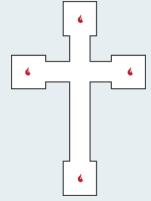

WASHING AWAY SINS AND OTHER GRIME

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael



You may have noticed in the bulletin that I am changing the times for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Currently, confessions are heard late on Saturday afternoons. That is the traditional time that most parishes offer the sacrament. The number of confessions has been steadily increasing, although they have lightened up a bit during the summer. But in the spring, there were several weeks when I ran overtime to try to accommodate everyone who was waiting. I am finding that on late Saturday afternoon, time is becoming more stressful, particularly if there is something special happening at the 5:00 Mass. Also, I used to have Fr. Frank to help me which gave me a little break and some flexibility.

Beginning in August, I am adding an additional time slot on Monday evenings from 6:00PM – 7:00PM. Confession on Saturday will be moved to 12:00 Noon – 1:00 PM. This is a time on Saturday that will not likely conflict with funerals or weddings. These times are in addition to Wednesday mornings after the 9:00AM Mass. I am also happy to schedule a different time by appointment. I'm hoping this new schedule will meet the needs of the parish as well as create a less hectic time for me to prepare for the 5:00PM Mass. We will try this for a few months and evaluate if changes need to be made.

On a completely different note, about two weeks ago I was at the home of a parishioner. While I was there someone knocked on the door. The homeowner asked if I would go see who it was. When I arrived at the door, there was someone offering to power wash the driveway. Normally, I don't like to deal with unannounced solicitors, but this one intrigued me. He identified himself as the owner of the company and he had two of his associates with him. He showed me his brand new power washer that was parked in the driveway. While the homeowner did not need the services, I thought of the patio area by my front door which was sorely in need of a good cleaning. So I asked if he could manage to get over there to give me an estimate. He agreed to come. By the way, I failed to mention the owner of the company and his employees are only ELEVEN years old! His power washer was in a plastic wagon that he was pulling from house to house. He explained that he took a loan from his father to purchase the equipment. I was honored to be one of his first customers.

His father drove him to my house, and I negotiated with the young man for a price for cleaning my patio. He and his two classmates got to work. I must admit, they did an admirable job. He did one part on the first day. I hired him again to do a second part the next week. I normally don't endorse a particular company in my writing. But I was impressed by the imagination and determination of this young man. It was good to see such ambition in such a young person. I am sure this is the first of many successful endeavors he will do in his life. 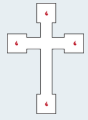

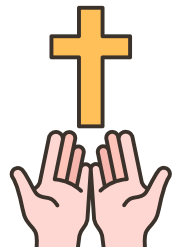

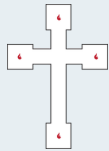

ADORATION, PART 2

LITURGY BYTES *by Michele Hall*



Picking up from last week's column regarding Adoration, I am reminded about one of my favorite Scripture readings from St. Luke's Gospel about the road to Emmaus. Those disciples on the road yearned for the company of Jesus with their words: "Stay with us, Lord!" Adoration gives us this opportunity to truly embrace that the Lord's presence remains with us in the Blessed Sacrament.

If you have never participated in Adoration during one of our holy hours, please know there are no rules for Adoration, but there are some traditional ways to help you engage in the hour. Here are some suggestions:

- Silence: primary focus, sit with God in quiet.
- Prayer: pray the Rosary or other known prayers; pray in your own words for family, or for people who have serious illnesses and need healing; or pray for peace in our world. If you have access to the Liturgy of the Hours, that works well during Adoration.
- Scripture: read some passages from the Bible; read the Psalms.
- Listening: instead of talking to the Lord, try listening to what He wants to tell you.

Jesus awaits us in this Sacrament of love. Let us meet Him in Adoration in addition to Mass. Make the time to join with our parish community at one of our Holy Hours and encounter Our Lord Jesus!

Have a prayerful, peaceful, and loving week ahead!



Practice of Hope

(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2026")

We are reminded today that whenever we feel we have failed in our Christian efforts, there is always hope for a better tomorrow. In Wisdom, we see a just and righteous God who judges with compassion; that same God, in Romans, knows our weaknesses too. So when Jesus talks about the end of the age, we know we still have a chance to strive toward righteousness. God does not wish to be separated from us, but looks upon us with leniency - what could be more hopeful than that?

Consider a time when your prayers were not expressed in words - as in the reading from Romans - but you felt consolation.

Knowing that our God judges us with compassion but wishes for us to do right, what are some ways you can look on others with the same just gaze?

Where can you extend the mercy we see God providing in these readings?

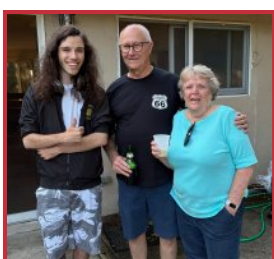

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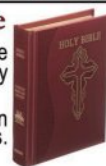
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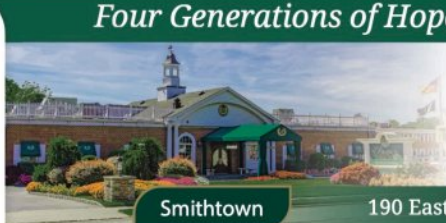
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
