





TOURIST FOR A DAY

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael



This is the last of the bulletin articles that had to be written weeks in advance. My own vacation travels and some early bulletin deadlines required early submissions. I will be happy when we are back on track with one article per week.

Back in mid-August, I spent the day with two former colleagues from when I worked at the high school. We spent a day in the city. The highlights of our adventure began with a trip on the LIRR into Grand Central Station. That is a grand old station, filled with character and history, and a fun place to explore. From there we took the subway over to the West Side to begin our trek down the High Line. That is a neat walk that raises you over the busyness of the street below and allows for a relaxing stroll. Unfortunately, it turned into a hotter day than we anticipated, and the heat took away some of the peacefulness of the walk. Once that was complete, we took a rest stop at Little Island Park. This is a relatively new park built at Pier 54 (where the survivors of the Titanic arrived). It is supported in the midst of the Hudson River by a series of decorative concrete piers and was a nice place for a break. From there we walked to the subway and headed to Battery Park.

The highlight of our day was a ride on the Staten Island Ferry. This was the first time I ever did that. Being on the open deck of the boat made the heat of the day melt away in the cool air of the harbor along with a welcomed breeze. You get some beautiful views of the Statue of Liberty. It is always neat to see that landmark, but it was also enjoyable watching those for whom this was their first up-close encounter with Lady Liberty. I don't know from what corner of the country or even what distant countries they came from, but they were clearly delighted as we passed by. This beautiful excursion was free, as they do not charge for passage on the ferry. I think there were as many tourists doing what we were doing as there were commuters.

Another subway ride brought us into Brooklyn to begin our trek across the Brooklyn Bridge. I had done this a few times before, but it is always an exciting walk. The perspective you gain is a unique one. From there we worked our way over to Little Italy and had a delightful meal sitting outside watching life go by. By then the temperatures cooled, and it was a very pleasant evening. Soon we were exhausted, and it was time to head home.

In the course of the day, we took five different subways. Four of them had icy cold air conditioning and one of them was a rolling sweat box. My two traveling companions were a bit freaked out by the remarkably long escalators at Grand Central. By the end of the day we tipped the scale with just over 20,000 steps. Aside from the trains and dinner, everything we did was free. It was fun being a tourist in our own backyard.

Practice of Charity (Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2024")







The Psalms - Part 2



The Book of Psalms is a collection of 150 prayers from different periods of Israel's life. While the final collection is connected in a special way with the figure of King David, Moses and Solomon are credited with writing a few, too.

Two important features of the Psalms deserve special notice. First, the majority were composed, originally, precisely for liturgical worship. This is shown by the frequent indication of liturgical leaders interacting with the community (e.g., Ps 118:1-4). Secondly, they follow certain distinct patterns or literary forms. Thus, we have hymns/poems of praise, lamentations, thanksgiving, and wisdom.


It is obvious that not all of the Psalms can be pigeon-holed into neat classifications, but even a brief sketch of these types helps us to catch the structure and spirit of the Psalms we read. It has been rightly said that the Psalms are "a school of prayer." They not only provide us with models to follow but inspire us to voice our own deepest feelings and aspirations.

The prayer of the Psalms takes our human life, in all its dimensions, very seriously. They are full of "heart" and full of feeling. Nothing in our experience is foreign to our prayer. It is there in the everyday interactions of our lives, in our deeply felt blessings and joys, and our deeply suffered pains and hurts that we respond to our God, the source and root of all life. The Psalms are truly prayers from the heart, from the heart of our lives.

At Mass each week, we have the opportunity to sing the Psalm led by the Cantor. With the singing of the Responsorial Psalm at Mass, the rhythm of the liturgy changes and the assembly is called to an even more active role. The singing of the Responsorial Psalm refrain takes us more deeply into the words. Singing also unites us as one group. Together we follow the melody and together we breathe. Together we give voice to the theological theme expressed in the Psalm refrain that highlights either the first reading or the Gospel. So, the next time at weekend Mass, make it part of your prayer, and sing along with others at the time of the Responsorial Psalm.



Successful School Supply Drive!

A special thank you to all the volunteers who helped sort, organize and distribute all the school supplies to our Outreach families. We could not have done this without you!




Dress A Girl, Bless A Girl

For Volunteers in the Diocese of Rockville Centre

A person wishing to volunteer in any parish or organization in the Diocese of Rockville Centre must first complete three requirements:

1. Attend Protecting God's Children (Virtus)
2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
3. Complete a Background Screening application.

(Background screening is conducted on all volunteers and employees every 5 years.)

Directions to Complete the 3 Requirements:

1. Sign up to attend a Protecting God's Children session: **www.Virtus.org**
When you log on to the Virtus website, you will create a Virtus account.
 - a. If you have not already attended Virtus, you are a first-time registrant.
 - b. The first screen will ask the name of your organization - from the drop-down list, select Rockville Centre-Safe Environment.
 - c. Follow all directions on the next screens.
 - d. One screen will have the Codes of Conduct. Please acknowledge the Codes of Conduct.
 - e. Continue with the registration process and select the class you will attend.
 - f. After selecting the class, you will be instructed to complete the Background Screening application.
2. Background Screening Application:
 - a. Sterling Volunteers is the company providing background screening.
 - b. Follow all the directions to complete the background screening application. **DO NOT STOP ONCE YOU BEGIN THE APPLICATION!** If you stop, you are locked out of the process due to security procedures.
 - c. You will need to provide your Social Security number; if you do not provide a Social Security number, you will be charged a fee.
 - d. After completing the application, hit the "Submit" button.


