



AWAY WE GO WITH NOVEMBER



Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

This was a week of remembrance. The Church celebrated two feast days that connect us with those who have gone before us. The first was All Saints' Day in which we remember the great cloud of witnesses that the Church formally recognizes as saints. The second is more personal, as we remember all our loved ones on All Souls' Day. This is one of those days that does not need a great explanation or great effort to touch people's hearts. We naturally connect with those who were dear to us and who have passed away. This year All Souls' Day fell on a Saturday which meant we had to celebrate the Mass during the day. Normally we have a candlelight procession, but the effectiveness of that is lost when it takes place in a church that is already illumined by sunlight. But, nonetheless, it was still a beautiful time of remembrance.

Several weeks ago, I spoke about the bankruptcy settlement which included a financial contribution by our parish. This week we wired the money to the Diocese before the required deadline. This is a difficult moment in the life of the Church, but it is necessary so that both the Church and survivors of abuse can move forward. We pray these steps may help to bring about some sense of healing for all those involved.

Some parishioners have asked if there would be any special collections we would need to take up in order to meet our financial obligation. The amount that parishes were assessed was based on several factors including how much money each parish has. The money we had to send was money we already had. There is no need to seek additional income for us to offset this payment. I am hopeful that as we move forward, your continued generosity and good stewardship will allow us to continue to build back our savings.

We are very close in choosing a contractor to address our failing lighting system. It has been a long and tedious process in trying to get bids, but I am confident we have gotten the best proposals possible. As soon as I have specific details, I will share that news with you. While I am happy that we will be able to address this issue, it will not take place on the timeline I was hoping for. We will need to wait until the new year for work to begin.

As I write this column, the Yankees are in trouble. Prayers can only go so far; they have to get their act together.

This is an important week for our Nation as we choose new leaders. Pray that the Spirit will be at work in the hearts of all people. May we do the best we can in choosing men and women who embrace the values of the gospel and respect Church teaching. We pray that those chosen will work for lasting peace, justice for all God's children, and embrace and protect the gift of human life.



"OUR" FATHER



LITURGY BYTES by Michele Hall

Continuing with our reflections on parts of the Mass, we come upon a most popular and well-known prayer, the Our Father. I am sure, like me, you rattle off these words, not only at Mass, but perhaps as part of your daily prayer life. Let us take a look at what we are saying and the meaning behind those famous words.

Our Father – We begin this prayer professing that God is our heavenly Father. Where this appears in Scripture, Jesus instructs us to say "Our" Father, not "my" Father. This reminds us that we recognize those around us as children of God like us.

Hallowed be thy name – Hallowed is another word for holy. We are saying that we know God is holy, but we are asking that His name be recognized as the ultimate holy power that all will know as the one true God.

Thy Kingdom come - We are asking that God's kingdom of goodness, honesty and love surround us in our everyday life, and that we pray for the fulfillment of God's promise to return and grant us eternal life.

Thy will be done, on earth, as it is in Heaven – We pray that we do all things to please our Father, even what is difficult, even big things, as well as small things.

Give us this day our daily bread – We recognize that all things we need come from God. We are asking that God continue to give us not only nourishment, but also the Bread of Life in the Eucharist.

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us – This is a difficult one! God in His wisdom teaches us that in order for Him to forgive our wrongdoings, we must first forgive those who have hurt us. He is teaching us that when there is bitterness and anger in our hearts, there is no room for His love to fill our hearts. And lead us not into temptation – temptation and sin go together. When we come face to face with temptation, it can be difficult to resist. This is why we ask God to lead us away from temptations.

But deliver us from evil - There is much evil in the world which is so unfortunate. We pray to God to protect us against all that is evil. Amen.




