

HAPPY BIRTHDAY HOLY CROSS

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

On January 21, 1988 Bishop McGann announced the formation of three new parishes in Suffolk County. They would eventually be named as Resurrection in Farmingville, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton in Lake Ronkonkoma, and of course, Holy Cross in Nesconset. Some of you who were sitting in St. Patrick's or St. Joseph's remember hearing that announcement. I wonder how much of an adventure you knew you would be in for as you were invited to be part of this holy undertaking. For those founding parishioners, it was an amazing experience of creating a new faith community. Extensive conversation and the lengthy process of sorting out many details of parish life led to what we now experience as a beautiful parish. I think I speak for all of us as we all feel blessed to be part of what we share in.

January 22 is the anniversary of the Supreme Court decision of Roe vs. Wade which opened doors to abortion being legalized. Recently, there has been progress made in impacting the availability of abortion, but it is still certainly part of life in our nation. On-going efforts are needed to address this in our legislation. The bigger issue that will always remain is the ability for people to identify, embrace and defend the gift of human life. We cannot limit ourselves to what the law of the land allows or prohibits, but as Christians, discern how the hand of God is at work in all things. The following is an excerpt from the opening prayer for Mass that day, "That we, whom you have made stewards of creation, may remain faithful to this sacred trust and constant in safeguarding the dignity of every human life."

I'm dealing with an unusual issue with my car. I have a 2017 Nissan Rogue. A few months ago, I was driving my car down the driveway and thought I heard a slight "sloshing" sound as if there was water somewhere in the car. But as soon as I made my first turn out of the driveway it went away. A long dry spell followed, and the sound was not heard. We then started getting heavy precipitation, and the sound increased dramatically. My car now sounds like I'm in rinse cycle in a washing machine whenever it rains. My mechanic said I needed to bring it to an auto body shop. They diagnosed there is some wicked leak in the firewall which funnels water into the right passenger footwell. It is not an easy fix. The body shop said it may become an insurance issue as a flood claim. I don't understand how that would work, but I'll keep you posted.

I'm looking forward to developing the "Pilgrims of Hope" theme in the coming year. I'm trying to organize a formal opening for this Jubilee Year for next weekend. If all goes well, there should be a special opening procession at Mass including some of our children and colorful banners. Focusing on hope is something that will benefit all of us as there is something in all our lives where we seek new life and God's presence.

PILGRIMS OF HOPE



LITURGY BYTES by Michele Hall



As you probably have noticed and heard, the Pope declared a Jubilee Year which began on December 24th, 2024, and will end on January 6, 2026. There will be many special events celebrating the Jubilee Year, special prayer opportunities, and processions.

I thought it might be helpful to us all to focus some attention on the above logo that is being used and the meaning behind it. First of all, the logo shows four figures representing all of humanity, coming from the four corners of the earth. You will see that they embrace each other indicating solidarity and fraternity which should unite all people. The figure at the front is holding onto the cross. It is not only the sign of faith which this lead figure is holding but also of hope, which can never be abandoned. This is so important because we are always in need of hope, especially in moments of great need. Next you see the rough waves under the figures, symbolizing the fact that life's pilgrimage does not always go smoothly in calm waters. How often the everyday circumstances of life and events in the wider world require a greater call to hope. Next, be sure to pay attention to the lower part of the cross which has been elongated and turned into the shape of an anchor which is let down into the waves. Some might be familiar with the anchor as a symbol of hope. Those with boats know the anchor is used to stabilize the vessel, especially during stormy weather. Another feature of the image is very important (I think) --- the pilgrim's journey should not be seen as just an individual undertaking but as a journey that is communal. Also, see the cross as something dynamic. It bends in the logo towards humanity, not leaving human beings alone, but stretching out to them to offer the certainty of its presence and the security of hope. Naturally, the bottom of the logo is the motto of the Jubilee Year: Pilgrims of Hope.


