GOD SAW HOW GOOD IT WAS

This is a repeating phrase that is found throughout the story of creation from the book of Genesis. The story says that God delighted in each and every aspect of creation, culminating in the creation of man and woman. This is an appropriate starting point to focus on the gift and beauty of human life.

This weekend is a difficult anniversary for our nation. It was on Jan. 22, 1973 that the Supreme Court made a decision which ultimately made abortion readily and widely available. From our perspective, this decision was a horrific one as it stands against the most basic right to human life. Sadly, not everyone shares this perspective. In addition, for our nation this became a divisive issue that continues to polarize politics and individuals.

While abortion is certainly at the forefront of right to life issues, we need to remind ourselves it is not the only issue. When we look at the question of what is involved in respecting the gift and dignity of human life, there are many facets which are part of this large question. Issues like euthanasia, biomedical research, human trafficking, the death penalty and pornography are among some of the ways in which human life is devalued and injured. As life moves forward, there are more and more ways in which the sacredness of human life is compromised. Many of these issues may feel as though they are beyond our ability to address. We do have a responsibility to be aware of what is taking place. There may be times when it is appropriate to communicate with our legislatures to express our beliefs. But we also need to be people who hold these issues in our prayer and ask for the Spirit to help bring about just solutions.

The Supreme Court has an important case which they are deliberating which could greatly impact the availability of abortion in our country. It will not be until sometime in the spring when a decision is reached. Perhaps this may be a cause to offer to the Lord in prayer.

The first Saturday of every month here at Holy Cross we offer a Holy Hour from 3:45 to 4:45 PM. Since its inception, we have been inviting parishioners to use this time to pray for peace. Moving forward, at least through the springtime, I invite you to use this time to pray for a deeper respect for human life. There is no formal prayer that takes place during our Holy Hours, it is simply a time for quiet reflection. But there can be great power in knowing that many people gather together with a common focus and cause.

God will always delight in all that was made. We seek a greater ability that we may share that perspective of God. We pray that all people may also see the goodness in what was created and given to us in love and, in turn, to be cared for with great love.



LITURGY BYTES

Word of God Weekend


Back in 2019, Pope Francis announced that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time be celebrated as the Sunday of the Word of God. This year it falls on January 23rd. The lectionary reminds us in its introductory pages of the role of the Word of God in the life of the Church: "*In the hearing of God's word, the Church is built up and grows, and in the signs of the liturgical celebration God's wonderful, past works in the history of salvation are presented anew as mysterious realities. God in turn makes use of the congregation of the faithful that celebrates the Liturgy in order that his word may speed on and be glorified and that his name be exalted among the nations.*"

In one of the final acts of our Risen Lord before his Ascension, Jesus appeared to the disciples, broke bread with them and opened their minds to the understanding of the Sacred Scriptures. Even among their great fear and bewilderment, he unveiled the meaning of the paschal mystery: that in accordance with the Father's eternal plan he had to suffer and rise from the dead, in order to bring repentance and the forgiveness of sins. He then promised that he would send the Holy Spirit who would give them strength to be witnesses of this saving mystery. The relationship between the Risen Lord, the community of believers and sacred Scripture is essential to our identity as Christians. Without the Lord who opens our minds to them, it is impossible to understand the Scriptures in depth.

May the Sunday of the Word of God help us all to grow in religious and intimate familiarity with the Sacred Scriptures. There are numerous resources both in book form and online to offer guidance and knowledge. A new podcast entitled: *The Bible in a Year (Ascension Press)* has received special recognition for its work. Why not start the new year embracing God's Holy Word in a different way.

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish.
