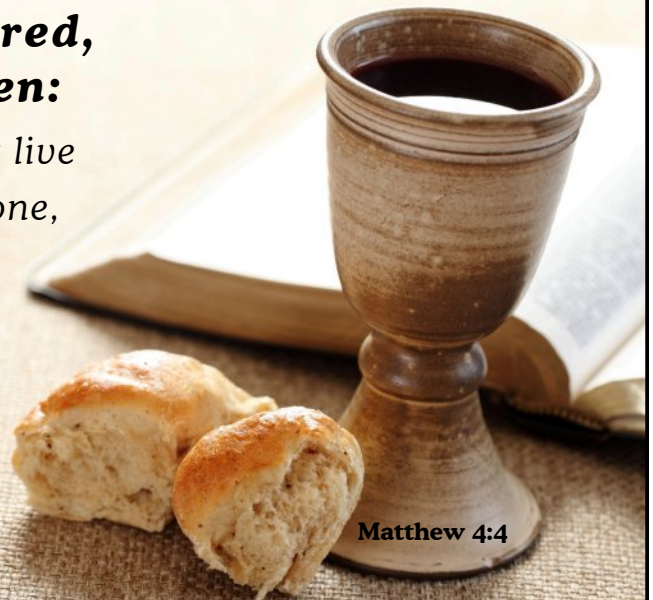

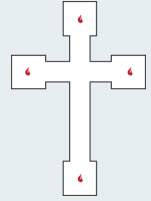

## LED BY THE SPIRIT

*Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael*



The story of Jesus' forty days in the desert begins with the description that He was led by the Spirit. This was not some creative idea that He came up with on His own. It was His beginning on the path of His public ministry. Great and powerful things happened in His isolation. He was tempted, and it must have been frightening. I'm sure He felt alone. But we also hear the affirmation that He was ministered to by angels. It was an intense experience that clarified for Him the path that He must walk. Prior to this, He experienced that power of His baptism in which it was proclaimed that He was the Father's beloved Son. He now discerns all that Father asked Him to do. He will emerge from this holy time and choose His disciples. His work will then begin.

There is something remarkable about Lent. Mass attendance increases. Throngs of people will come on Ash Wednesday to share in the tradition of being marked by ashes. This is a profound and public statement. There is a natural openness in the hearts of people to embrace this season. There is a willingness to sacrifice. There is a willingness to break the usual routine of life in order to make these days holy. Use well the opportunity that is before you. In what way may the Spirit be leading you to live your life differently? What is one area of your life that you can improve, be it in your relationship with God or in relationship to the people who are part of your life?

There are many different disciplines and practices that can be chosen in this season. Reflect on something that will make a real difference in your life. Giving up chocolate may not be the right choice if you will still be a crazy person when you get behind the wheel of your car. Having just come back from retreat, I will make one recommendation. If in any way you can incorporate more silence in your life, it will likely be a fruitful practice. There is something that happens when we eliminate noise and words from our lives. Perhaps make a conscious effort to spend less time in front of the TV or on your device. Life really does go on beyond Facebook, Tik Tok, or whatever else may be your distraction of choice. Also consider reflecting on our theme for the year: "Called to Compassion/Changing our World with God's Love." Be led by the Spirit during these days. At times it may be challenging, but God always leads us places where we can know his love more deeply.

You may have noticed that Fr. Frank has not been with us since Christmas. On New Year's Day he was not feeling well. He ended up in Stony Brook Hospital for almost two weeks. He was diagnosed with some heart issues which are being managed successfully. He went from the hospital to rehab for a few weeks as is often the protocol, but now he is home. He is in good spirits and hopes to return to his usual activities, but it may take a bit of time. Please keep him in your prayers.



*Pope Leo offers a suggestion for Lent: "I would like to invite you to a very practical and frequently unappreciated form of abstinence, that of refraining from words that offend and hurt our neighbor. Let us begin by disarming our language, avoiding harsh words and rash judgement, refraining from slander and speaking ill of those who are not present and cannot defend themselves. Instead, let us strive to measure our words and cultivate kindness and respect in our families, among our friends, at work, on social media, in political debates, in the media and in Christian communities. In this way, words of hatred will give way to words of hope and peace."*

## Practice of Faith

(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2026")

This week Jesus perfectly models the spiritual practices of Lent: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Forty days of fasting made Jesus hungry for God's Word. Realize that in going into the desert, Jesus fasted from both food and activity. His solitude was also a form of fasting. Jesus' responses to Satan's temptations show how fasting made Jesus totally dependent on God and faithful to him. The late Pope Benedict XVI reflects, "Through fasting and praying, we allow Him to come and satisfy the deepest hunger that we experience in the depths of our being: the hunger and thirst for God" (Message for Lent 2009). Follow in the footsteps of Jesus this Lent:

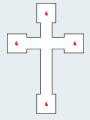
Plan a fast from food. Offer your hunger to God and ask God to fill you.

Put aside the money you saved from your fasting and give it as alms for the poor.

# ***Eat Simply...So Others May Simply Eat***



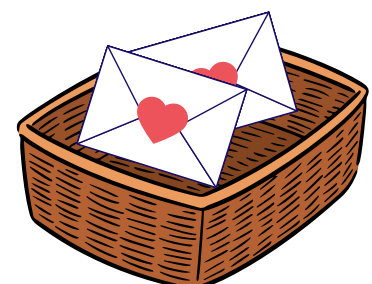
*Lent offers us a unique period of time to evaluate our life journey as a follower of Christ. We are encouraged to assess if this journey has led us to an improved understanding and deepening of our relationship with our Lord, with our neighbors, and with our brothers and sisters of the world community.*

For the last 34 years, we at Holy Cross have embraced our Lenten Project “Eat Simply So Others May Simply Eat” as a way to raise our consciousness to the significant needs of our struggling friends. We willingly sacrifice larger or better meals for simpler meals during Lent. Our joint effort to “EAT MORE SIMPLY SO OTHERS MAY SIMPLY EAT” unites us in a special way with one another and also with those who are struggling on Long Island.

We encourage you not only to participate in this program, but also to discuss it at the dinner table with your children and family members. Many of us are not consciously aware of the number of people that are struggling and hungry right here in our own area. *During 2025, our Outreach pantry served an average of 180 people each month.*

*The Lenten envelopes marked, EAT SIMPLY...SO OTHERS MAY SIMPLY EAT, will be available throughout the weekends of Lent. We suggest that you place the envelope in a prominent place in your kitchen as a reminder of how you and your family will be uniting yourselves with our struggling neighbors and with those facing food insecurity in the world. We encourage you to reflect, discuss and to decide how you will eat more basic meals during Lent. Perhaps you have a favorite simple recipe to share. We'd be happy to put it in the bulletin for fellow parishioners to try.*

Each weekend or whenever you choose during Lent, you may place your envelope in the collection basket. The monies donated will be used to help those who come to Parish Outreach for assistance. We are continually grateful for the very generous response of our parishioners of Holy Cross in donating money, food, and supermarket gift cards which enables us to meet their needs.





# Hands of Compassion



This year we as a parish will embrace the theme of a people **“Called to Compassion.”**

## *What does compassion mean to you?*

Think of being called by name to share in this experience. Think about compassion you have received. Let that gift inspire your life to be a means of love and compassion to those who you meet.

Lent traditionally is a time when we reflect upon our lives and actions.  
Take time in prayer to look into your own heart.

## *How can you be more like the heart of Jesus?*

*In what ways can you become the eyes, the hands of Christ, offering compassion to your family, your community, the world?*

Our Gospel calls us to see and help those in need. This is an invitation to put our faith into action by simple acts that can make a big difference. Our Outreach pantry is accessed by families, like yours, every week. This Lent, we are inviting you to join us in keeping the shelves full and helping to feed our neighbors in need.

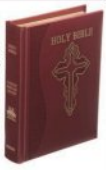

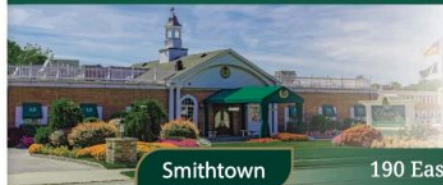
