

ETERNAL TREASURE OR FADING RELIC?

Last week I attended the fall Clergy Conference for our Diocese. There was a guest speaker. He was a theologian from Philadelphia who spoke to us on preaching the Eucharist during this time of Eucharistic Revival. The United States Bishops have declared these two years, which began in June, to be a time of revival and renewal. The intent is to bring a deeper appreciation of the power, truth, and gift of the Eucharist. There is a growing trend of those who do not fully believe or understand what it is when we say we believe in the "real presence" in the Eucharist. In addition, attendance at Sunday Mass is in a state of decline. At this conference the priests heard ways in which we might try to preach more dynamically on the Eucharist.

During the Covid shutdown, livestreaming of Mass became a lifeline for our parish and elsewhere. There are still some folks who are not able to attend in person and rely on this connection to the Eucharist and Holy Cross. But there is a national concern that for some Catholics the convenience of "catching Mass at home" has replaced the need to gather to share in the Eucharist. It is an enormously different experience to view something at home instead of gathering with other faithful parishioners and actually receiving the Eucharist. But for some, that distinction is being lost.

On September 14th we celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation. In his homily, Bishop Andrzej urged families to come to Mass on a regular basis. Some have accepted his invitation, many more have not. On October 2nd at 11:30 we had a special opening Mass for our Religious Education program. Almost four hundred attended, almost twice the usual number. But since then, attendance has returned to its usual levels. Invitations are extended, good liturgies are offered, people are appreciative of the experience, but it's hard to see if any of this is having long term or widespread impact.

If you are reading this article, there is a strong likelihood that the Eucharist is an important part of your life. But I'm sure all of us know people, perhaps even in our own families, for whom the Eucharist is no longer a regular part of their lives. I don't know how we can change hearts. I don't have any miracle suggestions to offer. At the very least we need to recognize that a truth which lies at the heart of who we are is in a time of uncertainty and perhaps even turmoil.

"Take and eat" and "do this in memory of me" are words that can change hearts and change the world. May we never lose sight of what has been offered to us.




Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults



LITURGY BYTES

October & the Rosary



The month of October is known as the month of the Rosary. The feast of Our Lady of the Rosary occurs on October 7th. Known for several centuries by the alternate title of "Our Lady of Victory," the feast day takes place in honor of a 16th century naval victory which secured Europe against Turkish invasion. Pope St. Pius V attributed the victory to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, who was invoked on the day of the battle through a campaign to pray the Rosary throughout Europe.

If the rosary is not a part of your regular prayer life right now, it is easy to get your feet wet with this devotion. Here are some helpful tips:

- 1. You do not have to pray the rosary all at once pray a decade at a time when you have some free time.
- 2. You can pray it anywhere keep it in your pocket, pocketbook and even in the car, and pull it out when you feel the need for prayer.
- 3. You can pray the rosary in different ways focus on Mary and the words of the Angel Gabriel "Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee," and at other times focus on Christ's life.
- 4. You can fit the entire rosary into your schedule whether it's one decade at a time or all five. It is possible to do in between meetings, running errands, waiting in a doctor's office.
- 5. Even if you are distracted and unable to unplug from the concerns of the day, or too exhausted to pray well, it is still worthwhile to give God this space in your day.
- 6. Think of it as an opportunity to slow down, calm our hearts and minds and enable us to rest in God's presence.

So perhaps this week, we can find our rosary beads, keep them handy within our reach, and connect with this beautiful prayer.
