



HE HAS ANOINTED ME



Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

In this week's gospel, Jesus goes into the temple, picks up the sacred scrolls and begins reading a passage from the prophet Isaiah. He proclaims, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me, to bring glad tidings to the poor." After he reads this passage, he lowers the scrolls and boldly proclaims, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." It had to take tremendous courage for Jesus to do this. This was at the beginning of his public ministry. I'm sure there were some who were shocked and even scandalized by what he said. The Spirit was at work, and it was time for Jesus to move forward to do the work his father called him to.

This is a moment in scripture that might hit closer to home for many of us than it first seems. Do you remember the first time in your life you had a sense of what God was calling you to do? I do. I was in 7th grade sitting at Mass with my mother. I was listening to the priest's homily, thinking to myself, "This is pretty boring." I remember thinking there was something wrong about being bored. These are great stories, they are timeless, they reveal God's glory, they define the path we are called to walk. Stories like that should be spoken about with passion and insight. I thought to myself, "Maybe this is what I am supposed to do with my life." It was both affirming and frightening. Thus began my discernment of priesthood.

I am in the midst of visiting our Level 7 Religious Ed classes. During my visits, I am asking the students if they know to what God may be calling them. Here are a few of their responses:

- I think God is calling me to do something in the medical field.
- I want to be a cheerleader.
- I love to read. I want to be a librarian or Special Ed teacher who pulls kids from class and helps them to read.

I then ask if they know and appreciate the gifts God has given to them. Here is what some said:

- I am a good speaker and leader.
- · I have great athletic ability.
- · I have a great family.

The Spirit touched Jesus at the appropriate time to begin his ministry. The same Spirit is at work in the hearts of all of us at different times and in different ways. This year we embrace the idea of "Pilgrims of Hope" as our theme in union with the entire Church. We keep moving forward confident that God journeys with us and empowers us to do his work. We need to be open to discern what God is asking of us. It may take patience and practice to understand all we have been called to do.

Practice of Faith

(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2025")



The first reading from Nehemiah recounts the remarkable day of five hundred years before the birth of Christ when Ezra read the book of the law (the Torah) to all of Jerusalem. The people, having just returned from their long exile, wept with gratitude as the Word of God washed over them.

Deepen your appreciation for the Word of God by exchanging insights with others in regular Bible study. This resource is a great start. Another resource to explore is the popular podcast "The Bible in a Year" with Fr. Mike Schmitz (ascension press.com/bibleinayear).

The passage Jesus read from the prophet Isaiah in his home synagogue is sometimes described as his mission statement. Prayerfully reflect on the words Jesus proclaimed from the scroll and consider how he fulfilled them.

The Church celebrates the Memorial of St. John Bosco this week on January 31. In the spirit of John Bosco, patron saint of children, make a gift or offer to assist a local agency dedicated to the care of underserved children.




