



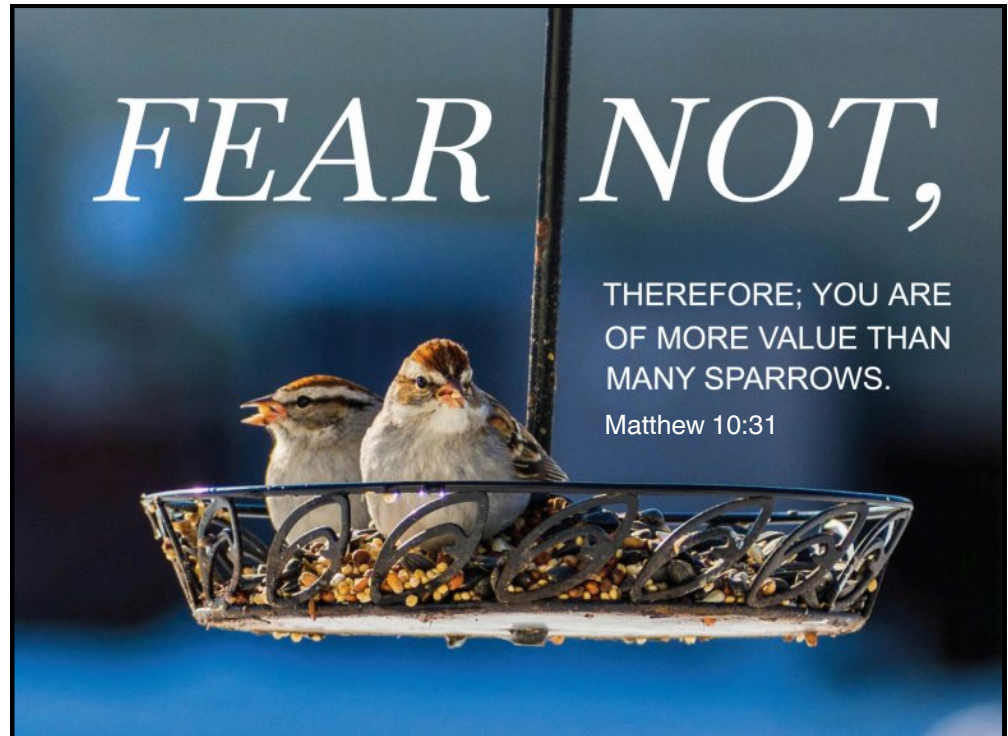

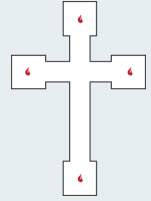

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael



These weeks of June are my favorite weeks of the year. The sun is up longer than at any time of the year. The evenings seem to go on forever. Warm weather is consistent. My birthday comes within days of the solstice. The beginning of summer is an energizing time for me. And, it's now official this summer season has begun; I saw my first firefly on Monday night. I enjoy these days now, but I recall having fond memories of them as child. The end of the school year brought tremendous freedom and excitement. It felt like outside playtime never ended as the sun set so late in the day. Every year my family used to go away to a little resort in New Hampshire around mid-August. There were many weeks of joyful planning and anticipation for that annual trek. There always seemed to be something fun to do. It was a carefree time.

(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2026")

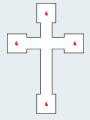

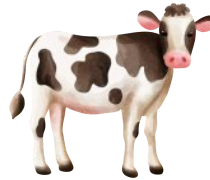

Celebrate Eucharist

The feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, traditionally known as Corpus Christi, commemorates the institution of the Eucharist.



Thank you to our First Communicant volunteers who helped lead our Holy Cross parishioners into the 5pm & 11:30am Masses on the weekend of June 7th with a procession to celebrate the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.



Every Mass is a commemoration of Jesus' Last Supper and a proclamation and participation on this mystery. Because we can sometimes get lost in the routine each Sunday, the feast of Corpus Christi helps us focus once again on what we are called to do at Mass.

Parishes celebrate the feast day in a variety of ways but regardless of the activity, its purpose is the same:

- To remember the night on which Christ celebrated His Last Supper, and during which He shared His own Body and Blood with His friends
- To proclaim and participate in the Eucharist as a mystery at the heart of the Catholic faith, as the source and summit of our lives as disciples of Christ
- The Feast of Corpus Christi reminds us that at every Mass, we are called to:
 - CELEBRATE what we believe. We express our faith in the risen Christ, who gave His life for us out of love.
 - LIVE what we believe. We give witness to the risen Christ by our way of life.
 - BECOME what we receive. We become Christlike, so that others might see in us and in what we do the one who gave His life for us.

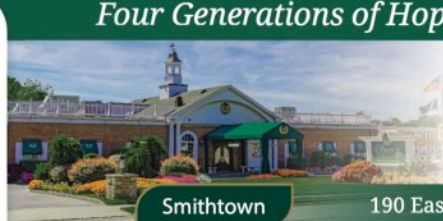
