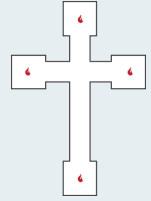

A CONVERGENCE OF LIFE

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael



This week's gospel begins with Jesus looking for some quiet time by Himself. He just received news of the death of John the Baptist and was likely looking for space to grieve and reflect. Instead, He finds a large crowd seeking His help. Rather than run away, He responds to their needs. He cures those who are sick. At one point He realizes they are hungry. The disciples' suggestion is to "send them away." Jesus' response is, "No, you feed them yourselves." The disciples think this is an impossible task as they have little food to offer. In the end, there is a miraculous multiplication of loaves and fishes, and everyone eats in abundance. This resolution comes about through Jesus making His disciples engage with the people. The hungry crowd becomes an issue for the disciples to handle. Ultimately, it was a gift from God, but the disciples had to work with the Spirit to allow people to be fed in abundance.

Coincidentally, this gospel comes at a time when our food pantry is depleted and there is a need for food. The last two weekends I have asked for folks to bring in a few additional items if able. The response has been overwhelming. The wave of donated food coming in is meeting a real need within our community. Thank you for your care and concern. Your generosity is appreciated.

I cannot help but recognize all this is happening at the same time we are trying to deal with the abundance of stuff we have in our basement. Material objects are not necessarily sinful or evil. There are times when all of us need various items. They can be the tools needed to accomplish an important task. In many instances, the materials we have were used as part of a ministry or parish program. My guess is that it is not only here at the church that we face this reality, but I am sure there are many attics and garages throughout the parish filled with treasures. Somewhere along the line the genuine need and usefulness of the things may fade away, but the acquisition of materials continues. There is a fear or a need within many people that prompts them to hold on rather than let go.

When this goes unchecked, it can literally become a barricade. It becomes an overwhelming pile of stuff. This is not just a practical matter, but it is a spiritual one as well. It also contributes to a mindset that we need to surround ourselves with things in order to be happy and secure. There is a delicate balance we are called to seek between scarcity and abundance.

Throughout the gospel, Jesus continually teaches that the primary task in discipleship is to be mindful of those who are in need. We are also called to trust that the Father will call us where we need to go in this life. He will provide us what we need. Jesus warns against building bigger barns. We need to be mindful of where in our lives we have an abundance. We also need to be mindful of where in this life we encounter scarcity. We cannot be like the disciples who initially wanted to send those in need away. Jesus' response of "Give them some food yourselves" is not limited to the disciples. May we pray for the wisdom and trust we need to live our lives faithfully to respond to the need around us.

In the midst of these teachings on scarcity, generosity, and abundance I conclude with one other tidbit on a completely different note. Information regarding November's trip to Lancaster will be in next week's bulletin.

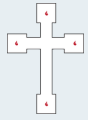

Accessibility Issues



A few weeks ago we received a call from a long-time parishioner who sadly told us she is no longer able to attend Mass at Holy Cross. She is limited in her mobility and has found the walk from our parking lot to the Worship Area too difficult, even using one of our handicapped parking spaces. We do have handicapped parking spaces, but some of them are on hills, which makes using a wheelchair or rollator potentially dangerous. Some of the spaces require a fair bit of walking.

We don't have any viable options for making our handicapped parking easier to use. But the question has been raised, can we do anything to improve the accessibility of our building from our parking lot?

Some possible considerations:

- Have rollators, walkers and/or wheelchairs available to use to provide access to the building.
- Have trained volunteers who could assist parishioners in using this equipment to get inside.
- It was even suggested that we have a golf cart to drive people from their parking spot to the atrium doors.
- Can we create a "Mass transit" system where parishioners can offer rides to those who are unable to drive?
- Are there other needs or potential solutions?

Practice of Charity

(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2026")

Today's readings are a lovingly firm reminder of the abundant nature of God's love for us – miraculous, unstoppable, endlessly multiplying, and impossible to impede. It is an astounding and profound comfort to know that because of God's unending love for us, God will satisfy the hunger and thirst we have, and nothing we do can ever separate us from that love.

Consider the miraculous feeding of the five thousand. What miracle, big or small, has the Lord worked in your life and satisfied your hunger?

Reflecting on Romans 8:35, 37-39, where have obstacles separated us from God's love, or prevented people from knowing God's love through us?

The first reading invites those who are without to come and receive. What obligations do we have to others to do the same? In what ways can we bring God's charity to life for those in need?

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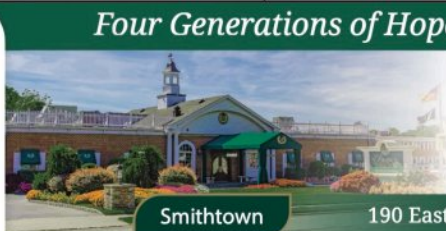
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
