



HERE AND NOW



Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

Although Easter is still two weeks away, in some ways we are beginning the final countdown to celebrating our most sacred days. Throughout the days of the Triduum, some of the music we will be using we have not used before. Much of this music comes from the Religious Education Congress in California that was attended by seventeen parishioners in February. We were introduced to some beautiful songs that will become a framework for our Holy Week and Easter celebrations. The title for today's article is the name of one of those songs. In fact, each title over the next three weeks is the name of a song that will be part of our most solemn celebrations. They provide insight that may help us understand the ways in which these great stories touch our lives.

One of the greatest challenges of the spiritual journey is to live in the present moment. It sounds like an incredibly simple thing to do, but in reality it can be an enormous challenge. Our minds tend to move in one of two directions. We may be looking ahead, planning, worrying about, calculating what needs to happen later today, tomorrow, or who knows how far down the road. A lot of time can be spent in trying to sort out what lies before us. If we are not in the future, we are in the past. How often do we replay past events of our lives? Sometimes we celebrate the joyful moments, sometimes we lament the painful times. Sometimes we imagine what life would have become if different decisions were made. A lot of time can be spent looking in the rearview mirror of our lives. The unfortunate aspect to living either in the future or in the past is that, while we are doing that, we miss the only opportunity we have to do anything that is in the present.

Whenever we hear about "God's Kingdom," we think of what awaits a person after death. While there is some truth to that, Jesus taught time and time again that God's Kingdom is also here and now. There are times when the love, compassion, and joy we share with one another become a brief encounter with that kingdom in our midst. That idea is embodied in one line from the song that touches me most profoundly, "a glimpse of heaven's joy here and now."

"Here and now" can become a simple mantra that grounds us to the present moment. It may awaken us to the people and events that are before us and allow us to see how the hand of God is at work.

Not every moment will have that power and depth of divine revelation, but those moments can be real. In the coming weeks we are called to allow the days of Holy Week and Easter to become moments of understanding the great mystery of God's love touching our lives. As we journey through each of the days, ask the question of what part of Jesus' story touches my heart here and now. As the stories are told here in our parish, how does this place become holy ground that we are blessed to share in? It does not matter where you have been. It does not matter where you are going. The moment of grace is the very moment that is before us. May we delight in that eternal revelation of God among us. May we live our lives believing God is at our sides offering us love to be received and shared.

SOMETHING DIFFERENT



LITURGY BYTES by Michele Hall



As we are moving through the season of Lent and keeping up with perhaps some personal changes in our lives, this week's reflection will focus on ways and opportunities to broaden our lives as Catholic Christians. This process has a formal name, that of Lifelong Formation. Since I see that our Religious Education ministry needs more Catechists for our young people, I thought a reflection on how to develop your faith life might also benefit those who serve in our parish program and maybe those who are thinking of joining.

Let's return to the term mentioned above: "lifelong formation." It is a process grounded in the Gospel which greatly assists us in following Jesus more closely and helps with our own spiritual growth and those events of our lives. These experiences, guided by the Holy Spirit and in communion with God and one another through the Church, help us to answer our baptismal call to live as missionary disciples through the seasons of our lives. Lifelong formation simply leads us to a deeper belonging in the life of the Church and in one's parish community. You might be asking, how do I participate?

Faith formation is intended for all people at different stages of their lives. By virtue of our Baptisms, we are called to live a mature faith. A great way to begin that journey is to volunteer as a Catechist for a small group of young people. Training and the Catechist's manual lay out lesson plans and background on each subject area. This experience, along with your own faith, can motivate you to want to know more.

We try here at the parish to offer programs to enhance significant parts of our faith, like The Chosen series, etc. Also, at times, we focus on the Sacraments and the Mass itself in this column. Please let us know other areas that might be helpful to you. Our Pastoral Team is here to be of assistance and guidance. Please pray about it as the final days of Lent are before us.

Have a prayerful, peaceful, and healthy week ahead!



For the Ride Home..... a Gospel Reflection for adults

Reach out to someone who recently experienced heartbreak. Invite them to coffee or dinner and offer a loving, listening ear.




