



Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

We have sprung a leak! At least our baptismal font has. The problem began a few weeks ago. At first, we thought it could be resolved with a little bit of silicone caulking, but that did not do the trick. It has been drained for over a week, and water continues to seep out. It seems there is water trapped within the walls of the font which is slowly working its way out. We don't want to start pulling off the marble exterior panels, so we will wait until it appears to have completely dried out. We will then be regrouting all the joints. We hope that will resolve the issue. As we continue to experience with other parts of the building, everything is 30 years old and more and more items are in need of repair. I pray that the new grout does the trick. I dread the thought of having to rebuild the font. We have a large glass bowl filled with holy water as a temporary replacement. I wonder who is the patron saint of leaky baptismal fonts?

I hear many people say, "The summer is flying by." Call me crazy, but I am enjoying the pace of this summer. This summer has been more of a "staycation" for me than previous years. I don't have much travel planned, so I'm spending lots of time around the house. I try to keep up with yard maintenance around the property which I enjoy. I'm not even complaining (too much) about the days that have been very hot. I hope your summer is going well.


