

TAKE COMFORT AND HAVE HOPE

The scripture readings for this weekend begin with an instruction to Isaiah to comfort his people in the midst of trials. I think all of us could use a dose of emotional or spiritual comfort as we continue to face challenging days. The scripture readings also remind us that it is out of the desert that the first words of hope are spoken by John the Baptist. It may have been a long and winding road to come to fulfillment, but indeed our Lord comes to strengthen us. May we continue to seek hope in the midst of all that happens.

Last weekend a parishioner asked about our annual wreath sale. Unfortunately, that was another casualty of the Covid crisis. I know many parishioners traditionally bought their wreaths here, and it was a nice fundraiser for the parish. Support your local merchants in getting your wreath and, hopefully, by next year we will be back in business.

OK troops, I could use your help on this one. I'm concerned about Christmas — too many people, too few seats. We have a small core group of dedicated parishioners who have been instrumental in keeping our weekend gatherings safe and organized. For Christmas, we are going to need "all hands on deck." We have some ushers who we can call upon, and other ministers have offered to help. But our need for assistance on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day far exceeds the number of workers we have. If you are able, can you help on these days? We will need workers to arrive well before Mass time. We will need to give specific tasks and train folks for these busy Masses. There is no relying on "we have always done it this way" or crossing our fingers and saying "it always works out." We need to be as organized and prepared as possible.

The Diocese has given permission this year for Masses on Christmas Eve to begin as early as 2:00PM, so we will be able to add a Mass. In spite of that, we need to be prepared to explain to some visitors that we cannot exceed our capacity limitations. By next weekend the Mass schedule will be finalized, and our game plan will be announced.

It's so hard to predict what may happen. As happened on Thanksgiving, many people will find themselves coming up with different ways to celebrate the day. These modified and changed plans could impact which Masses are more or less crowded. I have suggested that the theme for this Advent be "Embrace Trust." I need to do that in terms of my own concerns for this busy day. But it would be comforting to know there will be many helping hands to assist for all that may take place. Thank you for your consideration in helping.

Take comfort, have hope, embrace trust, and onward we go.

Advent Week 2



Many people see Advent as an early Christmas filled only with the busyness of shopping, wrapping, baking and traveling.

However, Advent is really about growing closer to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. We are preparing our hearts for His coming at Christmas, but also we are preparing our souls for His second coming at the end time.

Most of us realize that this year, preparing for and celebrating the holidays in general might look different than past years.

Beloved traditions like Christmas parties, caroling indoors with friends and family, and a home filled with guests may be difficult or even impossible to pull off this year. While we reassure ourselves that this “new normal” is all temporary (and pray that it is over very soon), we can find joy and inspiration in focusing on what we **can** do to prepare and celebrate this year.

Some families use the Advent calendar with the daily action or work of mercy suggested to help keep the season before them.
