



### AT THE START OF A MOMENT



### Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

The Broadway musical *Come From Away* is about the little town of Gander, Newfoundland. On September 11, 2001 when the American airspace was closed, 38 planes were diverted to this little island. The story line is about how a small village had to rise to the occasion of suddenly providing food and shelter for 7,000 stranded travelers. One of the songs depicts the moment when the village realized their lives were about to change. They turned on their radios and heard the breaking news. In hindsight they realized, "You are here, at the start of a moment."

On January 21, 1988, many of you were sitting in pews at St. Patrick's, St. Joseph's, or Sts. Philip and James when the announcement was made, there will be a new parish formed in Nesconset, and for some of you, this will be your new spiritual home. For you, "You were there, at the start of a moment." How does this work? What do we do? Where will we pray? Who will help us? I'm sure these were some of the many questions that surrounded that moment. In short order, there was the first meeting at the Ronkonkoma firehouse where you met your first shepherds, Fr. Bill Breslawski and Fr. Joe Schlafer. And from there the adventure unfolded.

There are not many Catholics who experience the beginning of a new parish. It was a unique and amazing opportunity. We are indebted to you for your prayerful discernment, sacrifice and hard work that brought together a new community of faith. The beautiful Worship Area that we enjoy to this day is the result of your vision and hope. The spirit of welcome that you embraced from day one continues to live on. Holy Cross lives because of the foundation that was laid. It has been built upon by so many good and faithful parishioners. I pray you have a deep sense of pride and satisfaction for the good work you were able to do.

There is something a bit "made-up" about today's celebration. The parish itself is now  $37\frac{1}{2}$  years old, not exactly a traditional milestone. The offices and Worship Area were first used at the Easter Vigil on April 15, 1995. So today really isn't a chronological anniversary, but this weekend the Church celebrates the Exaltation of the Holy Cross which is our feast day. It seems appropriate that we take the effort to acknowledge and thank those people who were instrumental in forming the parish. We are grateful for the work you did and the community you helped to start. How blessed we are to share in this life-giving gift.

In Come From Away, their "moment" ended five days after it began when the planes were able to fly again. Yes, they have the memories, but the experience itself was limited. For us the experience continues. We hold in our hands and hearts this community. We are the ones who will make it thrive and grow as we move forward. Thank you to all who are now part of this family of faith, whether you were here on Day One or just joined the parish last week. We are delighted that you are here. We pray that together we will continue to allow this place to be a vibrant spiritual home where the grace of God and the call to discipleship continue to come to life.

As a side note. . . Regrettably, I missed *Come From Away* when it was on Broadway. However, it is being offered at the Engeman Theatre in Northport from September 11 – October 26. I will be attending the performance on October 12.





(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2025")

The cross is a paradox that is the essence of Christian hope. This simultaneous symbol of brutal failure and glorious exaltation is the ultimate reminder of God's infinite love. To realize this love, the Christian must confront the worldly view of the cross and embrace the exact opposite view: rather than death, life; rather than failure, triumph.

### WHAT IS RCIA/OCIA?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), recently renamed OCIA, or Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, is the process by which adults are welcomed into the Catholic Church.

### WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

OCIA is open to:

- anyone who is unbaptized and has a desire to learn about the Catholic faith;
- anyone who was baptized in another Christian denomination and wishes to explore membership in the Catholic Church;
- Catholics who have been baptized but have not celebrated the Sacraments of Eucharist (Holy Communion) and Confirmation.

### WHAT CAN ONE EXPECT AT OCIA?

Individuals who go through the OCIA process can expect:

- · to know themselves and God better,
- to be supported in prayer by the entire parish community,
- to understand Catholic teachings and practices more clearly.

All that is required is openness to grow and learn.

### **WE GROW IN FAITH**

### Liturgical Minister Training - Fall 2025

The Diocese of Rockville Centre will offer training for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

**Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion:** Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for all Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training.

**A Lector Workshop** is available for both new and experienced lectors.

You may not take EMHC Part A and the Lector Workshop on the same day.


