



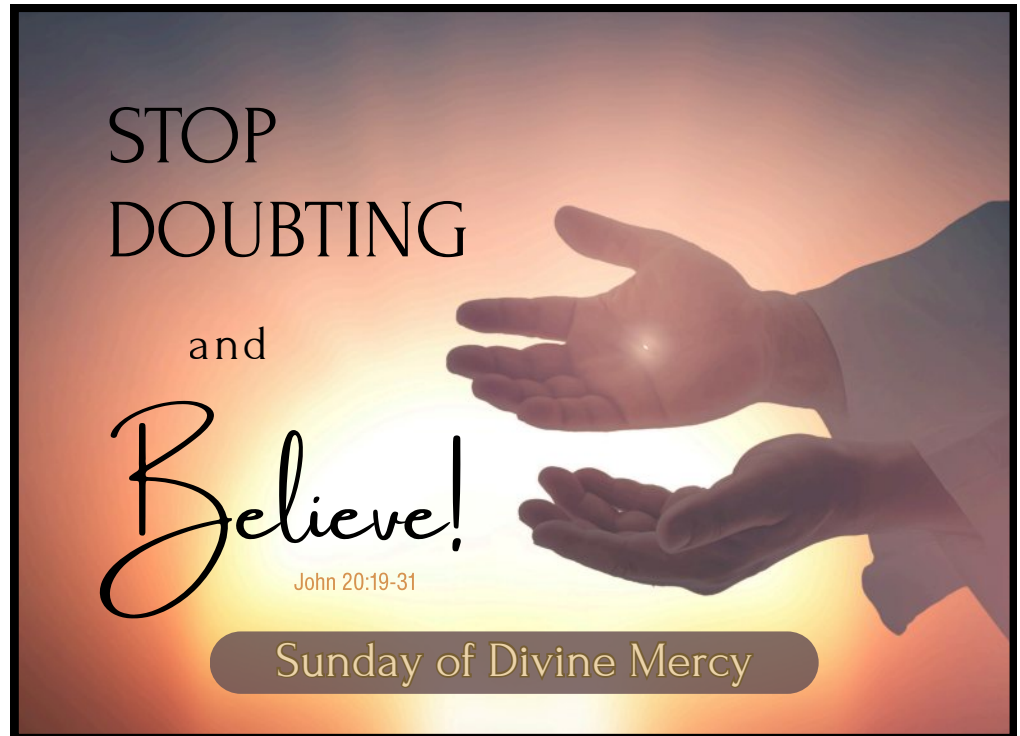

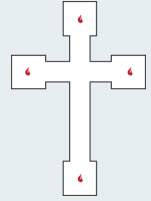

THE BEST SEAT IN THE HOUSE

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael



There is an old Barry Manilow song that bears this title. It reflects his role as a performer and the relationship that he shares with his audience. He is grateful for what he is able to do. He is filled with wonder and awe at an audience that keeps showing up. It may seem odd to identify a relationship between one person who is on stage and a countless number of people in attendance who for the most part are unknown, but he needs to acknowledge a bond that is there. The list of things I don't have in common with Barry far exceeds what we may share. Yet, I understand his desire to express his sentiment and I appreciate his insight.

There are certain aspects of Liturgy that are a scripted dialog. I say, "Peace be with you." And you dutifully respond, "And with your spirit." But there is a whole lot more at work than just saying the right words at the right time. There is a real energy that is at work. At times it feels as though it is a conversation. At Mass I am the one doing most of the talking. But it is indeed a two-way street. There are times when I see gently nodding heads identifying that I said something that rings true. There are times I sense shuffling and movement meaning that I am using too many words or losing focus. But the most powerful response is silence. Sometimes it is apparent that there is absolutely no noise and people are attentively listening. Those moments are simultaneously energizing for me as well as being the most frightening moments. To know I may be awakening God's grace in a person's heart or allowing them to experience God's presence is a humbling moment. Human interactions with one another can be powerful encounters. But realizing that God is at work brings it to a completely different level.

I was abundantly aware of this energy throughout Holy Week. But in particular, I felt it at the Masses on Easter Sunday. It was crowded. Most weekends we get 800-900 people who attend Mass. Last weekend it was a few shy of 2,000. The sheer volume of people adds to the energy level. We gather as a body of believers to once again tell the story that defines who we are. It is remarkable that although everyone already knows the story, there is an awareness it needs to be told again. And this story never gets old. The circumstances of life allow us to hear it in a new way time and time again.

It is a humbling privilege to do what I do. As I have shared with you in the past, I love being the tour guide. To bring people to new places or allow them to have fun adventures is a great source of joy for me. There are times I like to think of myself as the tour guide on the spiritual journey. I don't claim to be some guru who understands the great mysteries of life. But I do believe I can help people to understand the mystery of God at work in the midst of their own lives. I spend time creating my homilies. I try to use appropriate words and structure it in a cohesive way. But I assure you, my best homilies are when I get out of the way and allow the Spirit to work through me. It is an honor to do what I do.

To be in the sanctuary and see the faces of so many people is an awesome experience. There are many people I don't know. There are some people whose story and struggles I know well. It is an amazing array of lives coming together to a common place and time. It is the Lord that unites us, but I thank you for the trust and openness in allowing me to be the one to dare to speak of that precious gift. I am truly blessed. I have the best seat in the house. Happy Easter.

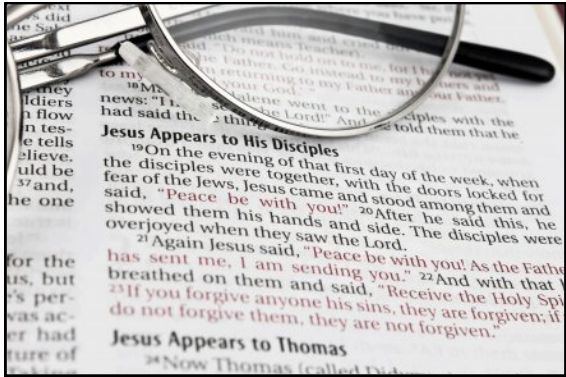

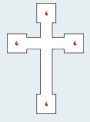

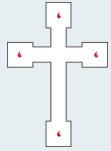

The Easter season is also known as the Great 50 days which concludes with the feast of Pentecost on May 24th this year. This season is also the longest of the liturgical seasons outside of Ordinary Time which occurs at two different times during the year.

Easter is all about lingering in the great joy of the Resurrection. You might be wondering, how do we do that for 50 days? The Easter season is to be a time of joy, and to be joyful is supposed to be the mark of all Christians.

During this season, new Christians have been welcomed into the faith. Now is their time to reflect on what happened to them and how their lives are touched by the experience and faith community where they will worship. This season can be seen as more than a one-time event. It is an ongoing lifelong transformation of people. We should celebrate that we are a people of light and hope. Even though the disciples abandoned Him, the risen Christ sought out the disciples. As they hid in fear of persecution, Christ appeared, and pardoned and restored them. He extended to His disciples peace and a mission of forgiveness. He was persistent even though Thomas continued in his disbelief. To heal Thomas, Jesus invited him to touch His wounds. Through the wounds of Christ, Thomas was healed and received the peace of the risen Lord. How might you also be healed?

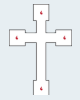

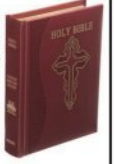

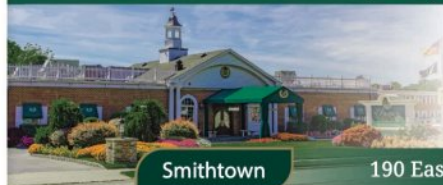
