

# **PRAYING UP A STORM**

I am away this week on my annual retreat. I am at a Jesuit Retreat House outside of Dallas, Texas. I have been there before, and it has always been a prayerful experience. If possible, I enjoy including a little travel with my retreat time. Something about a flight or road trip opens my heart. I do hold the people of Holy Cross deeply in my prayers. Please do the same for me.

This time away could be viewed as just a vacation or running away from work for a week. Even though a retreat removes you from your usual routine, it can actually make you feel more connected to the people and events that are part of your life. Retreats can take different formats. This will be a "preached retreat" with several daily talks on Ignatian spirituality. There is also an opportunity to meet briefly with a spiritual director. The two components come together to create a space where there is a deep awareness to God, but also to the people who are part of my life.

I once went on retreat to the Weston Priory in Vermont. The monks there spend their time committed to prayer and sharing in the chores of a simple communal life. In some ways they are very much removed from the world. But ironically, even though they rarely come down from their mountain monastery, their prayer reflected a deep connection to the suffering and current events throughout the world. I felt more in tune with what was happening in this remote place than when I was home watching the news and immersing myself in the stuff of life. True prayer has a remarkable way of connecting us to God and one another. When we are able to share in that gift, life is grounded and there is a deep sense of union with all that surrounds us. I am grateful for the privilege of being able to spend the days away from the parish. I pray that they will deepen my ability to bring to life the spirit here at Holy Cross.

There is still room for something silly. I did have one minor Christmas "crisis" that I will share with you. Since I was a child, our family has made the same traditional Christmas dessert. It is made with plain, thin chocolate wafers, crushed pineapple, and fresh whipped cream. The three ingredients are spread in multiple layers on top of each other. It is a simple dish, but quite tasty. Unbeknownst to me, the Nestle company stopped making the thin chocolate wafers last spring. There were none to be found except on the internet, and they were selling the last packages for \$50 each. So I pondered for a way to substitute the missing ingredient. I thought about getting Oreo cookies and scraping out the cream. Someone suggested using Oreo Thins. So with fingers crossed, I made our traditional dessert a new way. I was surprised and happy that the taste was virtually the same. Life is full of surprises, big and small.

From the holy to the ridiculous, have a blessed week.

# **LITURGY BYTES**

### **Back to Ordinary Time**



It is back to green in our Worship Area. This shortened season is known as Winter Ordinary Time. This year it lasts for five weeks with Lent beginning on Ash Wednesday, February 14<sup>th</sup>. Having said that, I am sure you realize that Easter will be early, too – March 31<sup>st</sup>!

As we see the beautiful pieces of the Christmas just celebrated being removed, the simplicity of this next season is upon us. There are many different shades of green used by churches during this time. We are captured by listening to the unfolding story of the Paschal mystery in the Readings expressed through the public ministry of Jesus.

So, as we recuperate from an active holiday season, let us take time to reflect on the most important gift any of us have received, and begin to focus on this special gift and the importance of receiving it regularly. How do we encourage those around us who keep missing this moment each week? Last June, the Pope issued an encyclical filled with many words stressing the importance of the liturgy, particularly the Mass. He opened with these words: "I simply want to invite the whole Church to rediscover, to safeguard and to live the truth and power of the Christian celebration. The liturgy is the first source of divine communion in which God shares his own life with us."

How do you feel when you hear those words about the Mass and God sharing his own life with us? It certainly opens our hearts and minds to how special the Eucharist is for all of us. We know it because we are present each week at Mass. What about those who are missing at the Lord's table? How can each of us work to bring someone back to Mass? Let us pray about this and begin our plan of action.


