

Asking the Better Question

I am writing this article in what hopefully will be the final days of my quarantine. Let me say once more, for the record, I was not sick. Two weeks ago I went on retreat to Arizona. Before I departed, Arizona was in good shape as far as Covid was concerned. I kept checking the numbers before I left, and it seemed like a reasonable decision to make. Just before I returned home, the numbers spiked which prompted New York State to add Arizona to its list of quarantine states. Thus, upon my arrival home, I needed to begin a quarantine. Two negative tests later, and I am ready to go.

Needless to say, when I heard about Arizona being a state that now required a quarantine my heart sank. I knew it was a possibility, but based on my research, I did not think it would be probable. But now I was dealing with a situation that would impact others: the parish, the Pastoral Team, and other priests that would need to cover my Masses. I was feeling frustrated and foolhardy for creating a complicated scenario.

All this happened while I still had two days of prayer time on my retreat before returning home. Naturally, I brought this to my prayer. I immediately asked the question, "Lord, what lessons are you trying to teach me through all of this?" This is not a bad question to ask. But honestly, it can lend itself to focus on the negative; what was flawed in my decision making process? And yes, I do need to honestly review what I did. I was lamenting with a good and holy friend about what I was thinking, and she posed a single question for me to ponder: "What is God inviting me to through all of this?" There is a subtle difference in what she asked in contrast to the question I posed to myself. The difference is both subtle and enormous.

My question led to make a conclusion or judgment. I was looking for what I did right and what I did wrong (again, not a bad thing but not the only way to look at it). Her question opened the door to see God as the eternal and loving one. Her nuance created a God who did not want to yell at me, but rather invite me more deeply into my own heart and His grace. While I don't know if I have yet to come up with a specific answer to that question, it created a much more peaceful place for me. Sometimes we need the help of others to ask a better question to bring us to a deeper truth and knowledge of God's love. And, in turn, there are moments when there is a better question to ask another that will bring about a more grace-filled answer.

Pray for our Nation. Regardless of what happens on Tuesday, trust in a God who will continue to journey with us and bring us life, hope and grace in the midst of all possibilities. Perhaps ask yourself, "What is God inviting me to through all this?"


