

RETREAT REFLECTIONS

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael



I write this article on my first morning back. I was at a men's retreat at the Manresa Retreat House in Convent, Louisiana. It is run by the Jesuits. In addition to the retreat, I took a detour through Baton Rouge, and I spent a night in New Orleans. I am afraid to tell you that most days the temperature hit the 70s. I did not know this would be one of our most severe winters when I booked this trip back in November. I felt a tad guilty, but I rolled up my sleeves and enjoyed it.

A simple rule of life is if you want to hear God, just be quiet. This was a silent retreat. The very fact that no one spoke to one another lends oneself to hear the whispering of God in many places. There is an interesting dynamic at work when you have a large group who are all silent. Somehow its power is intensified in it being a shared experience. What was even a greater blessing is that we were urged to turn off our phones for the duration of the retreat. I went 72 hours without looking at a single text or email. That alone was a cathartic experience. There was some "technology withdrawal" and fears of losing touch with the world, but life went on peacefully. No need to keep track of time, they rang a bell to let you know when the next event was about to begin. It was a period of freedom and tranquility.

I did not have any profound revelations. The insights I received were all simple messages and reminders:

- I am loved. We are loved.
- God is good.
- There can be great joy found in something as simple as eating a meal.
- Trust in God; worrying is a fruitless exercise.
- My mom passed away just over six years ago. I would have thought the grieving process would have been well over by now. But much to my surprise, there was still a wave of healing and comfort to be received.
- God always calls us to more. Keep listening and his invitation becomes clearer.
- The retreat house property was filled with countless mighty oak trees. Each one was a work of art. They could actually teach lessons of life by their very existence.

I have not traveled much in the South. But every time I visit, there is something about "Southern hospitality" that enriches the experience. There is a gentle and gracious spirit woven into the hearts of many people that just exudes from their presence. Whether it be the dining room staff at the retreat house or the shuttle bus driver at the airport, there is a welcoming energy that is unmistakable. I must also say that many of their culinary specialties make me do backflips of joy. Among my favorites that I had on this trip included fried catfish, charbroiled oysters, po-boys, gumbo, rice and beans, and even grits (served at every breakfast) were satisfying.

Now back to parish life. This weekend we formally introduce our theme of "Called to Compassion." Wednesday is Ash Wednesday. Next Sunday we begin the great Lenten stories at Mass. I pray I am spiritually charged up for these holy times that await. If not, I will happily go back for more.

Children and Ashes...

**Our 4 PM service will be more "child friendly."*

These services will be shorter, with a homily geared to a child's understanding. This will enable the children to enter into the spirit of Lent in a manner appropriate for their age.

Fast and Abstinence

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day.

Our Outreach pantry is accessed by families, like yours, every week. This Lent, we are inviting you to join us in keeping the shelves full and helping to feed our neighbors in need.




