



WHAT MAKES A CHURCH A CHURCH?



Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

As was the case last weekend, the regular Mass of Ordinary Time is displaced by another feast day. It is the Dedication of the Basilica of St. John Lateran in Rome. This may seem like an unusual feast day, but it is the focus for our prayer today. This is the oldest church in Rome, dating back to the fourth century. It is the official church of the Bishop of Rome, that is, the Pope. Most folks would think that distinction goes to St. Peter's Basilica, but that was not completed until the early 1600s. This basilica is the symbolic seat of the universal Catholic Church.

Today's celebration raises different aspects of how we understand and experience church. The dedication of this sacred place which is half a world away may not immediately make a connection to our faith experience. But it does serve as a reminder that Holy Cross is not an independent entity. We are part of a much larger church. We are connected to the history, traditions and practices of this vast institution. We embrace many people and cultures throughout the world sharing the same foundation of faith.

Of course, the architecture of a church structure does not define a community, but it can play a significant role. Holy Cross has a unique architectural style as well as the way it is decorated. The influence of nature and the abundance of natural light create a defining atmosphere. I, along with many of you, have always found this space to be inspiring and filled with beauty. If I had to pick the most beautiful church I have ever visited, I would choose Christ Cathedral in Garden Grove, CA. It shares many of the characteristics of Holy Cross: vast lofty ceilings, natural light, and surrounded by the beauty of nature.

Architecture and design are important, but today's scripture readings remind us of what truly lies at the heart of a church. It is the presence of Christ embraced by the faithful who gather. The first reading from Ezekiel speaks beautifully of how the temple is the source of the flowing waters of life. Of course, we understand that image in relation to our own baptism. It was a small amount of water that symbolically began the amazing journey of faith that each of us walks. Ezekiel describes the waters as flowing beyond the temple walls to create rivers that nurture and sustain countless communities. The power of our baptism is meant to empower us to go beyond the walls of this church and to be witnesses of Christ's love in our world.

Paul outright says we are "God's building." If the presence of God cannot dwell in our hearts, then it will never be found in any brick or mortar structure. There are many who are here because of the spirit of welcome embodied in the hearts of so many parishioners. Our foundation is the love of Christ. That presence is experienced in one another. The ways in which it can be built upon are limitless. As it takes time for a building to be constructed so, too, does our faith grow individually and as a community.

The gospel reminds us that Christ, by his life, became the living temple. The power and truth of the Paschal Mystery surpass any physical structure. It's not a matter of rebuilding the temple in Jerusalem which was destroyed. It is allowing the dying and rising of Christ to be the living temple that defines and transforms us.

On this day, let us be filled with gratitude for the beautiful worship space we enjoy. Beyond the beauty of the glass walls are the spirit and life of those who worship here. We are a community that strives to embody the spirit of Christ. Finally, we remind ourselves we are rooted in that great mystery of the cross; it is Christ alone who brings us life. Be it a distant church in Rome or a glass church on a hill, the presence of Christ touches our hearts and brings us life.

Next weekend, November 15th and 16th, will be the first weekend of our Outreach Parish Christmas Program

We are once again requesting gift cards from local stores (i.e., Target, Wal-Mart) to enable our Outreach families to purchase for themselves and their children the items they need.

As you may know, we have also helped the following agencies for the last several years and will continue to do so this Christmas:

Olsen's Rest Home is a neighborhood facility for frail elderly on Gibbs Pond Road. Residents of the home have always been considered members of our parish community. Holy Cross ministers to our friends at Olsen's in a variety of ways during the year.

Mercy Haven is a provider of housing and other services for persons who are elderly, those living with mental illness, those families who are on limited income and those with special needs.

Pronto is a human service agency located in Brentwood helping people in need with food, clothing, and other necessities. They assist approximately 500 families for the holidays each year.

Talbot House Chemical Dependency Crisis Center is a 24-hour voluntary chemical dependence crisis center licensed by the New York State Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services to provide short-term medically monitored inpatient withdrawal services to adult men and women who are in crisis. This facility provides nourishing meals, counseling, limited transportation, support groups, and referrals.

The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

Feast Day November 9

Christians first met in homes to hear Jesus' teachings and to celebrate the Eucharist. When the Christians were no longer persecuted for their faith, they built beautiful churches.

Sometime before the fourth century, a palace owned by a noble Roman family named Laterani had been built. It became the property of the Emperor Constantine. Constantine had recognized Christianity as the religion of the empire, and he donated to the Church the palace and other buildings on the site. This became Rome's oldest church. It was given the title Basilica of the Savior, but later was dedicated to John the Baptist and called St. John Lateran.

St. John Lateran was the home of the popes—the center of the Catholic world for many years. Twenty-eight popes are buried there. Although our pope now lives at the Vatican and presides at St. Peter's basilica, St. John Lateran is considered his cathedral as the bishop of Rome. The dedication of this basilica is a happy occasion for the Church because it reminds us of our beginnings, our unity. It stands as a monument to God and all that God does through the Church.




