

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

Monday was the Columbus Day holiday, and our offices were closed. I spent most of the day with two former colleagues from St. John the Baptist High School. We went for a delightful walk in Connetquot State Park. As much as I like traveling and exploring new treasures, there are still many gems on Long Island that I have yet to discover. It was my first time visiting the park. Although it was not sunny until later in the afternoon, it was a delightful day for a walk. The foliage was not quite at its peak, but still it was quite beautiful. There were plenty of chipmunks, ducks, swans, and even a hawk that greeted us along our journey.

We had little chit-chats with one another as we walked along and afterwards shared a lovely lunch. But it is silence that always strikes me as a blessing. The further we walked into the woods, the more the sound of traffic on Sunrise Highway faded away. Silence has the ability to cleanse the mind. It's not necessary to always be thinking or speaking. Solitude is a rich gift to embrace when the opportunity comes along. It is in those moments that it feels like God is chit-chatting with you. That spirit of serenity continued even after I got home. I took a delightful nap. Too often I turn on the TV as background noise to whatever I am doing. I spent the rest of the evening puttering around the house enjoying the silence. UNIVERSAL PRAYER



LITURGY BYTES by Michele Hall



Last week we reflected a bit on the Creed, our Profession of Faith, that we say at Mass each week. Today, we move onto the general intercessions, Prayer of the Faithful (as it was once called), presently referred to as the Universal Prayer.

This prayer was instituted by the second Vatican Council as a way for the people to take part in the intercessions for the Church, civil authorities, for those oppressed, for all of us, and for the salvation of the entire world.

It really makes sense to have this prayer for all Christians to enter into by virtue of our vocation. At Mass, the world is not left behind. We pray for the Church and her leaders. We pray for the nation, that it may care for the common good. We pray for those who are suffering in the world through natural disasters, because of illness, loneliness and other sorrows. We pray for women and men of good will. We pray for everyone who might enter into the life of the Church.

The prayer is written with the community's needs in mind in a structured way. This enables us to recall the needs of the world before we pray at the altar. The Universal Prayer reveals to us our vocation as lay Catholics in the world. We are to bring everything to the altar of God. Our priesthood, which is baptismal and not ministerial, is a real intercession before God for the sake of the world. We are not creating intercessions that enable us to express our political position at Mass. Instead, we are really inviting God to transform everything in love.


Perhaps in preparation for next week's Mass, spend a few moments and write your own universal prayer. What did you pray for and why?

Thanksgiving Baskets



We invite you and your families to consider participating in helping a family this Thanksgiving season. We will again be supplying Thanksgiving dinners to people from our community who need assistance. Last year we were able to provide 47 families with a complete Thanksgiving meal. Once again, we look to our parish community for volunteers to help make this possible.

*Each volunteer will be responsible for buying and packaging the food for a basket. They will be given the suggested menu and shopping list with supermarket gift cards to cover the cost.

This has been a long-standing tradition in the parish and the reason is simple. We want everyone to have the opportunity to participate in our Thanksgiving Basket Program. All families, no matter what their financial situation may be, are welcome to participate, shop, prepare a basket and send their best wishes to a family in need. You may not have the treasure, but you may have the talent and time to participate. By supplying gift cards to those who are assigned a basket, we are able to ensure EVERYONE is welcome to participate. For many families, the gift cards that are provided for shopping are given back/not used and returned to Outreach, but this is not required. We are grateful to all those who shop for our Outreach families and help to make our Thanksgiving Basket Program a huge success.

The completed baskets will be brought to the parish Atrium on Sunday, November 17, between 3pm and 5pm. If you choose to bring it during Mass, please leave all parcels of your completed basket in the Father Joe Room, clearly marked with your assigned family number.

We hope this program will offer those in our parish the opportunity to share with our struggling neighbors, making Thanksgiving a time of joy and blessings. Over the years we have seen many parish families embrace this project with creativity and enthusiasm. Our Outreach folks are always touched by the caring of the community of Holy Cross.

Anyone interested in participating can sign up in the Atrium after the Masses on the weekend of October 26th and 27th.

Donations of money or supermarket gift cards will also be greatly appreciated and very necessary to help defray the expenses of this program. Envelopes marked "Thanksgiving" can be dropped in the collection basket or brought to the Outreach office.


