

# THE FINAL STRETCH

I am writing this column on Monday, listening to ominous forecasts for lots of snow later in the week. Last year we were very lucky; I think we only had to have our parking lot plowed and sanded twice. That certainly helped our budget. Time will tell if Mother Nature will cooperate with or add to the challenges of what hopefully are our final months of dealing with Covid.

In the past I have invited a group of friends to come to the house for a decorating party. They would do most of the decorating, and I would keep the food and drinks flowing. It was a beneficial deal for everyone. This year I had to down size. I asked just two friends to come and decorate my tree, but the rest of my Christmas display was left to my doing. Each day I try doing another little piece. If all goes well, I will be finished by the 24<sup>th</sup>. Then again, if I am not having a parade of visitors this year there probably in no urgency to get everything done.

For the first time since my Mom died, I set up the old nativity set that goes back to my childhood. For some reason that got buried in the basement, and when I recently discovered it again I decided this is the time to bring it back and display it in all its glory. It's amazing, the memories that something like that can bring back.

Last weekend at all the Masses I explained some of the details for our celebration of Christmas. I was shocked how quickly the reservations filled for the early Masses on the Eve. I expected they would be the most popular, but I never envisioned them "selling out" within the first few hours. I pray that things go smoothly for our Christmas Masses. For most folks this has been a challenging and frazzling year. My hope is that our limited space and large crowds do not add to the craziness. It would be unfortunate if we needed to turn people away when they arrive.

I understand that for many, these days of preparation are taking on a life and energy as never before. Some folks are sorting out the details of their celebrations factoring in things like travel, number of guests, health or age issues (and we have also thrown Mass reservations into the mix). These kinds of decisions may not be easy, and some of the traditional things you did may be getting side-lined this year. All of these circumstances open the door for us to appreciate the celebration of our Savior in new ways. While there may be moments of sadness or frustration, don't allow that to interfere in coming to know the power of the Lord's grace and hope. I'm not sure how appropriate the phrase "Merry Christmas" may be this year. But it can certainly be a blessed Christmas.

# **DETAILS FOR CHRISTMAS DAY**



- Christmas Mass Schedule:
  - o Christmas Eve: 2:00PM, 4:00PM, 6:00PM, 10:00PM
  - o Christmas Day: 8:00AM, 10:00AM, 12:00 Noon
- Please make reservations for the Mass you wish to attend.
- Reservations for Christmas Masses will close at 8:00AM on December 23<sup>rd</sup>. You will not be able to call in a reservation after that time.
- Some Masses may likely be filled to capacity before that date.
- ❖ Arrive Early. Reservations will only be held until 10 minutes prior to Mass time, then those seats will be offered to walk-ins.
- The main Worship Area will be used for those with reservations.
- LIMITED seating will be available in the chapel and atrium for walk-ins.

  Unfortunately, we may not be able to accommodate everyone who wishes to attend a Christmas Mass.
- ❖ The atrium doors will be used for those with reservations.
- The doors closest to the office will be used for walk-ins.
- Once we reach our capacity, we need to lock the doors and no more people may enter the building.
- ❖ I will be making at least one "robo-call" to all registered parishioners for whom we have a phone number to alert them to the details of Christmas.
- ❖ The "lower gravel parking lot" has fallen into disrepair. It will not be available this year.

Allow me to, once again, use a phrase I have been using for different occasions since last March, "this will be a Christmas like no other." I realize there are a lot of "rules" to deal with. I am not trying to make attendance at Mass an obstacle course. I am trying to be as organized as possible to minimize confusion and heartache on Christmas.

I realize every parish is handling Christmas in a different way. Some parishes have larger churches or the ability to have additional Masses in a parish hall or gym. We do not have those options available to us. We have worked hard as a Pastoral Team and Staff along with many parishioner volunteers to come up with the best plan we can.

I appreciate your understanding and cooperation. We pray that this is the one and only time we need to handle Christmas Mass in this manner.

O Wisdom of Our God Most High, guiding creation with power and love: teach us to walk in the paths of knowledge.

December 18

O Lord of Ancient Israel, giver of the Law of Moses on Sinai: rescue us with your mighty power.

December 19

O Flower of Jesse's stem, sign of God's love for all his people: save us without delay!

December 20

O Key of David,

opening the gates of God's eternal kingdom: free the prisoners of darkness!

December 21

O Radiant Dawn,

splendor of eternal light,

sun of justice:

shine on those lost in the darkness of death!

December 22

O King of All Nations,
