

Update on New Income Guidelines for Child Care Assistance

Starting August 1, 2022, households with incomes up to 300% of the State Income Standard are eligible for the child care subsidy program. For example, a family of two with a household income of \$54,930 or a family of four with household income up to \$83,250 can apply for child care assistance. Applications can be submitted through the local Nassau or Suffolk Department of Social Services or by mail.

LITURGY

Liturgy Bytes—Prayer, Jesus & the Pope

Why does Jesus pray? Our idea of prayer is almost always related to what we need. However, Jesus shows us a different way of praying based on developing a

relationship. We all understand relationships that we build. The more we feel loved and succeed in loving, the more we feel that life is livable, something we can face. Jesus invests time in relationships with the people around him, but he also invests time with the relationship that he has with his Father. As evidenced in Scripture, he devotes much time to God the Father in prayer.

Another question: Is prayer a duty for us or a relational investment? Notice in some of the Gospel stories that people wanted to always touch Jesus. They felt a power coming forth from him which healed them. Those who pray are mysteriously filled with a power that heals even those around them. This was true for Jesus, but it is also true for each of us.

The Pope urges us to keep in mind and remember that Jesus prays for us. He gives some examples from Scripture:

Jesus chooses the apostles after a night of prayer. The Pope comments that there is no criterion in this choice other than prayer.

The Apostles sometimes become a concern for Jesus. However, since he received them from the Father after prayer, he carries them in his heart, even in their errors or when they fall.

With those two quick Gospel stories above, Pope Francis tells us that Jesus not only wants us to pray as he prays, but assures us that, even if our attempts at prayers are completely vain and ineffective, we can always count on Jesus' prayer. Jesus' love, Jesus' prayer for each one of us does not cease, but rather becomes more intensive. When there is a difficulty, when we feel so many distractions – Jesus is praying for each of us!

For Volunteers in the Diocese of Rockville Centre

A person wishing to volunteer in any parish or organization in the Diocese of Rockville Centre must first complete three requirements:

- 1. Attend Protecting God's Children (Virtus)
- 2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
- 3. Complete a background screening application.

(Background screening is conducted on all volunteers and employees every 5 years.)

Directions to Complete the 3 Requirements:

1. Sign up to attend a Protecting God's Children class: <u>www.Virtus.org</u> When you log on to the Virtus website, you will create a Virtus account.

- a. If you have not attended a Virtus class, you are a first-time registrant.
- b. The first screen will ask the name of your organization from the drop down list select Rockville Centre-Safe Environment.
- c. Follow all directions on the next screens.
- d. One screen will have the **Codes of Conduct**. Please acknowledge the Codes of Conduct.
- e. Continue with the registration process and select the class you will attend.
- f. After selecting the class, you will be instructed to complete the background screening application.
- 2. Background Screening Application:
 - a. Sterling Volunteers is the company providing the background screening.
 - b. Follow all the directions to complete the background screening application. DO NOT STOP ONCE YOU BEGIN THE APPLICATION! If you stop-you are locked out of the process due to security procedures.
 - c. You will need to provide your Social Security #; if you do not provide a Social Security # you will be charged a fee.
 - d. After completing the application, hit the 'Submit Button'
