This weekend begins a new liturgical year. A time of new beginning brings with it the possibility of renewing hope and looking forward to what lies ahead. 

Homebound and Hospitalized



Parish Outreach sends cards, on behalf of our parish, to those who are ill or hospitalized. Our homebound folks

receive friendly telephone calls by Outreach volunteers to keep up the connection and to assess ways the parish can be present to these loved parishioners. At Advent and Easter time a volunteer will visit them and bring a gift from the parish community. Eucharistic Ministers are also available to bring communion to the homebound who desire it.
