





#### MAKING CONNECTIONS



#### Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

This past week was one of those weeks where there were a number of events and moments in the parish where I sensed good and holy things were happening. The best way I can describe it is that "connections" were being made. I believe these connections were happening on different levels: between fellow parishioners, between individuals and God, and even within the heart of each person.

Last week we tried doing a little bit of a formal opening to the Jubilee Year which will use the theme suggested by the Holy Father, "Pilgrims of Hope." At several of the Masses we had children carrying colored streamers in the opening procession. These are the same colors that are found in the official logo for Pilgrims of Hope. There is something about children that makes most adults smile. The congregation was delighted to see a small parade of young ones being an active part of the celebration. It was a simple activity, yet it seemed to speak for itself. The very presence of children conveys a message of hope for the future.

Bishop Barres likes stopping in on parishes to celebrate one of the Sunday Masses. I received word last Thursday that he would be here to celebrate the 8:00 Mass. I think most parishioners were surprised to see him but were delighted that the shepherd of our Diocese would be here to celebrate Mass.

Last weekend we also blessed and distributed copies of the Scriptures to our Level 5 children. It is beautiful to see so many families here and to witness the children receiving their bibles. Some of them seemed nervous as they approached, but many others were quite happy. Again, this was a simple gesture yet there was something powerful in seeing the students receive something as significant as the Scriptures. And, for the two kids who were at the 8:00 Mass, they were able to receive their bibles from the bishop which was a special blessing to them and their families.

Our Youth Ministry offered hospitality after several of the Masses. It is another opportunity of witnessing our young people involved in the life of the parish. It also helps to provide a forum for parishioners to gather after Mass and spend time with each other. These monthly hospitality opportunities will continue in the future.

Last Thursday night we had a beautiful prayer service for our students preparing for Confirmation. In previous years we invited an outside speaker who would come and lead the prayer. Those evenings were okay, but they always felt like they were lacking something. This year we decided to make a "homemade" evening instead. A group of catechists came together under the guidance of Jennifer Miller, our Religious Ed Coordinator. We invited back Sal Finocchiaro, our former Youth Minister, to lead the evening. Brian Reich, our Music Director, was the cherry on the cake as he brought a hefty dose of life and energy to the gathering through music. The evening included a fun ice-breaker, witness talks by some of our older teens, as well as prayer and reflection. It was an effective evening where the faith life of our young people and the life of the parish were awakened.

Making meaningful connections in the lives of people may not happen every time we gather. But when it does happen it is evident, and it is inspiring. This was one of those weeks at Holy Cross. An occasion that fosters the flowing of God's grace is a blessing, and it is important to acknowledge when that happens.

#### **CANDLEMAS DAY**



#### LITURGY BYTES by Michele Hall



Every so often a feast falls on a Sunday, and this weekend it happens once again. February 2nd is the Feast of the Presentation. This happens only every 6 years. The Feasts of the Lord take precedence over the normal Sunday cycle which began as Winter Ordinary Time just a few weeks ago.

The Presentation of the Lord commemorates the day when Joseph and Mary, according to Jewish tradition, brought Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem for the first time, 40 days after his birth. When December 25 was adopted as Christmas in the Roman Rite, back in the 4th Century, the Feast of the Presentation began to be celebrated on February 2nd, 40 days after Christmas.

At the start of the 8th Century, the Pope at the time added a candlelight procession at the beginning of Mass. Shortly after, the blessing and distribution of candles were added and continues today. The connection with candles and light led to the day being called Candlemas Day. The Presentation of the Lord could be seen as an extension of the Christmas mystery, the Incarnation, even though it falls in Ordinary Time. It also connects the celebrations of Christmas and Easter as it highlights Christ, the Light of the World.

In the Gospel reading, we hear Luke telling us that the Christ child was brought to the prophet Simeon in the temple. Simeon had waited his entire lifetime to meet the Messiah. This account is remembered daily in the Gospel Canticle Night Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours for those familiar with this beautiful expression of prayer.

This weekend, we invited everyone to bring a candle or two from home for a blessing, as we bless the Church candles that are used here. We also are sending families home with a single blessed candle and prayer highlighting Christ, the Light of the World, for our homes.

Have a blessed, bright, and joy-filled week ahead!

#### Practice of Faith

(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2025")



Today's feast commemorates the occasion that Mary and Joseph bring Jesus to be presented to the temple in Jerusalem in accordance with Jewish law. The Gospel includes a prayer offered by the temple elder, Simeon, as he holds the infant Jesus in his arms. Simeon's prayer is the basis of the Gospel canticle for night prayer called the *Nunc Dimittis* (meaning "now dismiss" or "let go").

 $Include \ Simeon's \ prayer \ in \ your \ night \ devotions \ as \ you \ close \ your \ day \ and \ begin \ your \ rest.$ 



The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord is celebrated with candles (it used to be known as Candlemas) because of Simeon's recognition that in the person of Jesus, God has given us salvation, "a light for revelation to the Gentiles, / and glory for your people, Israel" (Luke 2:32).

On February 8, the Church celebrates the optional Memorial of St. Josephine Bakhita, who as a child was kidnapped, enslaved, and trafficked. In her spirit, make a gift or advocate against human trafficking.


