



# **OFF TO THE RHINE**

This Tuesday I will be leaving for what I hope will be an epic vacation adventure. I will be traveling with my two sisters and their husbands. This kind of trip did not interest my brother. We will be flying to Amsterdam where we will have a day and a half on our own before we begin a seven-night cruise on the Rhine River. Along the way our stops will include Dusseldorf, Cologne, Strasbourg and a few other charming little ports. The cruise will end in Basel, Switzerland. From there we will take a two-hour train ride to Zurich. After a one-night stay, we will be flying back to New York. All of the ports include a narrated walking tour. There is also an option for a shore excursion via bike. If I am up for it, I will try one or two of those. There is a wine tasting or two along the way; I'm sure I will be up for that.


I'm looking forward to spending time together as we explore places that none of us has been to before. In 2018, I went on a similar cruise on the Danube River from Budapest to Prague with one of my sisters. That trip was absolutely idyllic. I'm hoping for another rich experience. This type of tour is geared to a certain demographic. I doubt there will be any children on the boat. It is definitely a low-key and laid-back kind of experience. There is no casino or rock-climbing wall. The evening entertainment is usually something like a string quartet or a pianist. About 9:30, the entertainment wraps up and everyone heads off to bed. At this point in my life, that is a lovely routine.

Being the transportation "geek" that I am, there are a few parts of this adventure I am looking forward to. I will be taking the LIRR and the AirTrain to JFK to avoid the major road construction delays they are experiencing. I have never flown on a 787 Dreamliner, and that will be our plane to Amsterdam with KLM. From the airport, we will take a \$5 train ride to our hotel. At the end of the cruise, there will be a longer train ride to Zurich. I always love a good train ride. The Swiss are known for their efficient and ever-punctual public transportation. Our return trip is on a Delta A330. I think I have most of the odds and ends under control. I enrolled for Global Entry, and hopefully that will expedite the entry process back into the United States. I have my Euros and Swiss Francs (which look like funny money). I bought an electrical converter so I will not blow up any of my electrical devices.

This trip will be a great blessing. I am so fortunate to be able to make an adventure like this and to share it with my family. There will, however, be a sadness when I get back as the summer will just about be approaching the finish line. But we take the opportunities when they come along and keep moving forward.

**Practice of Faith** (Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2024")

# Eucharistic Prayer - Part 7



The final two areas of the Eucharistic Prayer that we will look at have to do with intercessions for both the living and the dead and the final prayer or doxology that is chanted by the priest. In the intercession part, we pray that the Church might become the communion of love that we hope for. Familiar I am sure to most, we pray for the Holy Father, the Bishops and other clergy. We also pray that the Church on earth might become what she is supposed to be – a union of love, of peace, and of unity that renews the human race.

It is important to many of us to pray for our beloved dead. The communion of love that we share with the dead and with the saints, crosses the boundaries of time and space. No one is forgotten! We remember them to God, for they are still part of us. We can build a community of love in concrete ways as most of us do through offering individual prayers for family and friends or offering a Mass for the needs of a coworker or someone ill. These are real acts of love which help bring unity to all the world, the unity that Christ intended for the human family. We could say that it is the vocation of the Church in the world to bring this unity to all God's people.

At the conclusion of the Eucharistic prayer, the Church prays the doxology: "Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, for ever and ever." We respond: Amen. This doxology shows us that the unity that we want to build among the family is actually the unity of God: God the Father, who is the source of all love; God the Son, who is love made flesh, dwelling among us, teaching us to offer this same act of love back to the Father as children of God; God the Spirit, who is the very possibility of this return gift of love, the God who woos us in the interior of our hearts to love God anew.

I hope in these past six weeks you have experienced a better understanding of this beautiful prayer. I pray it helps us all to pray it better and understand its meaning!
