



Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

Coming to the end of Holy Week and Easter Sunday always feels like the completion of an epic journey and a marathon. My prayer at the end of these days is that I hope my work and efforts were fitting and appropriate. It is humbling, gratifying, and at times overwhelming to realize that this great story of salvation has been entrusted to me to be brought to life within this faith community. If I wanted to make my life easy, all I would have to do is read the appropriate prayers at the correct time and all our celebrations would be valid. But there needs to be more. What can be done to allow the Spirit to be at work that it may touch the hearts of those who come here to pray? What songs shall we sing, how should we decorate, what aspects of the story will we emphasize, what message should be preached? So, in the weeks and months of preparation, the Spirit needs to be discerned to choose a path that will yield life in abundance.

This is not a one man show. It takes the effort of many people to put together all the moving pieces of this most holy week. I am grateful to the Pastoral Team, the Liturgy Committee and other parishioners who are drawn into this process of praying and living out the great days of our faith. There is a balance that needs to be maintained. First, make the telling of these stories meaningful and relevant to our lives. But, also, respect the prayer of the Church and cherish this great story that has endured throughout time and across the world. I pray that Holy Cross is a place that allows you to celebrate and grow in understanding of the gift of the Lord Jesus. How blessed we are to share in such a great story.

Today's gospel is at the top of my list as far as being a favorite. There are many reasons why I love this passage, but the most compelling detail of this passage touches all of our lives. When the Risen Jesus appears to his disciples, he still bears the wounds of his crucifixion. Although he has conquered death, he still has the scars that are a reminder of the cross he had to endure. All of us have scars because all of us have been hurt in life. Some scars may be a physical reminder of an injury or surgery. But many of the scars we carry are less visible because we carry them in our hearts. Sooner or later, everyone deals with a loss of one kind or another. The hurts of life can be real, and they can change our outlook on life. We all face fears and worries. Today's Gospel reminds us there is no cross we will face in this life that is stronger than God's ability to transform and heal. The wounds of Jesus become a symbol for transformation and resurrection. The same can happen in our lives. Don't allow your hurts to fill you with shame, anger, or despair. Allow Christ to touch your heart and allow it to be a place where you encounter the life our Savior brings.

The Easter season and Easter story continue to unfold. May we allow all that has been offered to us to touch our hearts. This story can change our lives, and this story can change our world. May we allow the power of the Risen Lord to fill our hearts and empower us to do good.



Thank you for being a true shepherd in demonstrating Christ's love.

EASTER FOR 50 DAYS!

Children are not the only ones among us to experience pure joy and want it to last. Surely the first disciples experienced it with Christ's Resurrection. It is the same joy we sometimes see on the faces of the newly baptized at the Easter Vigil. It is a joy that cannot be contained in just a moment. This is why the Church, from as early as the third century, let the Easter joy overflow into a 50-day season from Easter to Pentecost.

Our ancestors found great symbolic meaning in these 50 days of Easter. For example, 50 days is seven weeks — a week of weeks plus one day. That extra day was the Eighth Day, the same name they gave to Sunday — the day of resurrection, the day that symbolized eternity. Fifty days is also just about one-seventh of the whole year. This is why the 50 days of Easter are known as the Great Sunday of the entire year.

While 50 days of joy seem hard for us to sustain today, the season still has meaning. It is the time when we are meant to experience what it means when we say Christ is risen. It is the season when we hear and ponder the beginnings of our Church, the gifts of the Spirit, and the meaning and mission of discipleship, on what joining in the Eucharist commits us to be and do. For no matter how glorious this 50-day taste of the heavenly banquet is meant to be, God eventually calls us out of the celebration and reminds us to move on and live what we have celebrated in all the moments of our lives.

Have a joy-filled week ahead!



Practice of Hope

(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2025")

As we end the octave of Easter, we contemplate the mystery of the resurrection in the light of God's infinite mercy. The richness of God's mercy radiates through today's Scriptures and especially in Jesus' compassionate response toward Thomas' unbelief. The gift of mercy is explicitly given when Jesus commissions his disciples as ministers of divine mercy.

During the Jubilee Year of 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized Sr. Faustina Kowalska and declared that the universal Church would henceforth observe the Sunday after Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday. Pray the chaplet of divine mercy. If possible, visit a local shrine to divine mercy.

Is there someone you know in need of your compassion or forgiveness? Pray for the Easter grace to show them your mercy today.

Read and pray with *Misericordiae vultus* (*The Face of Mercy*), the letter Pope Francis wrote for the Jubilee Year of Mercy.




