HOLY VOICES

I chose this week's title as it summarizes part of my experience of my retreat from two weeks ago. Fear not, I am not hearing voices in the middle of the night, but I did have a sense of receiving holy wisdom from holy people who have gone before me.

On several occasions I had a very strong sense that my mom was with me for the journey. I flew out to Tucson, AZ, which is one of my favorite places. I recall traveling with my mom on many trips throughout the Southwest. The flight there included a layover in Denver. While I was waiting for my connecting flight to Tucson, they announced the flight was oversold and they were looking for two people to give up their seats. I could see the folks who they were trying to accommodate on that flight; it was an elderly woman traveling with her daughter. I gave up my seat. Now before you praise me for my noble gesture, United Airlines was offering quite an incentive: an overnight in Denver, dinner, and \$1,000 travel credit toward future flights. I just had the sense my mom was looking down and smiling throughout the entire adventure. I recalled some of the times our travel plans went awry and we were stuck in an airport somewhere.

I am not the best reader. But I try to use retreat time to get caught up on some spiritual reading. In the weeks leading up to the retreat, I made a little pile of books and articles I wanted to read. Somehow I left most of them at home. Once I was there I needed to come up with an alternative plan, so I stopped by a Redemptorist retreat house to use their library. I spent a good deal of time looking around, but very few things were jumping out at me. I then stumbled upon a book of six homilies written by John Chrysostom. He was a 4th century early Church father. I don't know why I chose this book, but it seemed to be the right one.

All of these homilies were reflections on the Gospel story of Lazarus and the rich man. Woven into each of the homilies were questions and images that touched my heart. At one point I thought to myself, I am probably the only person in the world reading this book at this moment. Why were these words, written sixteen hundred years ago in Constantinople, now coming to life in Tucson? Part of the power of the book was the message of the written words. But part of the power was also, why his words, and why here and now?

I had this amazing feeling that these days were guided by my mom and John Chrysostom. Indeed an unexpected duo, but unmistakably their holy words were part of my retreat. Sometimes God's presence is revealed at predictable moments. Other times his voice is at work in circumstances and people we do not expect. But, nonetheless, God continues to offer his wisdom to us. May we always have the ears to hear and embrace his loving and holy message.

Marriage Statistics at Holy Cross:

- 2017: 18 (this was the highest number since 2009)
- 2018: 14
- 2019: 7 (an inexplicably low number for the year)
- 2020: 11
- 2021: 19
- 2022: 21 (additional arrangements are still being made)



Marriages at Holy Cross are on the increase. The pandemic caused many weddings to be rescheduled, but at this point we have caught up with all weddings that were impacted by the shutdown and related issues. I'm not sure what factors may be contributing to the increase.

There are two areas of parish life that are impacted by these higher numbers where we could use assistance. It's a happy problem. We love to have couples celebrate their marriages in the Church, but it means lots of helping hands are needed to make things run smoothly.

Pre-Cana: This is a required program for couples who wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage in the Church. Married Pre-Cana Team Couples present different aspects of married life, followed by some questions for reflection. The goal is that it might spark conversation for each engaged couple to come to a deeper appreciation of their relationship. Engaged couples consistently report that this process is both helpful and energizing in understanding their relationship with each other.

Within the past two years we have adopted a new model for the structure of our parish Pre-Cana program. The entire program takes place in the course of one weekend. The first gathering is on Friday evening. Saturday is an all day undertaking which concludes with everyone attending the Saturday evening Mass.

Wedding Rehearsals: This is a practical component that allows those involved in the wedding celebration to be comfortable with the procession and logistics of the ceremony or Mass. In addition to walking everyone through the rehearsal, it is most helpful to have someone present on the day of the wedding to make sure everything is in good order.

If you have been blessed with a good marriage, would you consider sharing your experience with engaged couples? If you like the practical aspect of a wedding day, would you consider assisting with the rehearsals?

LITURGY BYTES

GO FORTH!!!



It's an important time for us all! You might be asking, "When is that time?" It is during the concluding rites of the Mass when sometimes parish announcements are made, and then we are all blessed and dismissed by the Presider, or a Deacon will dismiss if present.

Another interesting fact is that the dismissal gives the liturgy its name. The word *Mass* comes from the Latin word *Missa*. At one time in our history, the people were dismissed with the words: "*Ite missa est.*" This literally means "*Go, you (the Church) have been sent.*" The word *Missa* is related to the word *mission*; it is the root of the English word mission. The liturgy does not simply come to an end. Those assembled are sent forth to bring the fruits of the Eucharist to the world. Simply put, we are being dismissed to carry on our mission, as missionaries, to take the Christ that we have received in Word and in Communion out with us into the world. We are being called to bring the Gospel message to our families, neighbors and beyond, which is done so beautifully in our parish.

Today, I ask you to consider mission as possibly being part of the team that assists with Parish Liturgy from planning, visioning, and decorating aspects. We would love some new faces on the Liturgy Team. We meet about six times during the year on Tuesday evenings. So the next time you hear the dismissal words, remember the emphasis is on the words "SPREAD THE GOOD NEWS!"




EXPOSITION OF SACRED RELICS

Fall Cash Fling

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish.
