The calendar year does not end for another month. But today's celebration of Christ the King is the final Sunday celebration of the liturgical year. It is one step closer in concluding a year that has been more than challenging.

We will have our annual Thanksgiving Mass on Thursday at 9:00 AM. We don't anticipate an overflowing crowd, so no reservations are needed nor will seats be assigned. For those who are not able to come in person, we will be live streaming the Mass. We invite you to bring a non-perishable food item for our pantry if you are able. And we invite you to bring an item that will be part of your Thanksgiving table for a blessing.

It is with a spirit of gratitude that we will offer a special blessing and word of thanks to MaryAnne McCulloch next Saturday at the 5:00 Mass. MaryAnne has been part of Parish Outreach from the beginning of the parish. She would now like to enjoy that chapter of life called retirement. She is not moving away; she and her husband, Tom, will remain in the parish. But we would like to formally offer our gratitude for her years of faithful service.

Through the course of the past eight months I have repeatedly used a phrase, "this will be a (Lent, Easter, Pentecost, First Communion, Confirmation, etc.) like no other." The list of events seems to ever grow longer. And so I say, "This will be a Thanksgiving like no other." On a practical level, there are many families that have made changes in their traditions; tables may have fewer chairs around them and travel plans may have been curtailed. However, the more pressing question is how has our spirit of gratitude been affected by the crisis? What are the things you are grateful for that in the past you would have taken for granted? What are the things you wish were part of your life, but are not possible, at this moment? As difficult as this crisis has been, it has allowed a different light to shine on our lives. We need to be people of faith and understand how God's Spirit is at work in the midst of all that we now embrace.

Thanksgiving makes for a "shorter week" in terms of regular business days. Being the office will not be open on Thursday and Friday, we are making a change in our procedures for <u>next weekend only</u>. We will not be taking reservations for any of the Masses on November 28 and 29. The reservation process will resume for the weekend of December 5 and 6. This year Christmas will be more complicated than ever before. Details will be forthcoming in the weeks ahead.

The Final Days



This weekend, November 21 and 22, the Church celebrates the feast of Christ the King, marking the end of the liturgical year. Today we celebrate Jesus as Lord of love, revealing God's love for all people and calling his followers to live in that love. In the readings today, we are reminded to care for those most vulnerable in our world. An amazingly simple way to keep this in mind is seeing that Jesus is present in everyone — yes, even in those imprisoned, hungry, homeless and those who are strangers in our midst. When we care for them, we are caring for Jesus. Easy to say, but so difficult to live it. Yet, during these months of the pandemic, we saw it being lived before us by many people, right here in this local community and across our land. Most especially this week with Thanksgiving upon us, food is pouring into the pantry. Once again, our sisters and brothers in need will receive the blessings of the generosity of people they do not know. It is so real in our hearts to know that when we seek and serve the vulnerable, we are truly serving Our Lord.

Also, this weekend we re-commission and bless those who serve in the various liturgical ministries of the parish at each of the Masses. We have added a few new ministries to the traditional ones because of COVID-19. Newly added are the Reservation Crew who check people in at the Masses, greet them at the door keeping an accurate count of the numbers for each Mass, escort them to their seats and guide them in maintaining social distance when inside the Worship Area. Another new ministry is our HC TV crew who provide the words on the screens for the prayers and readings of each Mass. Since we had to dispense with having books in church, this new technology has saved the day. Also, another blessing for our parish has been the live streaming of daily Mass and the 11:30 Sunday Mass for those parishioners praying with us from their homes. Wonderful, generous, and caring people continue to bless this parish with many graces for which we are all incredibly grateful!

Our homebound folks receive friendly telephone calls by Outreach volunteers to keep up the connection and to assess ways the parish can be present to these loved parishioners. At Advent and Easter time a volunteer will visit them and bring a gift from the parish community. Eucharistic Ministers are also available to bring communion to the homebound who desire it.


