

#### WHAT I WANTED VS. WHAT GOD OFFERED



#### Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

If you asked me a week and a half ago how I envisioned life unfolding in the coming days, I would have given you a list that looked something like this: enjoy the summertime weather, continue to work through my list of outdoor projects, watch all the busyness and excitement of Vacation Bible School, embrace a busy weekend in the parish including celebrating all the Masses, offer a special "thank you" and blessing for Tricia Clarke as she concluded her time with us as Director of Religious Education, and enjoy a Sunday afternoon BBQ and baseball game with the LI Ducks. In reality, what I dealt with was a minor foot injury that seemed to get worse each day, an unwelcome bout with Covid, scrambling to get Mass coverage for a funeral and the weekend Masses, and hobbling around my house wishing I was working outside in the garden. Instead, I was sitting inside thinking of all the parish activities I was missing. I was frustrated, disappointed, angry and felt sorry for myself.

Then in the midst of my pity party, God stepped in and took over. First, he prompted me to start looking through one of the many boxes of "stuff" I have in my house. I tend to save everything. I have all kinds of cards, letters, and other mementos from all of the places I served as a priest, from each step of my academic life, and going back to my childhood. One box led to the next, hour after hour I was looking at all these tokens of my life. There were kind notes people wrote in gratitude for something I was able to offer them through my priestly ministry, there were reminders of many good people who were part of my journey, and there were lots of memories that were awakened. It ended up being a prayerful, reflective, affirming few days. Left to my own druthers, this would not have been my chosen weekend activity. But allowing God to offer a life-giving gift was much richer than my own agenda.

In the midst of my trip down Memory Lane, I turned on the TV for another unexpected blessing. I had forgotten this was the concluding weekend for the National Eucharistic Congress. There was an enormous national celebration in Indianapolis. I did not know the events would be televised on EWTN. Had I known this, I would have encouraged you to watch the festivities. What a prayerful, uplifting, and inspiring event it was. The music, the speakers, the energy of the crowd were all engaging. It was an affirmation in our belief that our faith and the power of the Eucharist has the ability to change our individual lives, our nation, and our world. It was a Spirit filled event which even came through on TV.

I had my plans. Then God came along with a one-two punch of affirmation, hope and life when I did not expect it. Our God is full of wondrous surprises.

#### **Practice of Charity** (Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2024")

In the Second Book of Kings, Elisha feeds a hundred people with just twenty barley loaves; in the Gospel, Jesus feeds five thousand with five barley loaves and two fish. Both stories tell us that there are leftovers from the abundance of food. This physical nourishment is paired with need for spiritual nourishment: Elisha's servant and Philip and Andrew all doubt that the Lord will provide and answer all their needs.

In your prayer today, reflect on when you have doubted how the Lord "[satisfies] the desire of every living thing" (Psalm 145:16). Ask the Lord to help you see how God has provided in abundance.

Learn about the seven corporal works of mercy: go to the US Conference of Catholic Bishops' website, usccb.org, and search for "corporal works of mercy."

Focus on one corporal work of mercy. How can you give of yourself and work with God to feed others?






The tag ensures that the correct items are going to the right student. Please place your donation in a paper or plastic bag with the tag and place on the School Supplies for Success table in the Atrium.

## Do This in Memory of Me



Have you ever wondered what Jesus gave in offering to us His Body and Blood? Simply put on the cross, Christ saw love through to the end. Keep in mind that the institution narrative of the Eucharist does not just recall the Last Supper. We are invited to eat and drink the Eucharist, to die to ourselves and to rise into the life of God. This is the order of love that Jesus instituted.

Jesus becomes present to us in his Body and his Blood because the words he spoke at the Last Supper promised that he would. These words promised that he would give the entirety of himself to us. He is totally present because Jesus Christ, if he is going to give himself to us, is going to give everything.

The transformation of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is known as "transubstantiation." The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains that under the consecrated species of bread and wine Christ himself, living and glorious, is present in a true and real manner – soul and divinity. Transubstantiation declares that Jesus is really and truly sacramentally present in the Eucharist. There is not half bread and part God, nor partial wine and part of Jesus. Bread and wine cease functioning anymore as bread and wine. Their physical character remains, but what they are is really Christ's Body and Blood, soul and divinity. It is Jesus dwelling among us.

At every Mass, we are called to see Christ present among us in his Body and Blood. We cannot see it as if we are conducting a scientific experiment. We see with the eyes of faith. In the Eucharist we practice the art of seeing – seeing beyond what is simply before us and behold the presence of the risen Lord dwelling among us. In fact, this practice of seeing with faith is necessary for the entire Christian life. Transubstantiation is not about magic. It is about a way of seeing. Pray about that as we receive the Eucharist next time.
