



DISCERNING HOPE (PART 2)



Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

We have been focusing on the theme of being a person of hope. Can we embrace this even in the midst of the challenges of life? Can we allow the ominous "deep waters" that can surround us to be transformed into "living waters of hope"? These are important questions to grapple with in the midst of our own spiritual journeys. But there is an added dimension when we know we are not alone. We share this journey with others.

Over the past few years, we have invited parishioners to participate in creating part of the environment used at Mass. On several occasions we asked you to write the names of loved ones or prayer intentions on a white cloth which then served as both an altar cloth as well as being draped over our cross. Parishioners have expressed appreciation in seeing the way the cloth has been used and recognizing their personal connection to it. We are once again doing that as we move into Lent in preparation for Easter.

Several weeks ago, we hung a blue cloth in the sanctuary which mirrored a wave. The cloth that was hung on that weekend coincided with the reading of the gospel that invites the disciples to put out into deep water. These weeks we have asked you to write on that cloth your "prayer for hope." Where and how do you need to trust in the power of God's grace to lead and embrace you? We don't hang our lives on magical wishes but rather on the sure knowledge that God journeys with us. Hope endures even if we are facing an outcome that may be different than what we asked for. As a sign of our collective prayer to share in this presence of God, this cloth will be used in a few weeks as part of our Easter environment.

Lent can truly be a powerful and meaningful time. There is something that touches the hearts of so many people by the gesture of being signed with ashes. That simple ritual identifies the need in all of our lives to face our temptations, our sinfulness, our mortality, etc. Traditionally, people "give up" something for the days of Lent. That might be helpful, but it can also remain a somewhat superficial gesture. If we are honest, we can identify parts of our spiritual lives that need attention. If we fully listen, there are parts of the gospel that challenge everyone. If we look intently, we can see suffering and brokenness that prompt us to action. For the first disciples, when they put their nets into deep water, it opened the door for them to walk a different path of life. We are called to have that same openness so that we can know the love of the Lord more deeply. Then in turn, we reflect the love of God in how we live our lives.

We hope that writing your prayer of hope on the blue cloth will be meaningful for you. We pray that this season of Lent be a holy and prayerful time. With all the challenges that surround us, the gift of hope is the one thing that can enable us to move forward with peace and confidence. Our God is with us.

LITURGY BYTES by Michele Hall



As we plowed through February, we awaken to a new month – March – and the dawning of the season of Lent which begins this Wednesday, March 5th. Every year on Ash Wednesday, we are amazed by the number of people coming to be reminded to turn away from sin and to be faithful to the Gospel as the ashes are placed on their foreheads.

Because we are engaged in a Jubilee Year, began by Pope Francis right after Christmas, our Lenten prayer will be focusing on hope. Our hope has always been that God's presence in our world would restore justice to a broken world. It is God's desire for justice, a more just society in which all households could not only survive but thrive together in peace and wellbeing. Granted, this is our wish for ourselves and for our neighbors, but sometimes it is most difficult to see that in today's world or even in our own families. Lent gives us the opportunity to renew our hope and open our hearts to God's love.

How will you address being a "pilgrim of hope" this Lent? Will it be through additional prayers, giving to the poor, or giving up something you enjoy? Children and Ashes...

Our 4 PM and 5.30 PM services will be more "child friendly."

These services will be shorter, with a homily geared to a child's understanding. This will enable the children to enter into the spirit of Lent in a manner appropriate for their age.

Fast and Abstinence

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day.

Presented by Lauren L. Richmond, Ph.D. Associate Professor, Dept. of Psychology, Stony Brook University

Memory is important for many everyday tasks including those involved in managing one's daily tasks, keeping appointments, and in interactions with others. However, memory abilities are known to change across the lifespan. Because memory is so central to everyday life, people are often interested in learning how to implement strategies and/or activities that might serve to improve memory performance. In this talk, attendees will learn about how memory works, how it changes across the lifespan, and how other thinking processes are involved in the formation and retrieval of memories. Strategies and activities that one might implement to improve performance of memory-based activities will be discussed.

Practice of Faith


(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2025")

At the heart of today's Gospel is a call to live with integrity. To be a person of integrity means there is congruence with who we say we are and what we say and do. Integrity is the antidote to hypocrisy. Lent begins this week. The season of repentance offers an opportunity to look at our lives with honesty and to seek to prune away anything that impairs our ability to live with integrity.

Take today's instructive Gospel to heart. What is within you that produces goodness and kindness and what tears it down?

Ash Wednesday serves as a doorway to a time of intense spiritual preparation leading to Easter and continuing through Pentecost. Make a deliberate plan to cross the threshold into Lent by arranging your calendar to attend Ash Wednesday services.

How is God calling you to journey through Lent? Begin to formulate the ideas about how you will incorporate the spiritual practices of Lent - prayer, fasting, and almsgiving (acts of charity) - into your life throughout the weeks ahead.




