

FAMILY FORTITUDE

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael



This Sunday the Church celebrates the Feast of the Holy Family. We recognize the amazing response of Mary and Joseph in accepting God's plan in their lives. On a spiritual level, the two of them had to have tremendous trust to accept a message of how they were to be the parents of a child that defied all logic and reason. They said "yes" and faithfully lived out the roles God asked of them. We can never underestimate their unconditional openness to God's Spirit at work in their hearts. In addition, on a practical level, we admire their ability to be loving and responsible parents to a growing boy. Aside from one story in Luke's gospel when he became separated from his parents, we know nothing of his childhood, adolescence, and early adulthood. We believe that ultimately Jesus responded to what his father asked of him. But it is safe to assume that his knowledge of Jewish tradition and recognition and care for those who were broken in life had to have been taught in part at home through the words and actions of his parents. The fruit does not fall far from the tree.

Family life today can be complicated. For a variety of reasons, traditional family structures and values are not always in play. Tremendous praise needs to be afforded to mothers and fathers who sacrifice tremendously and work diligently to provide a structured and loving environment for their children. They are giving them a priceless gift. There are many women and men who are unsung heroes in what they do in caring for their family.

We pray for families who find themselves in the midst of division and conflict. Sometimes the messiness and sin of life end up creating hurtful and unhealthy situations. In circumstances like these, others can offer an essential loving presence, particularly when there are children involved. Mother energy and father energy are not limited to biological parents. There are times when people respond heroically when there is a need. We are grateful for the various and creative ways the Spirit can be at work.

There is another dynamic that needs to be included in this discussion; this faith community can play an important role in the lives of people. I have been privileged to see on many occasions how the response and care of fellow parishioners have made a significant difference in people's lives. Generous responses to food drives and Christmas programs bring hope. In addition, there are times when people go above and beyond in caring for members of this community in time of need. This is more than just a common gathering place for prayer. It is a place where love comes to life and brings hope in the midst of darkness. The power of God's grace can truly allow us to become family for one another. How blessed we are.

We are grateful for the model the Holy Family offers us. We pray that there may be a strengthening of family life. But we recognize the power of love which will always go beyond defined boundaries and roles to bring hope and comfort. We are grateful for the ways we have received that gift. We pray that we are willing to offer it to those who we encounter along the way.

On the ninety-third World Day of Migrants and Refugees, Pope Benedict XVI wrote, "The Family of Nazareth reflects the image of God safeguarded in the heart of every human family, even if disfigured and weakened by emigration." Take this week to pray for migrant families who struggle as the Holy Family did. Look for ways to aid them and support community immigrant services by donating food or clothing.

Spend time praying for your own family this week. Ask for the Holy Family's intercession for difficulties your family may be facing.

Meditate on today's second reading from St. Paul to the Colossians. How can you use "heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience" to respond to your family's needs?




