

I was happy to share with you my ideas about renewing our chapel and sanctuary last weekend. In short, I am proposing moving the tabernacle from the chapel to somewhere in the sanctuary. The second part is I have ordered a statue of the Holy Family to go into the location where the tabernacle currently stands. If you were not able to stay for my announcement after Mass, I encourage you to look at a video I made that is available on the parish website. Most parishioners who voiced an opinion were supportive of the ideas I suggested.

There are some points to this renovation about which people may have strong opinions. I am happy to receive as much input as parishioners want to offer. Our decisions will not so much be based on everyone's favorite idea, but rather be guided by Church documents and guidelines that address the specifics of creating a worship area. After Christmas we will be offering opportunities for parishioners to gather to learn some of what the Church teaches and allow those guidelines to lead us to good decisions. I am hoping that parishioners will continue to offer their suggestions but am also hopeful that there will be an openness to deeper growth and appreciation of what the Church teaches regarding our Eucharist. I am excited about this project and am confident it will enhance our prayer. There will be lots more to come regarding this.

Please join us for our annual Thanksgiving Mass on Thursday morning at 9:00. It is always a peaceful and beautiful celebration; it is the perfect way to start the day. After Mass I will be driving to my brother's house in Pennsylvania. With no traffic it is a three-hour drive but on Thanksgiving, who knows?

Next weekend a few of the "old practices" will be returning to our weekend celebrations. Once again, ushers will be passing collection baskets at offertory time. We will continue the practice we had where folks would pass the basket along their row until it reaches the end, then pass it to the person sitting in the row behind. We will also resume bringing forth the gifts of bread and wine along with the collection basket. Initially, it will be the ushers who bring up the gifts. After Christmas we will offer families and individuals the opportunity to bring up the gifts if they choose to do so. More and more pieces of our old routines are returning.

May your Thanksgiving be a peaceful and life-giving day wherever you may celebrate it. We face many challenges, but we are still a blessed people. May we never take for granted all we have received and continue to give thanks to God for all we have. Happy Thanksgiving.



JUST SOME WORDS FROM THE WEBMASTER! A NEW PARISH WEBSITE... AND "JUST A LITTLE BIT ABOUT IT"

May I Welcome all of you today along with a statement that many parishioners & staff members have often heard me say. "A Website is a 'Living Entity'... It is never finished or completed... because it is constantly in the midst of updates, changes & growth." Having reiterated this, I hope that you enjoy using this Website as much as I have enjoyed creating it and daily enjoy updating it. With its future growth potential, this Website will excitedly offer to all of our Holy Cross Parishioners as well as our welcomed new, Prospective Parishioners, many more possibilities in the sharing of parish information with all who navigate here.

I have taken great care in creating a Website in which "getting lost" while navigating its pages should be a "thing of the past." At the bottom of each Page there is a Question which asks... "Where Would You Like To Go Now?"... making it easier to navigate through the Pages without having to always return to the Top Menu Bar. Please be sure to "scroll down" to the bottom of each page and surf it in its entirety in order to not "miss out" on any information that may be "lurking" beyond your screen's viewing area. Some Pages are lengthy and filled with an abundance of information as well as with "links to click" which will direct you elsewhere on the Website for guicker navigating. The Home Page is an example of this type of page. The Home Page is the "heart" of the Website and contains much information and "links" to other sources of information. Should you take the time to routinely navigate this page from top to bottom... it would be like "reading" the weekly Bulletin from cover to cover. Doing this will keep you updated on the "pulse" of the Parish... give you "the scoop" on all the Parish news & activities... and will provide you with the "links" to the appropriate pages for more detailed information, all the while eliminating extensive searching. (Always remember that if you had inadvertently misplaced or already discarded your Bulletin, you can find all of the same information on the Website since the Bulletin and the Website are always in "sync" with each other.) If you already know the specific location that you wish to visit on the Website, you can use the traditional Menu Bar at the top of each page or the "E-Z" Navigation Page, which I describe in the next paragraph.

The "E-Z" Navigation Page is a very useful "Find and Go-To" feature that I developed specifically for the Parish Website since all of the Website Pages on this page are sorted by Parish Usage & Departmental Categories. I strongly encourage you to try using this page... It truly makes it "E-Z" to navigate and to find your desired page and information quickly. I also encourage you to "Subscribe" with your EMail to Holy Cross on the Home Page in order for you to be able to receive important urgent announcements & information, in the form of "email blasts" (never spam) from the parish in the future. I reiterate that you will never receive any spam from the Holy Cross Website. But most importantly, this will be just another way for the parish & staff members to inform you of important and useful parish information & events more quickly and easily by "keeping you in the loop" of detailed Parish situations.

Should you have any suggestions or ideas about incorporating any other useful Parish Information into the Website, please do not hesitate contacting the Parish Office with those suggestions. If your suggestions are within the capabilities of the Website Design Software, we will consider them to be implemented in future updates & design changes. We always welcome your suggestions for a better "living" and vibrant Parish Website.

We look forward to all of the days ahead that God graces us as true "family members" in this, our community of the Parish of the Holy Cross!

BACKGROUND SCREENING UPDATE

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (The Charter) promulgated by the Bishops of the United States in 2002 outlines specific practices and guidelines providing standards of safety in parishes and dioceses throughout the United States. As directed in The Charter, the Diocese of Rockville Centre requires all employees, clergy, and volunteers to complete three requirements within thirty days of employment or volunteering:

- 1. Attend Protecting God's Children Program (Virtus)
- 2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
- 3. Complete a background screen application. The Diocese requires all those who remain in active ministry be rescreened at 5-year intervals. volunteers/employees.

A Word on Background Screening of Volunteers:

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People (OFPCYP) has streamlined the volunteer application process enabling volunteers to complete the three safe environment requirements in one step. Individuals wishing to volunteer in a parish or school:

- 1. Register to attend a Protecting God's Children class and create a Virtus account on the Virtus website: <u>www.Virtus.org</u>
- 2. Electronically acknowledge the Diocesan Code of Conduct provided during the Virtus registration process.
- 3. Follow the instructions to complete the Sterling Volunteers background screening application offered during the Virtus registration process.

Active Volunteers:

If you are active in a parish ministry, have already attended Virtus and have been background screened, you may be at—or beyond—the *5yr. rescreening requirement*. If this is the case, you will receive an email from *Sterling Volunteers* asking you to complete the background screening application online. You may access the background screening application by following the prompt in the email or logging into your Virtus account. *Please be aware—this is not a scam nor has your email been hacked.* The OFPCYP has been working with your parish to update the Safe Environment records and noted it is time for you to be rescreened. You may also be prompted to electronically re-sign the Code of Conduct when you log into your Virtus account.

Edit Your Virtus Account:

To access your Virtus account <u>www.Virtus.org</u> you will need your Username and Password. If you need assistance, please contact Virtus: 1-888-847-8870 or <u>helpdesk@virtus.org</u>. Once in your account, review your account information—particularly your email address. If your account requires updating, please hit the TOOLBOX tab at the top of the screen. On the left side of your screen, in the green column, click "Update My Account." You will be able to make the necessary changes. Please remember to hit the SAVE button at the bottom of the screen.

Fall Cash Fling

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish. In addition, many parishioners enjoyed participating in it. Unfortunately, it was one of the many parts of parish life that was lost to COVID. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing. And so, we introduce the "*Fall Cash Fling.*" This is a similar idea, however it will be offered initially on a quarterly basis.

- \$10 per ticket
- Tickets are available for purchase through September, October and November.
- Drawing will be held November 30.

Because we anticipate smaller participation, there will be a different pay scale:

- * 1 Prize @ \$250
- * 2 Prizes @ \$100
- * 10 Prizes @ \$50
- * 15 Prizes @ \$25



- This formula was based upon selling 250 tickets @ \$10 each. If more than 250 tickets are sold, the number of prizes will be increased. (In the event the response is strong, we will resume a monthly drawing as soon as possible.)
- Tickets will not be sold after Mass. Please use the tear-off tickets below. You may return your entries by placing them in an envelope and depositing it in the basket on weekends, or returning them to the Parish Office.
