

PLAY, SERVE, AND PRAY (PART 1)

This is the first of a three-part series being written at the end of September. This is coming about because Jane is taking a little bit of well deserved vacation time from the office (she is the one who creates our bulletin on a weekly basis), and I am taking my annual retreat. Because of this, I had to complete the next three weeks of bulletin columns early.

I am commenting on three different ways in which we can experience the power and gift of God working in our lives. Moments of grace can be experienced in different ways. These few weeks are providing that whirlwind of holiness in my life.

I begin with the one that is the most fun: play. Last week some friends took me to the Cradle of Aviation Museum in Uniondale. As much as I love flying and travel, I never took the time to visit this local museum; it has been around now for almost 20 years. I can't remember when I had a more delightful day. The museum has exhibits on space travel and military aircraft. I knew that Long Island was home base for several large aviation related companies: Grumman, Republic, Sperry, etc. But in the early days of flying through WWII, Long Island was home base to dozens of aerospace companies. I found this all very informative, but for me the part I get most excited about is commercial aviation. They have a wonderful exhibit that pays tribute to Pan Am, perhaps the most iconic airline ever. They had a fun little video simulator in which I had to land a 757. I am happy to report I made a successful landing (after several failed attempts). For those who have an interest in things that fly, this is an amazing place to visit.

It was a timeless day. We spent a full five hours being immersed in all the museum offered. I lost track of time and just had a splendid time. After the museum, our day culminated with a nice dinner. Good friends, good food, good times all made for a grand time. I felt refreshed and renewed. It was a moment for God to recharge my batteries in the context of having a fun day off. I felt ministered to in a life-giving way.

One other detail that may have added to the total relaxation and joy of the day was that I inadvertently left my cell phone at home before I left. At first I was in panic mode; how will I make it through the day? I quickly came to the realization that not having to check texts and emails every three minutes was actually a very freeing experience. When I got home I caught up on everything I missed, which in fact was not much at all.

I know everyday cannot be a play day. But when a really good one comes along, it is an uplifting experience. I'm feeling blessed for having received all that I shared in that happy day. More to come . . .


"Cooking out of the Pantry" needs many hands to make the night a success. Please consider sharing some of your time to volunteer before, during and after the event. Any time would be appreciated.

4th Quarter Financial Highlights - June 1,2021 - August 31,2021

Revenues:

- Sunday collections this quarter were down 1.2% and down 1.2% for the year as well. RAMR was up 17.3%, but down 2.1% for the year. Overall collections for this year were up 2.5% which includes Christmas and Easter.
- This summer, as an alternative to the "Cash Calendar," we held the "Summer Cash Sizzle" to generate fundraising income. In its entirety, we profited \$2,360 for the 3 months it ran. In comparison, between the dates of 6/1/19 8/31/19, "Cash Calendar" brought in \$1,520 as income to the parish. We are appreciative to those who participated and for the extra income it brought in. Congratulations to the lucky winners of the Summer Cash Sizzle!
- Religious Ed. was up 82.4% this quarter over last year. Contributing to that were some Communion and Confirmation donations, but mostly remaining tuition that was collected for the 2019-20 school year. As of August 31st, we had 464 out of our 597 families register their children for the 21-22 school year. That is 78% of our families and a total of 879 students ready to attend our program this year.
- Outreach was down 33.8% for this quarter and down 3.9% overall for this fiscal year. As life has returned more to "normal" for many, other folks are feeling the effects of the pandemic in financial ways. And in some ways the urgency to help (in this way), may not feel as dire as it did a year ago this time. Parishioners do continue to give generously in many ways to this program. This quarter we were able to hold a very successful Blood Drive, and we had a wonderful response, as always, to our "School Supply Drive." Additionally, our gardeners worked diligently all summer to nurture and harvest much produce from our Community Garden. We were able to offer our Outreach clients and our parish community, fresh homegrown veggies on our "Market Days." A huge thank you for everyone's generosity to our Outreach Program!
- Income generated through Baptisms, Weddings, Funerals, and Mass Intentions were all up considerably again this quarter over last year. Many of the weddings and baptisms were finally able to take place after some time of patiently waiting until these events could be held in the joyous and safe way the families had envisioned. Overall, we brought in \$21,229 which was up 62% for the quarter, and up 72.5% for the year.
- Our rental income, which is generated from the Verizon tower, brought in \$8,694 this quarter.
 This continues to be a beneficial source of income for the parish. Other substantial income
 included Votives, Bulletin Commission Income, and other donations. All included, this brought
 in \$53,470, an increase of 64.3% over last year this time.
- Diocesan Collections were up 89.8% for this quarter, but down 9.1% for the year. Your generosity towards these worthy causes, is always greatly appreciated! On a similar note, as of 8/31, we had achieved 63.20% of our parish's CMA goal of \$74,200 with 208 donors here at Holy Cross. We have \$27,305 left to meet the goal set for us. Thank you for your support!!
- Compared to the same time last year, overall income was up 11.3% this quarter but down 1.8% for the year. Keep in mind that part of our income last year included the PPP Loan in the amount of \$68,390. With that said, we had a very good recovery from 2020. We offer our sincerest thanks to you, our generous parishioners, for your ongoing support and dedication to our parish.

Expenses:

- Salaries were down 6.7% this quarter. This was due to some changes made in bookkeeping along with a few decreases that took place where modifications allowed. Total salaries for the year were up 1% over last year. Benefits were increased this quarter by 2.5% (.09% for the year).
- Religious Ed. expenses were up this quarter by 250% (in dollars, approx. \$2000). We added gowns for our Confirmation Class, and supplies were purchased in advance for our Level 2 class. Religious Ed. expenses were up 98.4% for the year. Again, the biggest contributors to this increase were the gowns, the Confirmation Retreat (that couldn't take place in 2020), and a few other additions that were added for that same reason.
- Outreach expenses were up 250% this quarter over last year this time, and up 37% for the year. We were able to help clients in a variety of ways this quarter from yard work to household bills. We are happy to have the means to assist in giving a helping hand. Parish programs were at a 100% increase this quarter, as we were able to hold a Pastoral Team Planning Day again this year and restocked our supplies for Hospitality. Overall, there was a 40.4% increase this year over last for all our Parish Programs.
- Office expenses were 12.9% lower this quarter over last year, but up 29.7% for the year. Building Expenses were down 26.6% this quarter and up 9.5% for the year.
- Major repairs were down 52.6% for the quarter but up 39.9% for the year. We did many projects this year, the latest (beginning in late August), was the retaining wall of the rectory driveway.
- Overall, this quarter in comparison to last year, expenses were up 3% and 6.3% for the fiscal year.

Events, Programs & Projects this Quarter Included:

- Pastoral Planning Day
- Development and implementation of a new Baptism Prep. Program
- A parish celebration for Fr. Michael's birthday (No cost to the parish)
- Launch of the new and improved website
- Blood Drive
- New Hampshire parish trip
- Purchase of two new desktop computers for the office (to be billed in the 1st quarter)
- The start of a retaining wall for the Rectory driveway
- Replacement of one office desk

Possible Fall Projects:

- Replacement of fencing by the small parking lot
- Upgrade sound system including outdoor speakers (Purchase a processor)
- Seal parking lot
- Get pricing for central air conditioning for the office wing

Fall Cash Fling

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish. In addition, many parishioners enjoyed participating in it. Unfortunately, it was one of the many parts of parish life that was lost to COVID. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing. And so, we introduce the "Fall Cash Fling." This is a similar idea, however it will be offered initially on a quarterly basis.

- \$10 per ticket
- Tickets are available for purchase through September, October and November.
- Drawing will be held November 30.

Because we anticipate smaller participation, there will be a different pay scale:

- * 1 Prize @ \$250
- * 2 Prizes @ \$100
- * 10 Prizes @ \$50

- This formula was based upon selling 250 tickets @ \$10 each. If more than 250 tickets are sold, the number of prizes will be increased. (In the event the response is strong, we will resume a monthly drawing as soon as possible.)


