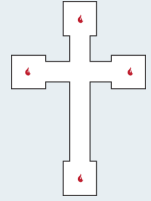

## WEEDS, LEAKS, AND DIVINE INTERVENTION



*Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael*

Three cheers to our young people who did yeoman's work in weeding the courtyard last weekend. This undertaking was organized by Angela Wichtendahl who coordinates our Youth Community Cares ministry (YCC). We are also grateful to Andy Bodor, whose expertise helped us keep intact the plants and flowers that should be there and get rid of only the weeds. Sadly, the plum trees in the Children's Garden are not in good health and will need to be replaced. At the same time as this work was going on, our Garden Committee was cleaning and planting in the Community Garden. Thank you for bringing the garden to life for another season. Don't feel bad if you missed out. There will be more opportunities offered through the summer. The Garden Committee is always looking for another helping green thumb or two. Overgrown planting beds are something of which we do not have a shortage. If anyone would like to help to keep the place tidy, just let us know. We can direct you to a slice of our grounds that could use some tender loving care.

Some projects are planned. For example, sometime in early July we will get a large dumpster to get rid of the unused items that are accumulating in the basement. We will need many helping hands to haul the stuff out. We will advertise the date of this clean-up as soon as we have things in order. Before we start hurling former treasures into the garbage, we need to sort out what we have. In the coming weeks the Staff and Team will go through everything that is stored downstairs to determine what is still useful and what can be discarded.

Some projects suddenly make themselves known and require immediate action. The pipes leading to the toilet in one of the bathrooms in the Atrium have sprung a leak. While it is not a major leak, it is large enough to leak through the wall into the Fr. Joe Room. We believe the plumbing repair is relatively simple. But there will be a few hefty holes in the wall that will need attention. Thanks to the support of the RAMR collection (Renovations and Major Repairs), hiccups like this don't throw our budget into a tailspin. Thanks to those who regularly support it.

On a vastly different and more consequential note, the Church has consecrated the United States to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This action took place by the US Conference of Catholic Bishops at their spring meeting on June 11. In this undertaking there is a three-fold focus. First, that we recognize the root of all true power is in Christ our King. Second, that we become a people who promote healing for all who are broken or have been hurt through violence, hatred and injustice. Finally, that we become a people who embody acts of love demonstrated through works of mercy. This step is taken to coincide with our nation celebrating its 250<sup>th</sup> birthday. There is fanfare on different levels for this occasion. It is appropriate that the bishops suggest a spiritual dimension.

Something like this might be dismissed as some sort of token gesture. There can be great power in simple gestures. Grace can be at work when we remind ourselves of the limitless power of God to take hold of hearts and transform lives. The Sacred Heart of Jesus demonstrates gifts and blessings that cannot be produced by our own efforts. We surrender ourselves to the power of the Spirit and pray that we may be instruments of doing God's work. Continue to pray that our Nation may use the bounty of our blessings to create a better world.

## What is Heifer International?

Heifer International is a nonprofit organization dedicated to ending hunger and poverty in a sustainable way. Its core purpose is to empower families and communities, especially in developing regions, by providing them with the tools, resources, and education they need to become self-reliant.

Rather than simply giving short-term aid, Heifer International focuses on long-term solutions. One of its most well-known approaches is providing livestock—such as cows, goats, chickens, or bees—to families in need. These animals can supply nutritious food like milk or eggs, generate income through the sale of products, and even help with farming through labor or fertilizer.

A key part of Heifer’s mission is its “Passing on the Gift” model. When a family receives animals and training, they agree to pass on the first offspring to another family. This creates a ripple effect, allowing entire communities to benefit and grow stronger together.

Beyond livestock, Heifer International also emphasizes education and training in areas like sustainable agriculture, environmental care, gender equality, and financial literacy. This holistic approach helps communities build stable livelihoods, improve nutrition, and protect their natural resources.

In essence, the purpose of Heifer International is not just to alleviate hunger temporarily, but to create lasting change by helping people gain independence, dignity, and the ability to support themselves and others.

### Holy Cross and Heifer International -

Our relationship with Heifer has been long standing. Over the years, we have counted and collected over \$15,000 dollars for Heifer International. Our very own “Kevin Bacon,” our pig shaped collection container, can be found most weekends in the Atrium waiting for you to “feed” him your quarters. These quarters collected over time add up! Depending on how much we collect, we then decide what animal(s) we can purchase to help a family.

We hope to continue supporting Heifer and the good work they do.

The wool sheep provide is a valuable resource, providing warm clothing for families and children living in harsh environments. Sheep can also provide milk for hungry families.



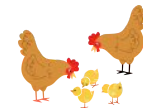
#### **Give the Gift of Honeybees \$30**

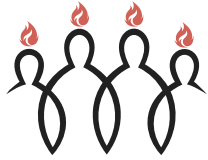

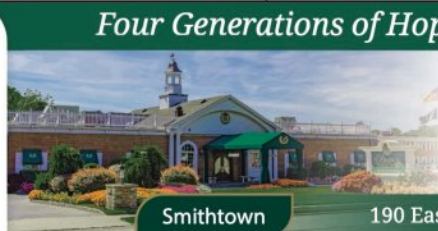
