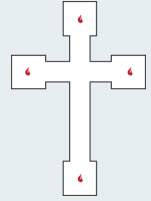

AN OLD MAN'S RANT

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael



Please bear with me as I share this slice of life with you. For over thirty years I had a Bose CD/AM/FM unit. About three years ago the CD player gave out. Yes, I still listen to CDs. (Truth be known, I still have a tape player and cassettes. But that is another story for another day.) About a year ago the alarm feature stopped working. About six months ago the clock stopped keeping accurate time. So, my all-in-one unit was reduced to being a radio. Then the on/off button only worked intermittently. To compensate for that, I kept the radio on all the time and hit the mute button when I didn't want to listen to it. As much as I hated to admit it, it was time to let my Bose system retire. No problem, I'll just get something to replace it. I ordered a similar unit on Amazon. It took them two months to realize it was no longer available. I was back to the drawing board. Much to my amazement most new radios no longer have AM. I felt like Don Quixote on a quest, and I was not exactly victorious. I finally found a basic little clock radio that kind of does the job. I'm waking up on time and life goes on.

This is a silly story, but it brought to light some wider aspects of life. Life changes. Things that we thought "would always be there" sometimes run their course. Life moves on. Just because I can't keep up with changes in technology may not be the world's fault. It can be humbling when we feel out of sync with what surrounds us. Moments like this can be opportunities to reflect on life and the passing of time. It need not be a negative experience if we are open to allowing new experiences and looking with a different perspective. On many occasions Jesus said, "be not afraid." I suppose those words can even apply to a sadness that arises when a tried-and-true radio pops its last fuse.

Next week is Pentecost. The gospel story begins with the disciples who were locked in a room filled with fear because they did not understand all that had happened with Jesus. When he appears to them, his first words are, "Peace be with you." Jesus then offers the gift of the Spirit. The first quality Jesus attributes to the Spirit is the ability to forgive sins. Not just that God forgives our sins, but we have the same ability to hold on to or let go of the hurts that have been done to us in this life. The gift of the Spirit is about freedom and new life.

We need to be mindful of the ways in which the routine of our lives might keep us in a very small and protected world. We need to be mindful of the barriers that might separate us from one another. We are called to enter the fullness of this holy season. The Holy Spirit is given to continually call us more deeply into the mystery of God's love. Think of all the ways in which your life would be enhanced if you could move beyond your sadness, anger, and fears of this life. The Holy Spirit is not some magical spell that suddenly makes everything right. But the Spirit can keep us on a path to live with joy and hope because we know all we do is rooted in God. No matter what age you may be, the invitation is always there to allow God's grace into our lives. Our Lord asks for our trust, there is always more life to live.

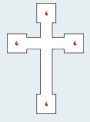

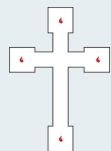

COME, HOLY SPIRIT

LITURGY BYTES *by Michele Hall*



Fifty days after Easter, the Church celebrates the feast of Pentecost when the Holy Spirit descends upon the Apostles and Mary in the Upper Room, just as Jesus told them. Some refer to this feast as the birthday of the Church. Pentecost, the word, is from the Greek word meaning "50th day." This day also marks the beginning of the Apostles and disciples' earthly ministry when they were commissioned to go forth and make disciples of all nations.

The symbols of Pentecost are the flame, wind, and the dove which represents the Holy Spirit. The color of Pentecost is red, as we will see the Priest's vestments being red as well as the Church banners. It is always suggested that parishioners wear something red on Pentecost when coming to Mass as we celebrate the very beginnings of the Church.

On the day of Pentecost when the Easter season comes to an end, Christ's Passover is fulfilled in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit manifested, given, and communicated as a divine person: of his fullness, Christ the Lord pours out the Spirit in abundance. We, too, share in the Spirit on two occasions - at our Baptism and again at Confirmation. By the power of the Spirit, we bear much fruit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. These are known as the fruits of the Holy Spirit. In addition, we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit which are wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, wonder and awe, all which guide and assist us throughout life. Think about how these fruits and gifts have helped us through our lives on different occasions. Let us rejoice together and say, HAPPY BIRTHDAY CHURCH!

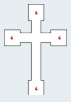
IRELAND 2026

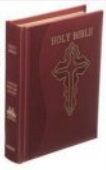

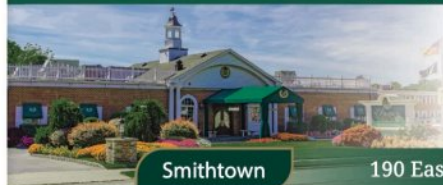
