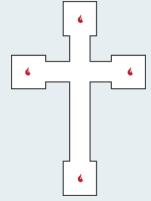

DON'T CHANGE MY PRE-SETS

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael



A few hours before I left on the parish trip to Ireland back in April, I received a call from a friend. He told me that the transmission on his car failed and that it would be in the shop for at least a week. He said he was not sure what he was going to do for transportation for the week. As I was about to leave on a 9-day trip, I offered him use of my car while I was away. He gratefully accepted the invitation.

When I got back into the car after returning home, I turned on the radio. While my friend did not change the pre-sets on the radio, it was left on the station to which he was listening. It was a religious/Christian music station (88.9 WFRS ~ Family Radio in Smithtown). I was not expecting to hear religious songs and the reading of scripture, but that was what was being broadcast. My first inkling was to change it to one of "my stations," but I let it go. Much to my surprise, there was something engaging, relaxing, inspiring and comforting in listening to this programming as I drove.

Many times when I drive, I don't even turn the radio on; I enjoy silence. When I do, it is often tuned to talk radio. Much of the content of talk radio is political pundits offering their perspective on life. Sometimes there is pertinent news or unique insights that are engaging, but many times it repeats the same ideas and themes over and over again. There can be a negative tone and energy in the presentation. Depending on the content, it can be unsettling to listen to. I did not realize that I was bombarding myself with rhetoric that was neither helpful nor fruitful. Slowly but surely, I found something peaceful with the music and messages of this new station. In all fairness, there is a repetition of content on this station as well. There are repeated messages of God's mercy, compassion, and hope. But if you are going to be bombarded with words and noise, why not choose something that is uplifting and brings life?

To be honest, I could not listen exclusively to that station if I were going on a long trip. The evangelical perspective can be engaging, but I find it does not go as deep as some of our Catholic beliefs and traditions. Yet, it is often a springboard for me in spending some time in prayer and reflection even as I drive. Had someone suggested I listen to this station, I probably would have politely declined. I had my routines and there was no need to look elsewhere. I wandered into this experience, and it has been very positive.

We had a parishioner by the name of Barbara Sherry who passed away about two years ago. Through the years several members of the Pastoral Team and parishioners would visit her regularly. She was homebound and dealt with more than her fair share of crosses and burdens. One thing that was consistent was that she always had that same radio station playing no matter what was happening. She needed the constant reminder of God's goodness and how we are beloved in His eyes. It was a great source of comfort for her, particularly when she was alone or afraid. At the time, I did not appreciate what she did. In hindsight, I understand she found something life-giving and made it a part of her life.

I think for most of us, the pre-sets on our car radios are one of the boundaries we set in our lives that create a comfort zone of familiarity. We would prefer not to have to reprogram them or even worse look for new favorites. But sometimes we stumble into something unexpected that brings us life and a new perspective. Be open to the wondrous ways the Spirit works, even through the dashboard of your car.

ADORATION

LITURGY BYTES *by Michele Hall*



Our parish has offered a Holy Hour once a month on Saturday afternoons from 3:45 to 4:45. Have you perhaps arrived for 5 PM Mass and noticed people in the worship space kneeling in quiet prayer? The Blessed Sacrament, usually a large host, is on the altar in a large gold vessel called a monstrance. At the conclusion of the hour, the people are blessed, and Jesus is returned to the Tabernacle. This special prayer time is also known as Eucharistic Adoration.

Whatever name you call it, the most important thing to know is that it is an act of worshipping God as He is present in the Eucharist. From the Last Supper on, Catholics know that Jesus is present, soul and divinity, under the appearances of bread and wine. You might be asking, why do Adoration? I can be with Jesus by attending Mass.

Naturally, we can show our adoration to God in many ways. In Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, we spend time adoring the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Spending time with Jesus places your soul in His direct presence. All it requires is our ability to sit down.

Generations of people have found that honest, persevering prayer before the Blessed Sacrament has helped them to open their eyes, to accept God's grace more deeply, and respond to it with greater generosity. In conclusion, read what St. (Mother) Teresa of Calcutta has to say:

"The time you spend with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is the best time that you will spend on earth. Each moment that you spend with Jesus will deepen your union with Him and make your soul everlastingly more glorious and beautiful in heaven and will help bring about an everlasting peace on earth."

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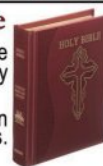
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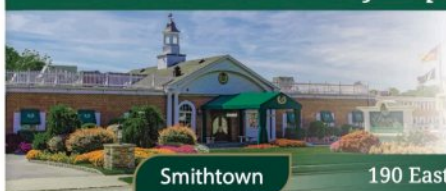
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
