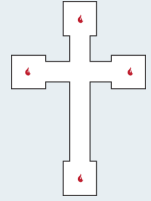

REFLECTIONS FROM THE EMERALD ISLE



Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

Thirty-three of us returned on Monday evening having enjoyed a delightful nine-day tour to Ireland. It was mostly parishioners who were on the trip, although a few came from St. Sylvester's and some brought a family member. We had lots of laughs and good times as we rode around the winding roads of Ireland. Prior to our arrival they had been experiencing weeks of rain. Everyone thanked us for bringing the sunshine. Aside from a couple of brief showers, it was a dry trip. The first few days were on the chilly side, but it got warmer as the tour went on. We had a delightful guide by the name of Denis (yes, one "n") who was an endless fount of information and laughter. Our driver, Milos, was from Croatia. There were times he had to maneuver the bus through the eye of a needle, but he did it perfectly every time. Delta Airlines took good care of us with on-time flights and friendly crews.

The driving in Ireland fascinates me. The roads are narrow, and of course driving is on the opposite side. The roundabouts (traffic circles) are endless. There seems to be much greater adherence to the rules of the road. It is a major offense to pass a car on the wrong side. Speed limits are respected. Their version of an interstate is the motorway of which there are only a few. The passing lane is just that, for passing. No camping out in the fast lane, never looking at what is behind you.

The cost of living is different than our own. There are aspects that seem greener than what we deal with. Property taxes and health care are quite reasonable. Parents are given a monthly stipend from the government for their children, regardless of income. But there is another side to the coin. Salaries are on a significantly lower scale than what we would have. Gas costs almost \$10 a gallon and diesel is over \$12, which makes everything expensive.

Aside from these observations of some of the practical stuff of a distant land, there is a different energy among the people. While not everyone who lives in Ireland is native born, there's a palpable sense of Irish pride. Most everyone we met seemed to delight in their history and heritage. Life seems to unfold at a slower and more peaceful pace. There are cities and larger towns, but within minutes of leaving these more populated places, once again you were in the countryside. I smiled every time I saw a field of sheep. Indeed, as the old song says, there are "forty shades of green," and they are all a delight to look at.

I enjoyed many of the traditional dishes of Ireland: fish and chips, lamb stew, cottage pie, etc. The only thing I passed on was the white and dark pudding that is served for breakfast. Please forgive me, I am not a fan of Guinness. Lest I forget the most important element of the tour, at our medieval banquet in a castle, out of four tour groups, I was chosen to be "Lord of the Manor." (I'm sure pictures of this will abound.) Long live the king!

By the final day, I was ready to come home. There were several members of staff who went on the trip. I am grateful to those who stayed home and held down the fort while we were away. I am grateful to the many priests who came from near and far to help cover Masses. To be away from the parish for two weekends felt like an eternity. Too long for my taste. Happy to be home.

FEAST OF THE ASCENSION

LITURGY BYTES *by Michele Hall*



For us in our Diocese, this feast continues to be celebrated on a Thursday, thus the name Ascension Thursday. This year it occurs on May 14th. As Catholics, we know this feast commemorates Jesus' ascension into Heaven. Historically, it is celebrated 40 days after Easter and is considered a holy day of obligation.

The importance of this feast is to realize even though Jesus left the earth, He remains present to His Church. He sends the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles at Pentecost and naturally on us through Baptism and Confirmation.

We read in the Acts of the Apostles that Jesus was "taken up." It places an emphasis that it was an action of God. A mystery for sure, but also we see that the disciples were filled with joy because of His death and resurrection that enabled the gates of heaven to be opened. We are fortified by Jesus's promise: "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." Even though the disciples' faithfulness failed at times, God's faithfulness towards us never fails. This is why God is always communicating His presence with us in various ways to all cultures and in various circumstances.

Jesus commissions His disciples to baptize in His name, reminding them that He is always present through the Holy Spirit. The message is clear for us, His witnesses, to live in a way worthy of the call we have received.

Practice of Faith

(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2026")

"Do not let your hearts be troubled" (John 14:1). Jesus says this to us when we suffer worry and loss. Jesus gave us "the way" to navigate dark times. Jesus is The Way and He walks with us through prayer. He assures us He will do anything asked in His name. The Catechism states, "There is no other way of Christian prayer than Christ. Whether our prayer is communal or personal, vocal or interior, it has access to the Father only if we pray 'in the name' of Jesus. The sacred humanity of Jesus is therefore the way by which the Holy Spirit teaches us to pray to God our Father" (CCC, 2664). Practice the Jesus prayer this week:

At home, before the cross, tell Jesus of your worries. Lay them at the foot of His Cross. Ask Jesus to resurrect these burdens into hope and strength in His holy name.

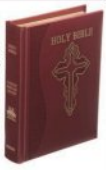

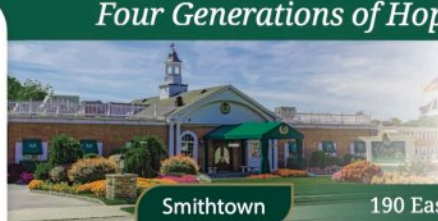
