



## THE SONG OF NATURE



Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

I'm tired of dealing with my injured foot, and you are probably tired of hearing me complain about it. Finally, I am on the mend. Part of that road to recovery is a regimen of prednisone. The doctor warned me that it could cause sleeplessness or make me jumpy. I am writing this article at 2:00 AM. I fell asleep at my usual time and slept for the better part of an hour. I then bolted out of bed with unbounded energy. After I am finished with this article, I think I will plan a parade and then perhaps compose an opera.

On the other end of the spectrum, the last few days I have found myself just sitting outside and listening. There really is a diverse and amazing symphony of delightful sounds if we take the time to stop and listen. The evening seems to be the time for insects to lift their voices. When we discern their individual sounds, there really is an array of assorted little winged guys that need to sing out unceasingly. As the night wears on the insects start to fade out. Then, well before sunrise our feathered friends come to life. The birds love their early morning concerts. Occasionally, I will hear the rustle of leaves in the woods as a squirrel or even a deer moves along. Interspersed through all of this, the wind will make its presence known. It sounds like it all could be an annoying and noisy din, but in fact it is all quite gentle and peaceful.

Interestingly, humanity has come up with a way to duplicate this sound. You don't have to look far to find an app or a device that creates sounds that replicate what Mother Nature herself provides. They are advertised as an effective way to help bring about relaxation or lull you into a good night's sleep. We have found a way to bottle-up and, in some instances, market what is readily available if you just open your window. I understand that the sounds of the ocean may not be readily available unless you live by the shore, and certainly the sound of a passing plane or fire engine can become a distraction. But the real thing is the best; give it a try.

What naturally happens when we allow the sounds of nature to surround us is it creates a blank canvas for God's artistic hand to touch our hearts. It was once said that God's first language is silence. There may not be any profound messages offered, but there is a clear reminder that God is real and God is present. If I did not need to be hobbling around with a cane these past few weeks, I probably would have been running around doing stuff. Sometimes God needs to slow us down if we don't do it on our own. Part of this journey was to be reminded that simply opening my ears can lead to beautiful moments of peace and joy.

Now that this article is finished, I think I still have enough energy to go and wallpaper my dining room.



## Eucharistic Prayer-Part 6



In this part, we celebrate the memorial and become the offering. This remembering is a bit different because in other parts of this prayer we have already remembered Jesus' redemption. With Jesus' Body and Blood present among us, we remember what Christ did because now we are dedicating ourselves to making the very same offering. The whole Church is to make this offering in light of Christ. The Church on earth has a vocation. The Church is to become a Eucharistic offering for the world. Actually, at every Mass it is the Church herself who is offered in the Eucharist. This is not anything new because it goes back to the words of St. Augustine to the Church in Hippo. Briefly, he spoke to his people saying: "So if you want to understand the body of Christ, listen to the apostle telling the faithful, 'You are the body of Christ and its members'" (1 Corinthians 12:27).

Our deepest identity as the Church is not a gathering of like-minded, friendly folks who happen to enjoy the same things. Rather, the Church is Christ's Body given to the world. We remember this offering, and in the act of remembering, we become this offering again. We become God's self-sacrificial love for the world.

Keep in mind, it is not we who are doing this work but the Holy Spirit. It is important to note that the Spirit cannot work unless we give some part of ourselves over to the Spirit. This means we have to love one another and love the world. It is through the Spirit that we can accomplish this and through the Church where we experience this special love. At Mass, we receive total love and as a Church move out from the Eucharistic love of God.





