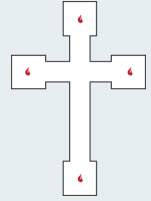

YOU ARE A PRIEST FOREVER

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael



"You are a priest forever in the line of Melchizedek." This quote comes from Psalm 110. It is often used when priesthood is the topic of discussion. Last Saturday I attended the Ordination to priesthood in Rockville Centre. Three men were ordained for our Diocese: Fr. Patrick O'Brien, Fr. Dillon Vita, and Fr. Nicholas Waldron. I met Fr. Waldron on several occasions when he was a seminarian. He is a good and holy man. He's joyful and fun. He is down to earth and filled with compassion. I wanted to be at his ordination. It was a blessing on many levels.

I have been to St. Agnes Cathedral countless times since my ordination. But there was something about entering it on this day of ordination that brought back a wave of memories. The Cathedral has since been renovated, but nonetheless I was aware that this is where my priestly ministry had its formal beginning. At the time, part of the ritual was for the candidate to be seated with his family in the congregation. A representative from the Seminary then testified to our readiness. When our individual names were called we each stood and said "I am ready and willing." I remember kneeling before Bishop McGann and pledging my respect and obedience to him and his successors. I remember my hands being anointed with the fragrant Sacred Chrism (oil). One of the most profound moments is when all the candidates lay on the floor of the Cathedral. The Litany of Saints is sung calling upon their prayers to fall upon those to be ordained. Finally, there is the moment when hands of the Bishop, and in turn all the priests who are present are laid on the head of the one to be ordained. It is a beautiful ritual. It is a powerful Mass. I was glad to be there for those being ordained. I was glad to have been reminded of a rich gift of my life.

A newly ordained priest embodies passion and enthusiasm. This would be true of anyone about to begin an endeavor for which they have trained for years. You could sense the desire to serve in the three men who were ordained. There is something infectious about that energy. As I drove home from Rockville Centre, I was aware of feeling renewed and excited about my own ministry. Being there for that happy occasion brought about a wave of joy as I ministered last weekend here at Holy Cross. Grace builds upon grace.

There can be an amazing dynamic that unfolds between a priest and the community in which he serves. Relationships emerge and grow. For the priest, it is far more than the place he works. For the community, it is far more than the guy who is there week after week. There is a tapestry of lives that is formed. There is something good and beautiful about that. But there is also something hard. Sooner or later the priest moves on. Our neighboring parish of St. Patrick's is experiencing this right now. Fr. Louis Cona was assigned there only a few years. But in that time, he won the hearts of many parishioners with his enthusiasm and spirituality. News of his unexpected transfer was hard for many in the parish. In all likelihood, you and I will be crossing that same bridge next June. Ultimately, it is all good. Faith abounds and comes to life in community.

This one moment of ordination was a moment of grace for the men ordained, for the Church on Long Island, and for me in being reminded how blessed my life has been. May we continue to share that gift of faith and allow the Spirit to renew us in our love for God and our desire to serve him with our lives. Pray for vocations.

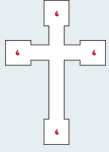

BAPTISM & BEYOND



LITURGY BYTES *by Michele Hall*



Recently, there has been some very positive information in the news regarding the number of new Catholics that have come into the Church this past Easter. For us locally here at Holy Cross, we had eight wonderful souls who joined us at the Easter Vigil back in early April. Perhaps, were you present and witnessed this most inspiring and joy-filled moment?

Most of us were probably baptized as infants and received Eucharist and Confirmation at various times during our youth. There is something very different when an adult is baptized. First of all, they make that decision through days or even years of desiring a relationship with God and His Church. They spend time learning about our Faith, participating as much as possible at Mass, feeling a part of a new community as their special day draws closer and closer.

The after time for the newly baptized is a time for reflection and deepening of the Paschal Mystery and how they will make it part of their lives by pondering the Gospel, sharing in the Eucharist, and doing works of charity in different ways in their new parish.

Those of us baptized as infants are encouraged to move beyond viewing baptism as a one-time formality. We are called to embrace it (Baptism) as a daily reality that marks us as belonging to Christ. Here are a few key aspects to help us embrace our Baptisms: Baptism is a constant source of grace throughout our lives; we are called to remember our Baptisms by renewing our baptismal promises a few times during the Easter season; Baptism also transforms us to see our role in the mission of the Church calling us to live out the Gospel in our daily lives; Baptism made us members of a community, showing us that faith is not meant to be lived alone.

So, taking up Pope Francis' call a few years ago, he reminded us of the following: "As Catholics we should discover the date of our Baptism and celebrate it. Embracing this sacrament will help us live out our vocation to holiness engaging with the whole world through faith and charity."

Practice of Charity

(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2026")

Today's Gospel can be challenging for us. Nevertheless, it is clear that if we are to live a life of faithfulness and discipleship, there will be a price, and not an easy one to pay.

But don't tell your parents or children to get lost! Rather, reorient priorities and purpose: when we are committed to new life in Christ, as in Paul's letter to the Romans, everything becomes different about how we live today. This includes the love we have for family, friends, and community.

Consider those whom you love and "put first" - what are some ways that you can center that care in Christ's love? Ask the Holy Spirit to inspire you.

When committing to acts of charity, reflect on how you can channel the love you have for those nearest you into love of neighbor. Perhaps your family has felt the impact of a particular experience or illness that can inspire your service and giving.
