

MERRY LITTLE CHRISTMAS

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany, which is traditionally known as Little Christmas. We remember the journey of the three magi and the gifts they offered to the Holy Child. I think for all of us as we get older our experience and understanding of receiving gifts changes. As a young child there is great excitement in getting new toys. As we grow older, we appreciate other things such as clothing or other practical items. There then comes a time in life when the desire to receive costly items diminishes. Very simple and symbolic gifts can take on great meaning. Simply being with the people we love itself becomes a gift. Perhaps this was something that was taken for granted when we were younger.

There is another side to the dynamic of gift giving that develops with the passing of years. We can take great delight in being the one giving the gift. To offer something that you know will touch the heart of another becomes in its own way a gift to the giver. As is said so beautifully in the Prayer of St. Francis, "it is in giving that we receive . . ."

On this feast of the Epiphany, it gives us occasion to reflect upon the gifts we receive that truly bring us life as well as the ones we offer. Be filled with gratitude for family and other loved ones in your life. Take delight in that which is offered to you and reflect upon how we may be able to give to another. It is also appropriate to reflect upon how the Eucharist is a precious gift given to us. And in turn, we are called to be bearers of the gift of love to those we meet.

When Christmas falls on Sunday, as it did this year, we had the longest Advent possible. I like when this happens as it allows additional time for preparation (both practically and spiritually) for Christmas. However, the downside of the long Advent means it is a very short Christmas season. Two of the feast days that fall within the Christmas season are Holy Family and the Baptism of the Lord. Normally each of these days are celebrated on a Sunday. However, this year they were bumped to either a Friday or a Monday, which means they received far less attention than they normally do.

A tradition at Holy Cross is to invite all families who have had a baptism within the past year to a special Mass on the Baptism of the Lord. It is a joyful moment to see so many families returning with their babies. Although we were not able to have this special Mass when we usually do this year, we are hoping to schedule it for another time so that we do not lose the opportunity to celebrate those children who were baptized at Holy Cross.

Monday night at 7:00 is the next gathering of the Men's Prayer Group. I look forward to building this group as we move into 2023.



LITURGY BYTES

<u>The 3 Kings</u>



One of the many customs centering around the feast of the Epiphany is the blessing of the doorposts in people's homes. Some use chalk to mark the year and the initials of the Kings over their front doors. Others prepare a simple sign and hang it over their door. Here is what it would look like this year:

20 + C + M + B + 23

The year is marked by the year of blessing—2023. The cross marks the points on the compass; the initials stand for the Kings: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. The letters CMB can also stand for "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" which means "*May Christ bless this house.*"

Here is a simple prayer of blessing for you to use for your front door:

Lord, God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill them (us) with the light of Christ, that their (our) concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.



Parish Outreach Needs Volunteers!



Winter Windfall

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish. In addition, many parishioners enjoyed participating in it. Unfortunately, it was one of the many parts of parish life that was lost to COVID. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing. And so, we introduce the "*Winter Windfall.*" This is a similar idea, however it will be offered initially on a quarterly basis.



- \$10 per ticket
- Tickets are available for purchase through December, January and February.
- Drawing will be held February 28.

Because we anticipate smaller participation, there will be a different pay scale:

* 1 Prize @ \$250
* 2 Prizes @ \$100
* 10 Prizes @ \$50
* 15 Prizes @ \$25



- This formula was based upon selling 250 tickets @ \$10 each. If more than 250 tickets are sold, the number of prizes will be increased. (In the event the response is strong, we will resume a monthly drawing as soon as possible.)
