



#### ADDRESSING THE PROBLEM



#### Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

I am writing this article on the eve of Election Day. I pray my words are appropriate for whatever may come of the day.

The late Dr. Joy Browne was a psychologist who hosted a call-in radio show in the late 90s and into the 2000s. I enjoyed listening to her for a variety of reasons. She had a lighthearted approach when addressing people's questions, but she was very practical and had the ability to go to the heart of the matter. She had great wisdom. She taught me some helpful techniques that I use to this day when I meet with people. When she was dealing with someone who was in conflict with another, she would raise the question, "Do you want to be right, or do you want to resolve the problem?" Inevitably the person would reveal, "I want both." They were often convinced that they were right, and the other was wrong, and the victor had to be identified. To say, "I told you so" means your ego and your need to be right are more important than addressing the problem. When that attitude is maintained, it creates the dynamic of a winner and a loser, while the underlying issue largely goes unresolved. Dr. Browne would say to choose one or the other, but you can't have both.

We have an abundance of winner/loser attitude in our world today. Some spiritual mystics such as Thomas Merton refer to this as dualistic thinking. It makes logical sense to divide issues into one of two conclusions. Our mind wants to make things tidy by creating only one of two possible poles. But rarely will wisdom or the truth of the gospel be found in this way of thinking. The art of dialogue, consensus, and looking at life in broader spectrums is becoming less and less frequent.

In today's Gospel, Jesus addresses some of these very issues. We hear about the distinction between the scribe who would have been seen as the wise one deserving of respect verses the poor widow who seemingly has nothing to offer. In the end, Jesus praises the spirit of trust and surrender that the poor widow demonstrated while being critical of the self-proclaimed righteousness of the scribe. But Jesus does not create the categories of the good guys and bad guys. He tries to help define that path in the middle that all are called to walk. The path of holiness is wide enough to allow those on both sides of the street to find a place to walk. We pray that kind of wisdom is demonstrated in those chosen to lead our land. Don't condemn those you don't like and canonize those you do. Rather, adopt the attitude that discerns solutions to the many questions before us. We cannot expect greatness from others if we ourselves do not seek to walk a path of wisdom.

One final note, we offer our gratitude to all our veterans who we remember on Monday. Often these men and women made tremendous sacrifices and put their own needs aside to be at the service of our nation. May we never take for granted the freedom, peace, and abundant blessings we enjoy because of their efforts.



# LITURGY BYTES by Michele Hall



Continuing with reflecting on the parts of the Mass, today we will focus on the Lamb of God. As the priest breaks the host into pieces for distribution of Holy Communion, did you know that the bread that is broken on the altar is Christ's body? We all realize that the Body of Christ was broken on the cross. It is from the wounds of our Lord that our salvation is to come forth. It is in the midst of a broken world that the Lamb of God makes himself known. As we sing the Lamb of God chant, we are invited to consider the redemption that Christ promises for a broken world and for our brokenness.

The words that we sing are taken from the Gospels when John the Baptist approaches Our Lord (after Jesus' Baptism) and says: "Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world." Now at Mass, we stand before the Eucharistic presence of Christ each week beholding, loving, and contemplating the gift of the Eucharist.

Our response is "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." The text is taken from Matthew's Gospel. The centurion, whose servant is at home paralyzed, asks Jesus to heal his servant. As we know, Jesus said he would. Then the centurion cries out "Lord, I am not worthy to have you enter under my roof; only say the word and my servant will be healed." (Matthew 8:8)

The Lamb of God will make us worthy. The Lamb of God himself, both the host and the food, will prepare a place in our hearts to welcome the living God.

This week as we sing the familiar chant, Lamb of God..., try to recall how beautiful and overwhelming this gift of Jesus is that we have before us. How can we become what we eat?

Have a blessed, joyful, and prayerful week ahead!

# Next weekend, November 16th and 17th, will be the first weekend of our Outreach Parish Christmas Program

We are once again requesting gift cards from local stores (i.e., Target, Wal-Mart) to enable our Outreach families to purchase for themselves and their children the items they need.

As you may know we have also helped the following agencies for the last several years and will continue to do so this Christmas:

**Olsen's Rest Home** is a neighborhood facility for frail elderly on Gibbs Pond Road. Residents of the home have always been considered members of our parish community. Holy Cross ministers to our friends at Olsen's in a variety of ways during the year.

**Mercy Haven** is a provider of housing and other services for persons who are elderly, those living with mental illness, those families who are on limited income and those with special needs.

**Pronto** is a human service agency located in Brentwood helping people in need with food, clothing, and other necessities. They assist approximately 500 families for the holidays each year.

**Talbot House Chemical Dependency Crisis Center** is a 24-hour voluntary chemical dependence crisis center licensed by the New York State Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services to provide short-term medically monitored inpatient withdrawal services to adult men and women who are in crisis. This facility provides nourishing meals, counseling, limited transportation, support groups, and referrals.


