BACK TO ORDINARY TIME

Aside from a few white poinsettias, all remnants of Christmas have been tucked away for another year. Normally when I take down the Christmas decorations at my home it is a dreaded task that I dutifully work my way through. For some reason, this year it was actually a peaceful and even nostalgic experience. Some of the ornaments on the tree go back to my childhood. My creche is older than I am. Some of my decorations were more recent gifts from friends. While I like the house to look festive, it is more than just decorations. There can be stories told and rich memories when we take the time to remember what we have received.

I have shared with you in the past that I try not to open any of my Christmas cards during the Advent season. I begin opening them on Christmas day. It usually takes a couple of days for me to slowly work my way through the pile. Then, at the end of the Christmas season, I read the cards again with a deep sense of appreciation of all the people who have woven their way into my life. The "stuff of Christmas" can be a beautiful reminder of the blessings we have received.

Ordinary time continues all the way through to Ash Wednesday on March 2, when we begin the season of Lent. The Sunday readings rotate on a three-year cycle. This year we hear the Gospel stories mostly from Luke (with the exception of this Sunday). Luke's gospel was written probably about 20 years after Mark's gospel. His intent was not simply to repeat what was already reported, but rather interpret in light of the ever expanding church community through the Roman empire.

In this bulletin I have a little survey regarding some possible upcoming trips offered to the parish. It certainly has gotten more complicated trying to plan trips. And it has gotten more complicated trying to figure out IF individuals even want to travel. There are so many added concerns these days that leave many of us scratching our heads. As always, I welcome the opportunity to travel with parishioners, but it may not be that time yet.

Every so often I offer this gratuitous public service announcement. Make sure your home has a visible house number that can be read from the street. I am surprised how often when making home visits I have to guess at which house is which because there are no house numbers. For me, it is a minor inconvenience to sort out where I am going. However, in an emergency it could make an enormous difference in getting help in a timely way. Sometimes it is the most simple of things that can make a critical impact. Sadly, we were reminded of this in the reports of the tragic apartment fire in the Bronx. Something as simple as a closed door may have saved lives. Attention to simple details may save enormous heartache.





Here's an Update

For the month of December, Outreach assisted 44 families which consisted of 13 children, 54 Adults and 9 Seniors. We provided 113 services to the community. (This does not include our Christmas Project.)
